

CLARENDON

An Eloquent Minister Tells Some Plain Facts.

Rev. J. W. Hill, of Greenville, broke the record last week in his funeral oration by convincing the world that it is possible for a minister to tell the truth even at an open grave.—Sulphur Springs Gazette.

Following is the sermon:

"Neighbors, fellow-townsmen and friends: I am called upon this afternoon to discharge a duty of the saddest and most melancholy character that has ever fallen to my lot since I have been a minister of the gospel. One man and perhaps two has been hurled into eternity; unhousled, unwarned, unbidden, and unprepared, and how the audit stands is known to Him alone who seeth not as man seeth, and to whose judgment bar both speaker and hearer are hastening on as fast as the wheels of time can move,

The awful tragedy that has shocked our city and stabbed the hearts of so many innocent victims is not the result of Jesus' power; it is the legitimate work of sin. The gaping wounds of him who lies before me and of him who is dying in his bed near by are eloquent-more eloquent ther human orator could be, in support of that eternal principle expressed in the words of the Apostle: "Whatsoever a man soweth; that shall he also


