## MOB OF 5,000 ENRAGED MEN SWEEP AWAY ENTIRE POLICE FORCE TO GET ATTACKERS OF WHITE GIRL

Normal Conditions Prevail Today, Although Negro Population Is in State of Unrest-No Further Trouble Expected by Officers-Lynched Negroes Were Employed by Circus as Roustabouts.

DULUTH, Minn., June 16 .- Virtually normal conditions prevail here today after last night's lynching bee, when a mob of over 5000 men, in their rage to get at three negroes, swept the entire police power of the city away.

The three negroes had been taken into custody by peace officers in connection with an attack upon a white girl last Monday

The attack upon the girl took place upon the grounds of a circus that is showing here.

The negroes who were lynched were all working for the circus Excitement ran so high during the conflict between the mob and police for a time that telegraphic negotiations were opened with

state authorities toward securing troops. The negro population today is in a state of unrest, but no further trouble is anticipated by the police department.






