A public hearing on the proposed budget for the 1997-98 school year meeting was held August 18 at the Baird School Library.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held immediately following the budget hearing.

Kenneth Brock called the meeting to order.

## wounded by authorities

Law enforcement back up. agencies from two counties were involved in a gun fight which ended just north of Coleman Wednesday after a former Callahan County man was apparently trying to asphyxiate himself by running a garden hose from the exhaust pipe of his truck to the cab.

Joel Wayne Griffin, 41, of Snyder was shot at least once by law enforcement officials after apparently firing three to five shots at officials after a chase began just south of Baird on U.S. Hwy. 283.

According to reports, Griffin's green 1996 Ford truck was pursued south on U.S. Hwy. 283 running on the wrong side of the road to oncoming traffic. As law enforcement officials from Callahan County tried to close in on the vehicle, Griffin reportedly stuck a rifle, later identified as a .308pursuing officers to

As Coleman County was notified of the chase, two roadblocks were set up by the Coleman County Sheriff's Department. Griffin plowed

through the first roadblock and made a Uturn just before coming up to the second roadblock when a rear tire went flat. After passing a second time through the first roadblock, Griffin's truck came to a stop and that is when he reportedly opened fire at law enforcement officials. Officers returned the fire striking Griffin once when he was apprehended, he was then transported to an Abilene hospital by ambulance.

"CO-ED'S CLOTHES COST \$75 UP TO \$1,200 YEARLY." \*\*

"In order to answer requests coming from girls all over the state in regard to the clothes they should get before coming to the University of Texas, the home economics department is preparing a bulletin which will contain, among other things, the minimum, average and maximum cost of a girl's wardrobe and a list of general expenses, in order to make the results more accurate."

"In 1913, a bulletin on this subject showed that the minimum amount spent by a university girl for clothes during one year was \$75. This was spent by a girl who was working her way through school. The average amount was \$200,

while \$600 to \$700 was the approximate sum spent by girls who engaged in many social affairs. The largest amount given for clothes was \$1200."

"The new bulletin, it is hoped, will be out some time next term, and should be of great assistance to a girl planning her college wardrobe."

The far-reaching balanced budget and tax cut plan which was signed into law earlier this month includes literally hundreds of provisions in dozens of federal programs. Although spending cuts and increased revenues sufficient to reach balance were enacted, numerous programs were expanded or enhanced. In my opinion, among the most important of those programs were the changes made to improve access to quality health care in rural ar-

sources: the bill introduced by the Rural Health Care Coalition, for which I serve as a steering committee member, and the Blue Dog Coalition budget alternative. More importantly, we depended on the valuable advice of people on the front line of rural health care to tell us which direction we should

Those provisions are intended to provide seniors with affordable managed care options. The two sound like they come from alphabet soup - PSOs and AAPCC-but the point is to encourage local provid-

What do these changes mean for the average rural Medicare beneficiary? That care should become both more available and more affordable.

The new law expands preventive health care benefits not only to rural residents but to others as well. Mammography, pap smears, diabetes, prostate and colorectal cancer screening, bone density measurement, and vaccines all will be covered.







#### PAYROLL TAXES ARE SERIOUS BUSINESS

If you own a business that has employees, the timely payment of payroll taxes is one of your most serious financial obligations. But even if you don't own a business, you can still be liable for payroll taxes.

In general, there are two types of employment taxes - those you withhold from employees, and those you must pay as an employer. The first type of employment taxes are called "trust fund" taxes, and the second type are "non-trust fund" taxes. The IRS is very serious about collecting all employment taxes, but taxes withheld from employees - trust fund taxes are in a class by themselves. In fact, there are few areas where the IRS collects more aggressively, or where it has more weapons at its disposal.

Probably the most powerful IRS weapon is the concept of the "responsible person." If trust fund taxes are delinquent, the IRS simply wants someone to pay them, and it doesn't care who. You might be a company owner, officer, or director, or you might be an employee such as the controller payroll manager, or bookkeeper. If you meet the definition of a "responsible person," the IRS is likely to hold you personally liable. The IRS typically tries to identify as many responsible persons as possible, and the IRS is allowed to proceed against any or all responsible persons simulataneously. Depending on the circumstances of the case, any responsible person can be held personally liable for 100% of a deficency.

As you might expect, the definition of a "responsible person" is extremely complex. If you would like more information or if you are concerned that you might be a responsible person for purposes of employment taxes, please give me a call.





#### Stenholm Announces Veterans Retirement Home In West Texas

Representative Charles Stenholm joined State Representative David Counts in announcing the selection of Big Spring as the location for a new Veterans Retirement Home.

"Obviously, this is great news for Big Spring, and it's good for all veterans in the West Texas area," Stenholm commented. "Our Country owes a great debt of gratitude to the veterans who have served and sacrificed for all of us. Providing retirement homes for our veterans is one excellent way for us to say thank-you."

The Texas Veterans Land Board had the final responsibility for making the decision regarding the location of the facility. After considering proposals from a number of communities throughout the state, the Land Board settled on Big Spring, Bonham, Floresville, and Temple. Groundbreaking for the 150-bed facility in Big Spring should take place in about a year.

Earlier this year Stenholm had contacted state and national officials on behalf of the West Texas location. Representative Counts authored the legislation in the state legislature.

"This is a win-win situation," stated Counts. "This will be a tremendous boost to the Big Spring community, a long overdue benefit for our veterans, and will save the state approximately \$30 million over the next ten years."

Funding for the nursing centers is shared between the state and federal governments. The privately. U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs will provide grants amounting to 65% of construction costs while the state will be responsible for the other 35%. After construction, the

facilities will be managed

#### Letter To The Editor

Editor,

1. A number of experts believe that the damage done to Oklahoma City's Murrah Building in 1995 could not possibly have resulted from a single truck bomb. The severity and asymmetrical nature of the damage are more consistent with supplemental charges inside the building.

A comparison of the blast in Oklahoma City with the blast set off at the U.S. military base in Saudi Arabia one year later strongly suggests that the Oklahoma atrocity could not have been the work of a "lone bomber."

U. S. officials claim the Oklahoma truck bomb weighed approximately 5,000 pounds. It left a hole in the street only 12 feet wide and 25 feet deep. Yet, it is alleged to have caused the massive structural

damage that included destroying an interior steel-reinforced vertical concrete column that was not even immediately opposite the truck's location. In addition, large portions of all of the floors of the nine-story building collapsed as a result of the blast.

On the other hand.

column - the Saudi bomb which was estimated to be four to five times larger left a hole 85 feet wide and 35 feet deep. The targeted Saudi building had been built with simple slab construction which is remarkably inferior to the methods and materials used in the Murrah Building. Yet, the Saudi building sustained only facial damage. Further, all of its vertical supports remained standing and none of its floors collapsed.

Many highly regarded structural engineers and explosives experts have concluded that the official version of the Oklahoma bombing is preposterous. These individuals should be called to testify at the trial of Timothy McVeigh. Their expert testimony should also become part of the official investigation so that all who committed this horrible crime can be brought to justice.

2. Immediately after the federal building in Oklahoma City was bombed, an official of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms boasted that one of his agents and a companion had bravely rescued more than a dozen people from an elevator inside the building. The two supposed heroes claimed that the elevator in which they were riding dropped five stories in a terrifying free fall. They further claimed to have pried open the door of the smoke-filled elevator and led the other passengers to

But professional elevator inspectors happened to be on the scene and were about to conduct their routine safety check. Within minutes of the tragedy, they examined each of the building's elevators and found that no such free fall had occurred. They later insisted that none of the claims of the ATF official were believable. The ATF official had offered his totally implausible story to counter allegations that his personnel had earlier been warned to stay away from the build-

safety.
