### TORNADO TAKES TOLL OF OVER 3,000

Owing to a Low Barometer Pressure From Arkansas.

Chicago, Ill.-A tornado tore through Southern Illinois Wednesday, after lashing Eastern Missouri, and then caused considerable damage in Indiana, before it died out to the northeast, collecting a reported toll of 3,631 persons dead or injured on the basis of estimates available from the storm-swept regions, where communication was largely destroyed.
