

Bufs Grab Novice Tourney Laurel; Buffettes Second

Cross Plains Buffaloes put three strung victories together to annex the championship at the Novice Invitational Basketball Tournament last week end, and the Buffettes, although absorbing first loss of the season, claimed second place in the meet.

Buffalo John Fred McWilliams, a senior, was named one of two Most Valuable Players, and John Hanke and Tony Evans were elected to the 15-member all-tournament masculine team.

Buffettes Michelle Prater, Dawn Strength and Shelia Payne were selected to places on the 10-member all-tournament feminine unit.

Both local squads began play on Friday with triumphs. Buffettes, after a slow start and owning only a 6-4 advantage after first quarter, pulled away to a 54-29 win over Gustine. Dawn Strength sunk 20 points and Alesia Thompson added 11 more.

The herd nabbed a 14-4 first quarter lead over Gustine, and then played about even terms for a final 39-30 victory. McWilliams blistered the nets for 24 points.

Saturday morning again both were victorious. Buffettes rolled

to an easy 64-27 win over the Coleman J.V. as Miss Strength added 25 points and Miss Prater added 15.

Bisons owned a 21-12 edge over Blackwell at halftime in second round and withstood a rally for a narrow 41-39 triumph. McWilliams and Evans shared scoring honors with 10 each.

Buffettes consecutive win popped in the championship contest Saturday night as the Hawley JV girls defeated Cross Plains 47-39. Hawley owned only a 12-11 edge after first eight minutes, but jumped to a 36-16 lead at intermission. Buffettes trimmed four points of the deficit in the third, but managed just one more in the fourth for the final 47-38 count. Miss Strength had 14 points and Miss Thompson added 10 for Cross Plains.

Buffaloes and Novice Horne's battled in the championship contest with Bufs leading at each quarter mark 12-10 after one, 30-25 at intermission, 37-34 at the three-quarter mark and 45-33 final. Hanke and Evans each counted 15 points, and McWilliams counted 11 more.

Hart attributed the problem to a "loose jumper" near where the co-op gets its electricity from West Texas Utilities.

Callahan County Sheriff Bill Skinner said no problems resulting from the outage were reported to his department.

C. W. Brown Is Elected To Oil Museum Hall Of Fame

C. W. (Claude) Brown of McCombs, prominent West Texas oilman, who was active in Cross Plains area development nearly 60 years ago, has been elected to the Petroleum Museum's Hall of Fame at Midland.

Criteria for the coveted honor are that the person shall have significantly contributed to the development of the oil industry in the Permian Basin and/or set an example for the industry as a whole.

Brown will be inducted into the Hall of Fame in ceremonies at Green Tree Country Club in Midland April 25. To be inducted at the same time are three other well-known oilmen. They are: the late Horace (Rusty) Bayer of Midland and Fort Worth; the late Levi Smith of Texas, Tex., and Pittsburgh, Penn., and Charles D. Vertrees of Midland.

Brown came to Cross Plains early in his career to manage an aggressive leasing, drilling and production program for J. K. Hughes, a prominent early-day oil operator from Soriscana. It was here that he and the former Miss Christine McGowen, youngest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Will McGowen, were mar-

ried. Their wedding was said to have been the first ever solemnized at the Methodist Church located at the corner of 8th Street and Ave. D. The officiating pastor was Dr. Tom Brabham, who later became president of McMurry College at Abilene, an institution to which the Browns have been major benefactors. They endowed a chair of political science at McMurry and the college has conferred upon him the doctor's degree.

Ex-Sabanno Man Authors 'Wrecking Texas' Book

Ray Hollis, who was reared at Sabanno and attended Cross Schools has authored a new book, "Wrecking Texas", which is winning wide acceptance throughout this section of the state.

The book relates experiences of a country boy growing up in this area during the 1930's and 40's and progresses from there to a career of wrecking hundreds of large buildings in Abilene, Fort Worth and other Texas cities. Perhaps the largest project was Hollis' leveling of 13 city blocks in downtown Fort Worth to make room for the ultra-modern Convention Center there. A number of multi-story structures were wrecked in Abilene. None, though, occasioned as much public concern as did the dismantling of the historic, old Guitard mansion on North First Street. Hollis relates interesting

reminders of the demise of all these once-familiar landmarks, some of which were life-threatening.

Hollis recorded his book on tape and then passed the oral manuscript to Sam Pendegast, former Abilene news writer, who edited the copy for publication by Eakin Publications Inc. of Austin. Ten thousand copies of the book came off the offset presses in first printing. They sold quickly and a second printing followed. It has been delivered and is said to be enjoying record sales. In Cross Plains the book is available at the local newspaper office at \$20 per copy.

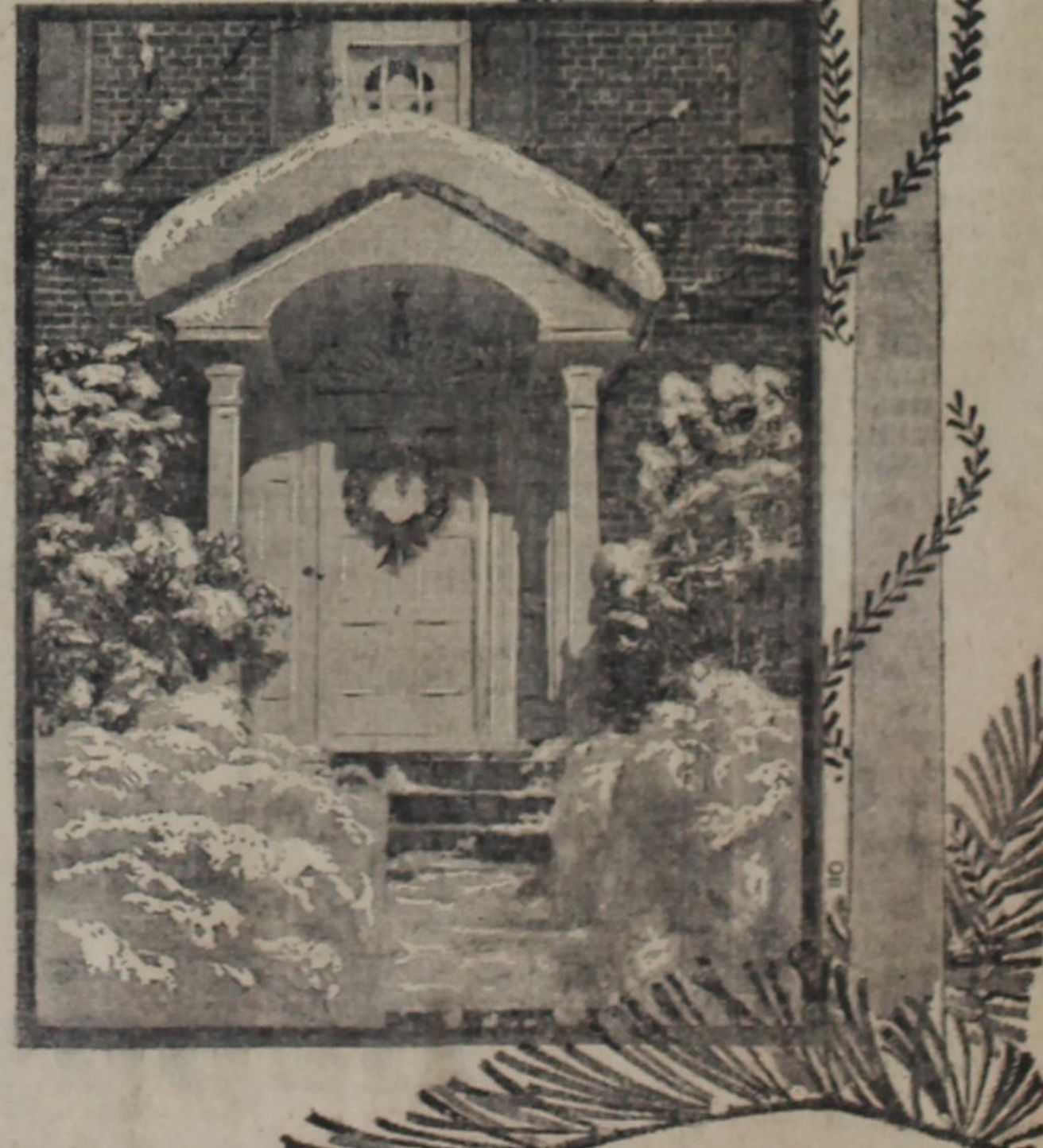

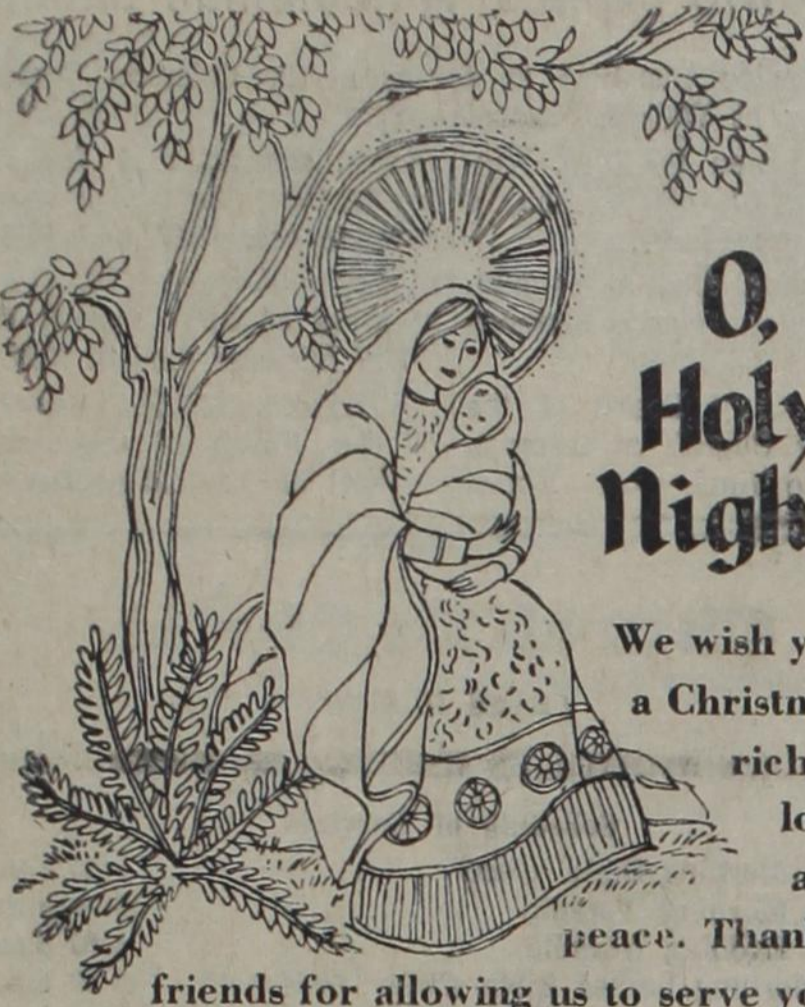

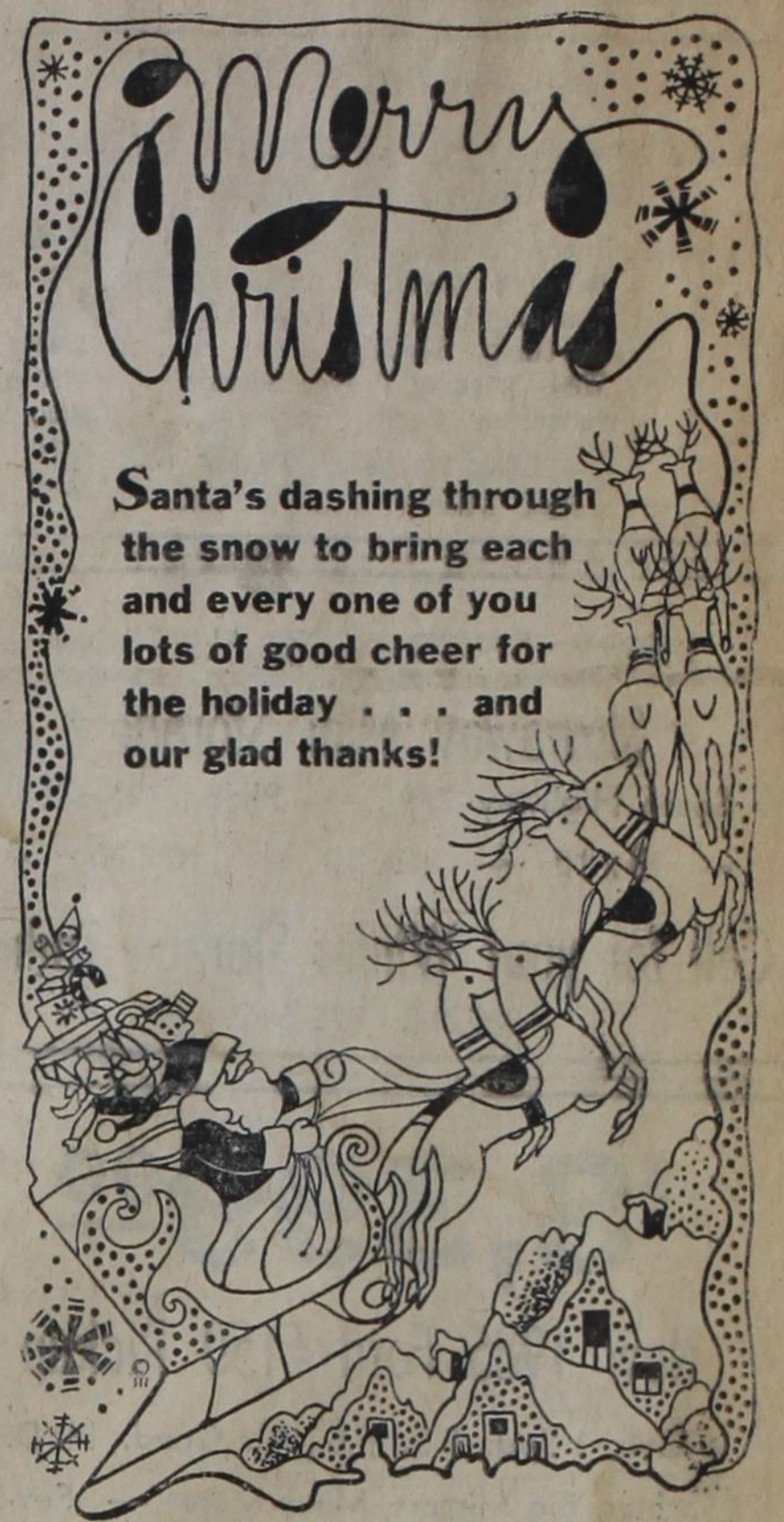
