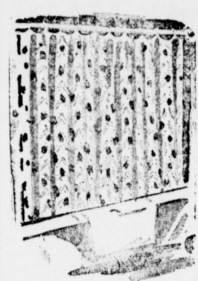

Schools will close for holiday on Friday December 21. It is understood that school will resume work on January 2.

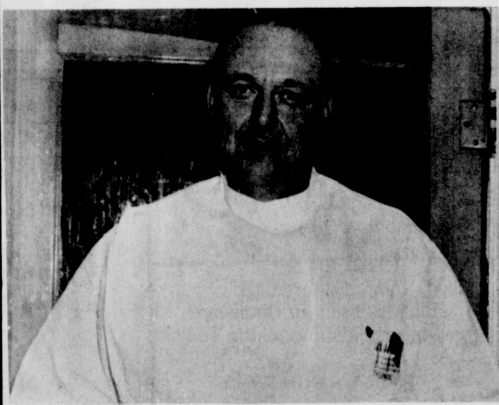
There will be a Christmas program and tree at the Methodist Church on Christmas eve night. Preparations are being made this week for the entertainment and a nice time is in store for the little folks.
