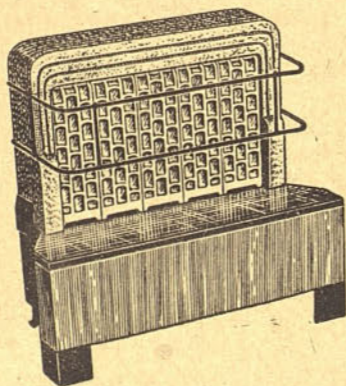

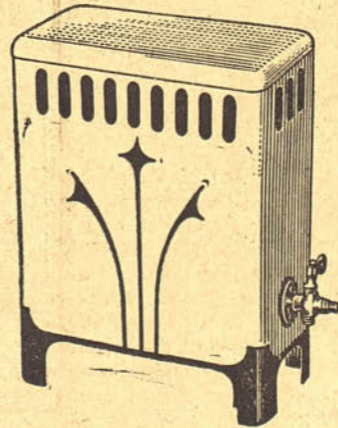

CATTLE MARKET

The very light supplies of cattle and calves reaching the Fort Worth stock yards for Saturday's trading sold early at steady prices. Hogs were steady to 10 cents below Friday's average at a top of \$10 or 75 cents lower than a week earlier. The yearlings and wethers offered in the sheep yards sold steady. No good steers or yearlings were offered. A few common butcher cattle sold from \$6 to \$7.50. Fat cows brought \$7 to \$7.50; butcher cows \$6 to \$6.75; and canners and cutters. Among the butcher cows were about half a load that cleared at \$8.50. Odd bulls cashed at \$6 to \$7. A few good butcher calves ranged from \$9 to \$9.50 with common to medium calves at \$7 to \$8.50 and culls at \$6 to \$6.50. Not enough stockers were on hand to make a market. Hogs sold steady to 10 cents below Friday's average mostly to city butchers. The top of \$10 was paid for good and choice 180 to 280-pound butchers while good 150-pound weights sold down to \$9.25. Packing sows were steady to 25 cents lower at \$9 down. In the sheep yards yearlings and wethers were steady. Medium grade yearlings brought \$8.50 and medium grade two-year-old wethers brought \$7.50. Good aged wethers at \$6. More accidental deaths occur in agriculture than in any other occupation.
