**Mourning Dove Dates Approved**

The Executive Secretary of the Texas Game & Fish Commission has been notified of U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service approval of recommended mourning dove hunting regulations for Texas.

It approved a 40-day mourning dove hunting season for North Texas beginning September 1 and a 40-day season for South Texas beginning October 1. Shooting will be restricted to afternoons, beginning at 12 o'clock noon and ending at sunset. The limits are 10 birds per day and 10 in possession.

The Washington agency also approved the whitewing season, recommended by the Commission, for September 12, 14 and 16, shooting to begin at 4:00 p.m. and to last until sunset. The limit is the same as mourning doves.

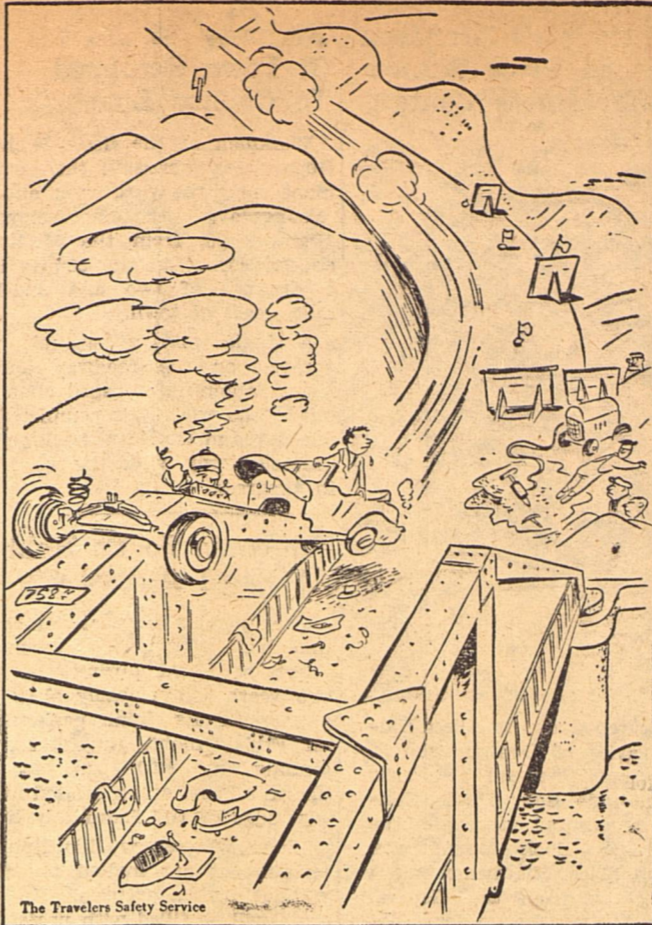

**SS Representative To Be In Cisco August 14 & 28**

E. Glen McNatt, Field Representative of the Abilene office of the Social Security Administration, will be in Cisco at the Chamber of Commerce at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 14 and 28. Persons wishing to file retirement claims or survivor's claims under the Social Security Act are invited to call at that time.

Mr. McNatt called attention to the fact that increases in retirement payments and survivor's payments recently voted by Congress do not go into effect until September 1. The checks received in August and those received in September will be at present rates. The first checks that will include the increased amounts will be those mailed October 3. These increases are automatic and no action is necessary for the retired worker or the survivor to receive the increase. Increases for the retired workers will average about \$6.00 a month.
