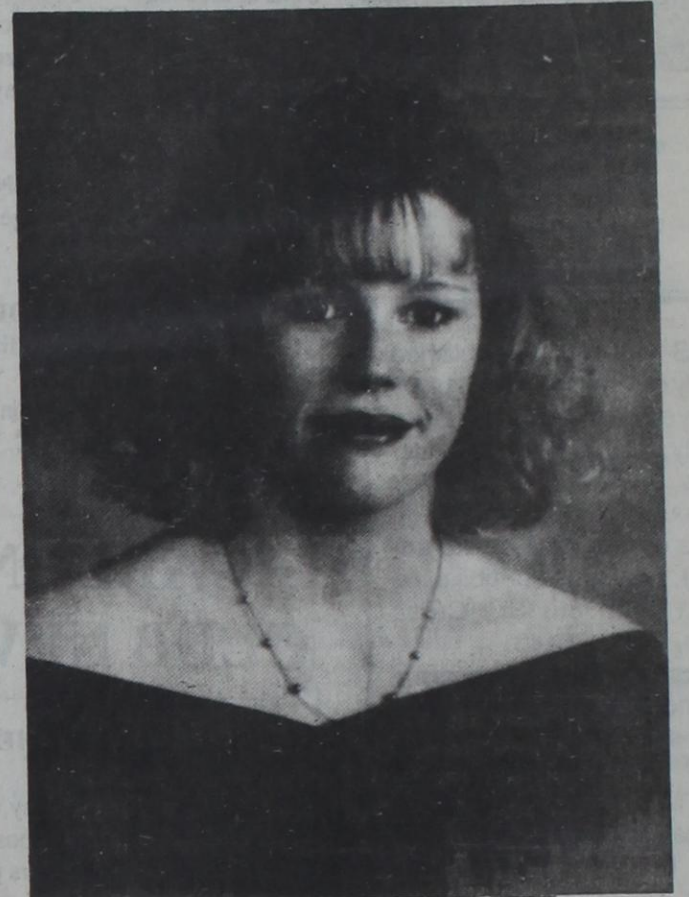

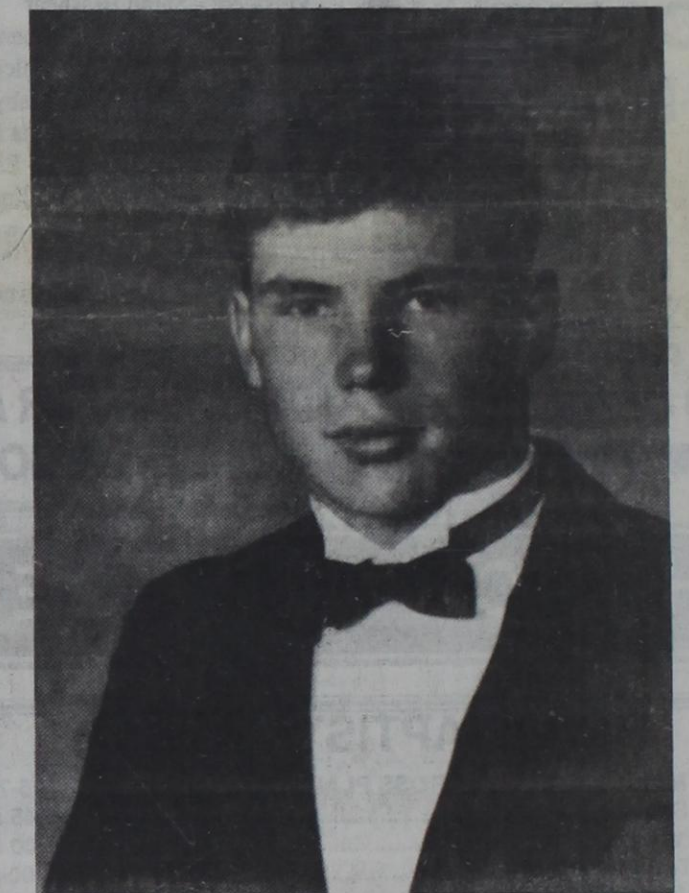

## EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM TUESDAY, MAY 23

Osteoporosis is a treatable condition which all women must be concerned about. Brownwood Regional Medical Center will present a free educational program about "Osteoporosis" on Tuesday, May 23 at 6:30 p.m. in the Outpatient Center Meeting Room as part of the community health education series.

Osteoporosis is a condition which many women develop after menopause. It is characterized by a thinning of the bones, which leaves the bones fragile and overly susceptible to fractures. The fractures result when a woman's bones can no longer withstand the activities of everyday life.

Christopher John, M.D., Internal Medicine Physician and Pulmonology Specialist will be the evening's guest speaker. He will discuss how women can protect themselves against osteoporosis through physical activity, life-style changes, hormone replacement therapy, and adequate amounts of calcium and mineral intake. In addition, Dr. John will discuss the signs of osteoporosis and how to live with it safely.

Dr. John, who is originally from Wales, Great Britain, has been a member of the medical staff at Brownwood Regional Medical Center since August 1994. He received his medical degree from Welsh National School of Medicine, University

of Wales in 1977. He served as a House Physician and Surgeon in Great Britain and South Africa before moving to Canada in 1981.

Between 1981 and 1994, while living in Canada, Dr. John completed a general medicine residency and pulmonary medicine fellowship at University Hospital, University of Saskatchewan, Canada. He then served as Medical Specialist at Thunderbay, Ontario.

Between 1986 and 1994, before joining the medical staff at Brownwood Regional Medical Center, Dr. John was an active member of the medical staff at Brantford General Hospital and St. Joseph's Hospital in Brantford, Ontario, Canada, where he served as medical advisor for the Brant County Lung Association and medical advisor for the Cardiac Rehab Programme at the Public Health Department in Brantford. He also served as the Chief of Department of Medicine at Brantford General Hospital in Ontario, Canada, from 1989 to 1992.

Dr. John is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, a charter member of the Canadian Society of Internal Medicine, a collegiate member of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and London, and a member of the American College of Physicians. He is also a member of the American Association of Cardiopulmonary Rehabilitation, the Canadian Medical Association, and the American College of Sports Medicine.

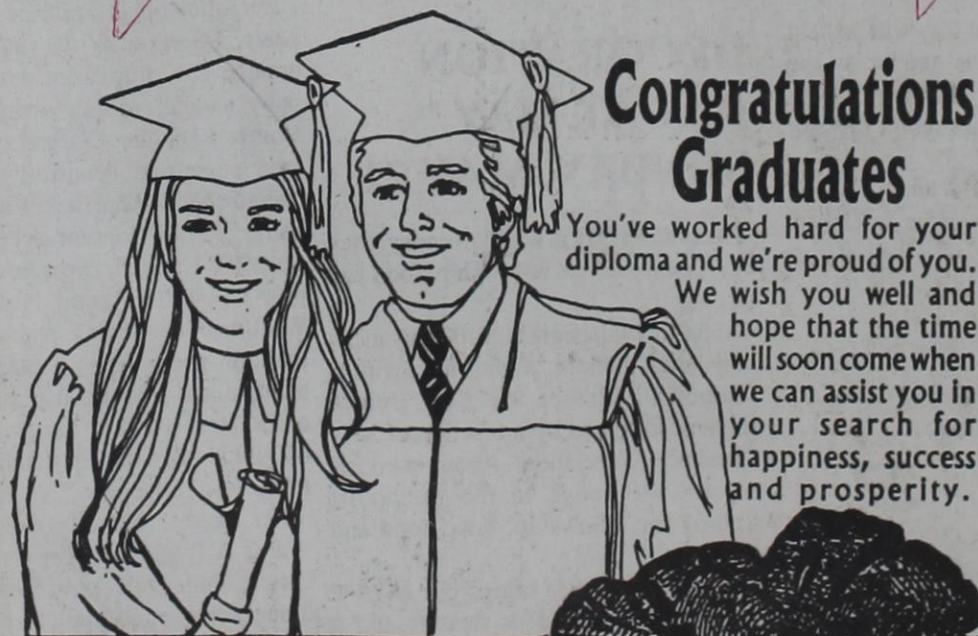

## PUBLIC HEARING MAY 22

Callahan County Commissioners will hold a public hearing Monday, May 22 to receive public input about the possibility of raising the local vehicle registration fee from \$5.00 to \$10.00 annually.

Callahan County Commissioners met Monday, April 24 in a regular commissioners' court meeting to discuss raising the local vehicle registration fee and agreed to hold the public hearing first.

Currently, all county residents pay an additional \$5.00 to the county's road and bridge fund when they pay their state vehicle registration fee. The \$5.00 local fee was approved by the county commissioners August 14, 1989.

The public hearing is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom at the county courthouse in Baird Monday, May 22.

Callahan County Tax Assessor/Collector Bun Barry said the \$5.00 local fee raises in excess of \$59,000 for the county road and bridge fund.

There are some 19,000 registered vehicles and trailers in the county which pay the state vehicle registration fee. Only farm trailers are exempt from paying the \$5.00 local registration fee, Barry said.

"This (local vehicle registration fee) is as close to a user tax as there is," Barry said.

County Judge Bill Johnson said approximately half of the counties in the state charge a \$10.00 local fee registration. He said some 124 counties charge \$10.00, there are nine counties which charge \$7.50 and the remaining counties charge a \$5.00 local registration fee.

The county judge said all monies collected from the \$5.00 local fee are put into the county's road and bridge fund—nothing goes into the county's general fund.

Johnson went on to say the county commissioners are considering raising the local vehicle registration fee "to put more materials on county roads." Monies collected for the road and bridge fund are used to purchase road material and equipment to maintain county roads.

It is one of TxDot's most popular and well-received projects offered throughout the state, officials say.

Project Graduation was originally developed to assist rural schools with their celebrations and began in 1984 with only two schools. In 1989, the first year the department provided mini-grants to rural schools, they had 59 recipients. The program proved so successful, it was expanded to include all high schools. This year more than 500 schools will participate in TxDot's Project Graduation mini-grant incentive program.

Mitchell said the mini-grants are not intended to fully fund a Project Graduation event, but to provide a small incentive for schools to start and support alcohol/drug-free, safe events for the students.

The boys won the first game, but the "old timers" won the second. It was truly a great evening and we could have made an entire show of "America's Funniest Videos."

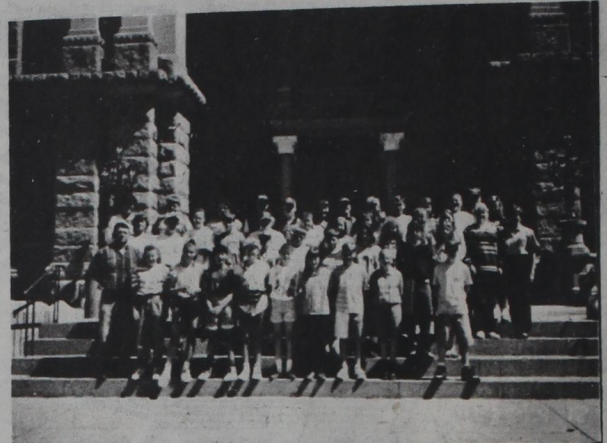
