






About five years ago, an ancient plant never before grown commercially in this country, was introduced to farmers in the cotton producing areas in Texas. It was sesame, a plant that grows under conditions favorable to cotton. It produces tiny seeds from which vital oils are extracted.

At the time, scsame was halled as a new cash crop for those areas where cotton production was curbed by allotments. But a big obstacle to profitable production was the sesame plant's tendency to shatter its seeds.

The Texas Research Foundation at Renner was primarily responsible for development of the crop in Texas. And after much research, the foundation has been able to produce a "non-shattering" variety.

The new variety has produced amazingly high yields, particularly where irrigation is applied.


On the high Plains, sesame has been termed the No. 2 money maker for irrigation farmers, who last year averaged \$121 per acre in gross returns -- second only to cotton.



No, he is well with-in his rights, though he may give first aid — but only emergency treatment where a child's health treatment where a child's health ing where they met a truck en-or life may be at stake. He is voy to Fort Hood. Mikely to put off follow-up care until he can reach the child's parents. A relative or baby sitter generally cannot grant con-sent for a child's treatment.

Even an adult must request treatment and grant consent to medical care on his own before a doctor can give it to him. Children cannot do this.

By going to your doctor you show you willingness and consent to accept his treatment. Your consent is assumed also when you ask for a house call by the doctor, or if as a result of an accident you come to a hospital for emergency treatment. If you are unconscious, the doctor may well give you emergency care, yet later he should get your consent to further treatment.

Minors cannot consent to medical treatment, and except in

dical treatment, and except in dire emergencies their parents or guardians must give it for them.

The consent should not be broadly or loosely phrased, but should be as specific as circumstances permit.

The principal reason for hav-ing the consent in writing is to avoid later misunderstandings. It is a protection both to the pa-tient and physician.




