AUSTIN -The Texas Board of Medical Examiners adopted a position statement that those who administer managed-care health plans - who make decisions affecting the treatment of Texas patients - must have a Texas medical license.

The statement is meant to allow physicians to decide what sort of treatment is appropriate for their patients, according to the TBME board chairman William Fleming

The statement also would allow the board to investigate a complaint and recommend legal action for practicing medicine without a license, particularly if an out-ofstate managed-care provider were to decide a treatment was not necessary in a Texas case.

But Tracy King of Texans for Quality Health Care, a coalition of managed care plans, said that determining whether a plan will pay for a particular treatment is not practicing medicine. And, she said, the statement would "gut the way we manage costs."

ACT FAST TO CUT YOUR 1996 TAXES

With the end of the year fast approaching, time is running out for taking actions that will cut your 1996 tax bill. Here is a quick reminder checklist of taxcutting steps you should still consider:

1. Estimate your income and deductions for both 1996 and 1997. Then, to minimize your total tax for both years, consider shifting income and/or deducions between the two years.

2. If you're self-employed, set up a Keogh plan before December 31. You can then make a deductible 1996 contribution as late as the filing deadline, including extensions, for your 1996 tax return.

3. To squeeze in more tax deductible expenses for 1996, pay property taxes, interest due, and accelerate charitable deductions before year-end. If you don't have the cash, consider paying with a credit card in order to get the deduction this year while paying the bill next year. 4. Use the \$17,500 expensing deduction for the

purchase of business equipment.

5. Review your investment portfolio and estimate

capital gains you've already taken. Consider selling some losers before the end of the year to offset those gains taken plus an additional \$3,000, which can offset ordinary income.

6. Before investing in any mutual funds, check whether the fund will be making a year-end distribution that will increase your 1996 tax bill.

7. If you're planning a change in marital status before year-end, remember that it's your marital status as of December 31 that determines your tax status for the entire year. Find out if rescheduling the event could save you significant tax dollars.

8. More people get hit these days by the alternative minimum tax (AMT). So if you have large deductions or tax preferences, be sure to do an AMT estimate. 9. Make sure you have paid in enough through tax





Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor, A little bit of history

that might be of interest to the readers of the Callahan County Star.

On September 23, 1896, my father, Samuel Ed-mund Webb was born in Baird. He was the son of Samuel Elias Webb and Martie J. Nelson Webb who owned a home on what is now Highway 18 in Baird.

In honor of his son's birth, my grandfather, Samuel Elias, planted a bur oak in their year. He had brought it back Baird from Tennessee. This tree is beautiful growing beside Highway 18 just west of the First Baptist Church of Baird, and as of September 23, 1996, it is 100 years old!

My grandfather and grandmother Webb's house was razed after they moved four miles n.w. of Baird on their land, "Oak Grove Farm", and a service station was built on the Highway to accommodate travelers on the "Bankhead Highway" that ran from the east coast to the west coast. Years later, a ceramic shop and living quarters, and later rental property was there while the tree kept growing. Now, many

years later, the red brick house now on it was built and owned by Mr. and Mrs. Roland Nichols. Mrs. Nichols told us granddaughters and other descendants many time that when the tree became 100 years old, she hoped to have the tree declared a State treasure and see if an historical marker could be placed at the tree, but sadly Mr. and Mrs. Nichols both died before that time came.

She was a very

generous lady and gave acorns and seedlings granddaughters of Mr. Webb, and others who wanted them and loved the tree and now bur oaks from the tree are in the yards and on property of descendants in Clyde, Abilene, the Midway community, Petersburg, and Marfa. A great great grandson planted an acorn from the tree in memory of another great great grandson, Wendell Lee Batley, who died last year and it is growing. He lives on Cherry Lane, north of Clyde.

We were thrilled when we heard that Mr. James Paul Shanks of Baird who lives next door to this beautiful tree has planted a seedling in honor of his first grandchild. The
