

## Trustees Call \$650,000 Bond Vote

### Skinner Is Re-Elected Sheriff In Light Callahan Demo Vote

An expected turnout at the polls in the Democratic Primary election last Saturday was lighter than normal. Lack of number of hotly contested local races in this county apparently cut voter interest.

Total vote in Cross Plains was 345, according to Precinct Chairman Alton E. Hornsby, and Callahan County Democratic officials reported only 2,275 total votes.

Cross Plains and Callahan pollsters decided as the state trend went in most races.

In the lone countywide race in Callahan incumbent Sheriff Bill W. Skinner of Baird was returned to office over challenger Adrian Huddleston of Clyde 1,648 to 585. In Cross Plains Skinner was favored 217 to 121. The incumbent carried all eight voting boxes. Result by boxes follow with Skinner totals first: Baird 471-56, Clyde (Precinct 2) 514-183; Cross Plains 217-121; Putnam 54-29; Eula 72-61; Denton Valley 58-20; Oplin 38-28; Clyde (Precinct 8) 195-73; Absentee 29-18.

In the race for County Commissioner of Precinct 1 incumbent M. D. Ellis defeated Eugene Kitchens 433 to 273.

In the non-binding Democratic Presidential Preference Referendum, President Jimmy Carter coasted to victory over Sen. Edward Kennedy. In Cross Plains Carter polled 242 to Kennedy's 27, and over the county the President was favored 1,526 to 160. Voters favoring uncommitted delegates numbered 66

here and 433 in Callahan.

In the Republican Primary, held at Clyde only, 138 votes were reported. In that binding Presidential Preference race Ronald Reagan outdistanced George Bush 106 to 31 with one uncommitted.

There will be some run-off contests in the Democratic column which are slated for Saturday, June 7. Included are John C. Phillips and James P. (Jim) Wallace for Associate Justice, Supreme Court, Place 1, and two judgeships for Court of Criminal Appeals, W. T. Phillips and Mike McCormick for Place 2 and Edith Roberts and Tom Davis for Place 3.

Top vote getter in the Democratic vote in Cross Plains was Albert Lovell, uncontested candidate for re-election as Callahan County Tax Assessor-Collector who, polled 312.

Democratic Executive Committee was to have met in Baird Tuesday morning to canvass the returns.

## Balloting Slated May 24 For New Proposed High School Building

Trustees of Cross Plains Independent School District have called an election to issue up to \$650,000 in bonds to build a new high school.

The educational panel took the unanimous action last Thursday night in special session.

Election day will be Saturday, May 24, and voting will be held in the City Hall. Absentee balloting started Monday, and will continue through Tuesday, May 20. District residents may vote absentee in person on regular business days from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the School Tax Office, located in the northwest corner of the high school building.

Trustees had been pondering ways in which to improve facilities at the local school, and after recommendations from an

appointed Citizens Advisory Committee were considered, along with other available data, the new building was considered the best avenue.

That structure will be slightly larger than the present building which is approximately 50 years old. It will be single story.

The plan to be voted upon was selected over several possibilities such as a much larger new school, adding some floor space and completely renovating the existing structure and minimum improvement to present building to satisfy directives from the state.

Texas Education Agency has placed Cross Plains on Advised Accreditation list due to deplorable condition of the high school building. The State Fire Marshal's Office has also cautioned the system about conditions in the high school building.

If the bond election is approved by district voters, the principal and interest will be paid back in 16 years, two payments annually, with annual payback averaging just over \$74,000.

According to the bond schedule adopted by trustees the projected tax increase for the year 1980-81 will be up by \$102,216. That will be an average tax increase of 38.46 per cent from the 1979 year.

Tax rate for 1979 year was \$1.04 per \$100 assessed valuation, based on 50 per cent of market value. During the 1980-81 year tax rate will be figured from 100 per cent of assessed valuation, and will be a projected 72 cents. At the \$104 rate, 95 cents went for local maintenance and 9 cents to interest and sinking fund. At the pro-

jected 72 cent rate for 1980-81, 50.5 cents will be earmarked for local maintenance and 21.5 cents for interest and sinking. Based on similar valuations, the tax levy increase will amount to about \$15,500 for maintenance and \$86,700 interest and sinking fund. Percentage of the increase as projected figures 5.77 for maintenance and 32.69 for bonds, total of 38.46 over 1979 rate.

The ballot itself is short and simple. It has a "for" and "against" box with the following brief statement to the right of the boxes, "The issuance of bonds in the amount of \$650,000 and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

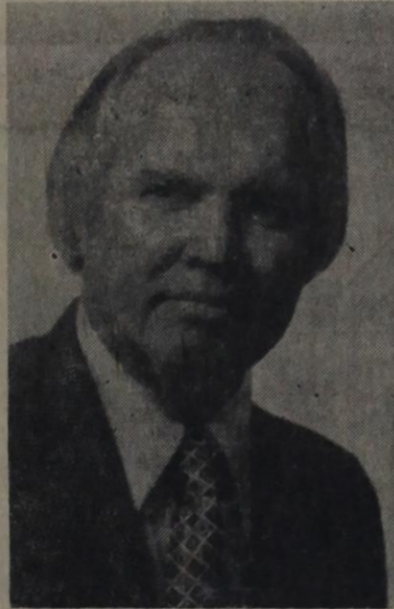

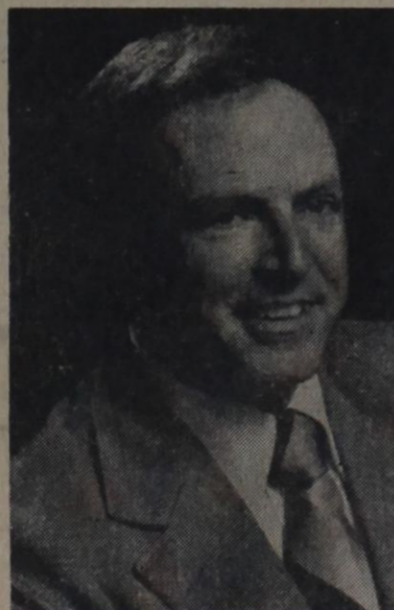
#### SMALL FOLK BEGIN WORK FOR BASEBALL SEASON

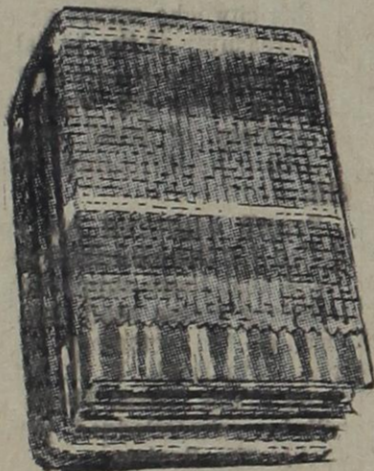

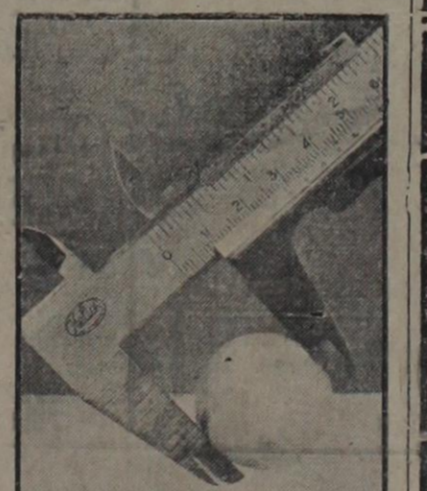

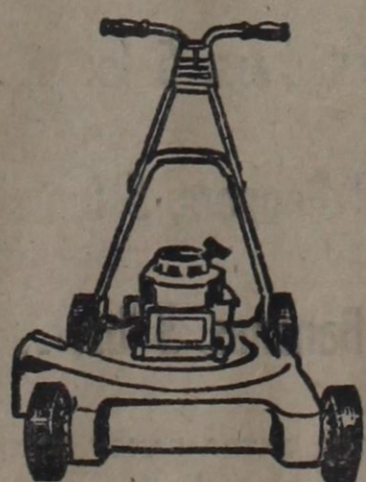
