# Library Learn About Program To Begin 

| Cross Plains Public Library will begin on Wednesday, October 21, at $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Parents are requested to register children before that time or wait until after that morning. No children will be registered at the first meeting in order that personnel can be free to get the program off to a smooth start. <br> Children who are between 3 years, 6 months and 5 years of age are eligible. Those who have become three since May 1, 1987 will not be eligible until the fall program of 1988. <br> The major purpose of the program is to encourage young children to get the "library habit." However, the "Learn About..." Program is also designed to develop both coordination and cognitive skills, as well as to offer experience in interaction with other children and adults. <br> Activities include such areas as learning colors, numbers, months, days of the week, textures, and right and left. Methods include singing, movements, listening (to both films and stories), commenting on observations, and sharing experiences. New activities are being planned for the 5 -year-olds. <br> In order that parents who work may register their own children, library personnel will be at the library on Thursday night, October 8 , from $7-8$ p.m. Parents are encouraged to register the children themselves, if possible. <br> The list of teachers and other personnel will be finalized this week. Anyone interested in story telling or helping in other ways is invited to come by or call $725-7432$. |
