CHARTER AMENDMENTS
Every citizen of Cisco should get posted on the charter amendments that will be submitted to the people at the city election April 4 Every one of the six have a direct and vital interest to every person in this city, and those who vote for o against these amendments should
vote intelligently, for every patrivote inteligently, for every patrithings that are for the weal of the community
The first three and last proposals were initiated by the city commission, who sought to forestall any other proposals that might be called for by the people. But the patriotic citizens blocked their game to mission delayed calling the election for seven months, till the general election. This was an open and wanton defiance of the electorate of Cisco. Had the plan of the commission prevailed, no other amendments could have been submitted for two years.
The act of denying the people the right to vote on these amendments alone should disqualify the administration, for it shows clearly they have no regard for the will o the people.
The first proposed amendment provides for the levy of 2 mills on the dollar derived from taxation, may be appropriated for the maintenance of the chamber of commerce. Just what action the friends of the commerce chamber will take as this provision is supposed to have been covered by the presen charter, is not known. As we see the matter it was unnecessary, for chamber of commerce, could hav failed to appropriate money for its fontinuance. If a chamber of com
merce is maintained, undoubtedly one municipally supported is th most equitable manner for its sup port, as it forces every person own
ing property in the town, which may be enhanced by activities, to pay his part for it maintenance.
No. 2 provides for the appropri ation of one-half mill on the dolla of tax revenues for the maintain ance of a band.

No. 3 provides for the mainten ance of the zoo, and appropriatio of one mill on each dollar for it maintenance.
No. 4 reates to the compensa tion and duties of commissioners placing their remuneration at $\$ 5$ for each regular and $\$ 2.50$ for each called meeting, said compensation The to exceed $\$ 150.00$ per year. would prevent city commissioners rom voting themselves full time salaries of $\$ 150$ per month, as was one when such salaries were voted o Commissioners Elliott and Win ton, after their election to posi No. 5 provides for the recall of the mayor and commissioners by making it mandatory for the com mission to order an election for the when 20 per member, or members, shall petition for such an election.
