## BREAKTHRU

Many preachers have used the lite and idea of a colleague's sermon, entitled "ll's Friday -but Sunday's Comingl", and prepared, then preached their own. It's adymamic thought: On Friday of the crucifixion, evenything seemed to be going Satan's way. But Sunday (and the resurrection) was coming! The tables were tumed. What seemingly was disaster and defeat turmed into the strongest testimony ever for Christianity.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ became a point of fact and persuasion in the early preachers' sermons, Acts 2:22-36;3:12-26(esp. w. 15, 26); 4:2,3, 33. Paul used the fact of Jesus' resurrection as a proof of future judgment, Acts 17:31. Some mocked, others wanted to hear more, some belleved withoutiurther questions or explanation and became Christians, Acts 17:32-34.

Response to the happening on that Sunday, and the proclamation of it since the Sunday of Acts 2 , has continued to be varied - all the way from a flat denial to "So what ifitis Friday - SUnying the most document Josh McDowell says if one denies Christ's resurrection, he's to believe in the resurrection of Christ, then live in the promise oft, is to say that it really makes no difference what Satan and all his helpers may do, Christ and lare winners VICTORIOUSI - in the end.

The Cross Plains School District Board
f Trustees and School Superint Board Lee Thompson have stated that the pro posed school facilities to be voted on at the May 6, 1995 school bond electio will not require a tax increase. The current school budget required a tax rate of 12.8 for the high school building and 94.6 for the maintenance and operation portion of the budget for a total tax rate of $\$ 1.074$ during the 1994-1995 schoo
year.
The high school building was paid for this school year and the school district is
currently debt free. To pay for the $\$ 11$ currently debt free. To pay for the $\$ 1.1$
million portion of new facilities will re million portion of new facilities will rebeing paid on the high school plus an additional 3.71 for a total of 16.51 . The balance of the new facilities will be paid for out of cash reserves and the interest earned on the bond money prior to and during construction.
The tax rate for the maintenance and peration part of the budget will be owered the amount necessary for the otal tax rate to remain the same as it is this year at $\$ 1.074$.
The school has budgeted money the past several years for a building fund and
it is that part of the budget that will be lowered the amount necessary to keep the overall tax rate at $\$ 1.074$. This will not have an effect on instruction or personnel.
