Sims Sworn In As D.A. for 100th Judicial District

On December 15th, 1994, Randall C. Sims of Wellington was sworn into office as District Attorney of the 100th Judicial District. The ceremony was held in the courtroom of the Seventh Court of Appeals with Chief Justice Charles Reynolds administering the oath of office.

"Chief Justice Reynolds has previously served as District Judge of the 100th Judicial District and is a highly respected member of the judiciary across this state. I consider myself most fortunate to have had him administer to me the oaths as an attorney, assistant county attorney, assistant district attorney, and now as district attorney" Sims said.

Sims won the Democratic Primary in March of this year and was unopposed in the general election held in November. Since the election was to fill the unexpired for district attorney, Sims could take over before the first of the year.

As District Attorney, Sims will be responsible for the prosecution of felony offenses in Carson, Childress, Collingsworth, Donley, and Hall counties.

"We are open for business and ready to get to work!" Sims said. The main office is located in the Childress County Courthouse. The mailing address is Courthouse, Box 14, Childress, Texas 79201, and the phone number is 817-937-8017. There will be satellite offices in each of the county courthouses as we do our weekly rotation throughout the district.

Local Judge Attends Seminar

Judge Jimmy B. Johnson, was certified at a recent 20-hour Justice of the Peace Seminar held Dec. 7, 8, & 9, 1994, in Tyler, Texas. The seminar was sponsored by the Justice of the Peace and Constable Association and is conducted by the Texas Justice Court Training Center, headquartered at Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos. The seminar is one of many held state wide to allow Justices of the peace to meet their Continuing Judicial Education requirements as set forth in Article 27.005 of the Texas Government Code. Judges selected areas of study that closely matched their court activity. Topics covered included: New Penal Code Review, Juvenile Law, Forcible Entry and Detainer, Traffic Law, Inquests, Small Claim Procedure, Criminal Trial Procedure, Contempt, Bond Setting, Magistrate Duties, Criminal Law Issues, Good Judging Techniques, Clerkless Court Management, Media Relations, Code of Judicial Conduct.

New Program Developed

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center and the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center have approved an agreement to jointly provide cancer program services to children in the Panhandle region.

The Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center will provide an annual grant to the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center to provide partial support to the Pediatric Oncology Medical Program in Amarillo, Texas. Harrington Cancer Center and Texas Tech will work jointly in education programs, patient and family support resources, and areas for fund development. Texas Tech will continue to operate the Pediatric Oncology program in its expanded facilities in Amarillo. All personnel and services will be under the direction of Texas Tech and the program will be open to all children needing the services of the Pediatric Oncology staff. Inpatient services will continue to be provided in the Children's Wing at Northwest Texas Health Systems and the Harrington Cancer Center will provide radiation oncology services.

The name of the program will be Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center and the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center Children's Cancer program.

Check It Out

Is Christmas a relatively new Texas celebration? I think not.

According to Elizabeth Silverthorn's new non-fiction book, *Christmas in Texas*, it was a reality when the Spanish explorers arrived in Texas, and took possession of the land. As early as 1599, Texas Indians were introduced to Christmas pagentry. In the 1800's,

Anglo-Americans' main concern was survival. However, they were aware of the Christmas season and, when possible, held religious observances. These were later followed by community parties. To quote the author, "For most, there was little cheer to be had. Nevertheless, these newcomers gave Texas geography a Yuletide touch. Seven towns were given the name, Bethlehem. On New Year's Day of 1821, some of Stephen F. Austin's Old Three Hundred named the creek by which they were camping in Washington County, New Year Creek. Another group of the Old Three Hundred spent an uncomfortable day on December 5 camped by a creek in Limestone County which they named Christmas Creek. Other unknown travelers named the Christmas Mountains of the Big Bend area in Brewster County." (p. 5) There was also a stream named Egg Nog Branch in eastern San Augustine County.

Ms. Silverthorn relates grim experiences as well as more successful ones which happened on Christmas Day or during Christmas week. Texas' involvement with in-

dependence; battalions arriving to help at the Alamo; Stephen F. Austin's release from prison after a confining ten months for charges of plotting to separate Texas from Mexico; Christmas experiences of heroic woman, Jane Long, called "Mother of Texas", and other courageous women are only a few of the many events occurring during the Christmas season which are described.

Protestant churches could not be organized in Texas under Mexican law, so most Christmas celebrations were in Catholic tradition. By 1845, when Texas won independence, citizens were free to celebrate the holiday season with any kind of religious or secular ceremony they desired. Texas was a nation. Festivities lasted from Christmas Eve through New Year's Day with turkey shoots, exuberant dinners, dances (termed balls), and parties. Many of today's traditions were not yet established. Only few German immigrants had Christmas trees in their homes. Santa and reindeer were not yet well-known. It wasn't until 1856 that President Franklin Pierce introduced the Christmas tree into the White

House for the first time, and by 1880, trees were the "rage".

As the state developed, so did Christmas traditions. Different cultures contributed different aspects of food, parades, decorations, fashions, wood-burning stove and open fireplace cooking. The less wealthy decorated with berries, moss, cotton, pecans in colored cloth, popcorn, and red pepper garlands while the wealthy displayed more elaborate decorations and, also, toys such as china dolls, expensive cloth, and fancy rocking horses. The more usual gifts for Texas children were dolls of rags and cornshucks, handmade toy wagons, willow whistles, socks with nuts and fruits, and sometimes, a dime in the toe.

"By Christmas of 1864, homemade clothing, food, drink, and gifts were essential. Gold was \$5,000 a pound; flour was \$600 a barrel; sugar \$2 an ounce; butter \$40 a pound; firecrackers \$5 a pack; and real tea was worth \$100 a pound. Merchants had little of anything to sell, and for what they did have they refused to take worthless Confederate money, insisting on gold or silver." (p.13)

The Civil War had ended by the 1865 holiday season, and merchants advertised supplies of "candies, raisins, whiskey, tobacco, coffee, and dry goods in time for Christmas. A sad postscript on the horrors of war were advertisements for metallic artificial legs for \$100 to \$125, cheaper and more lasting than wooden legs." (p.13)

By 1871, the coming of the railroad provided more available goods from which to choose. Newspaper advertisements began to categorize Christmas celebrations under titles, "List of Church Activities" and "Christmas Doings in Saloons".

By the end of the 19th century, 2000 people attended midnight Mass at San Fernando Cathedral. This was quite different

from that first Christmas Mass held by lonely Spanish soldiers on Texas soil by starlight and moonlight.

German, Jewish, Italian, Poles, and French in Texas each celebrated the season with their own traditional rituals. Besides descriptions of these five cultures, the author has interestingly related seasonal traditions of other heritages brought to Texas by Scandinavians, British, Czechs, African-American, and Wendish. The Frontier Heritage might be of special interest to citizens of our local area. It includes excerpts from personal letters and colorful descriptions of activities on the Jackson Ranch, Goodnight (JA) Ranch, Matador Ranch, King Ranch, and XIT Ranch. J. Frank Dobie shares one of his Christmas recollections. Typical Christmas Cards and wonderful recipes from each culture contribute additional reading interest to Elizabeth Silverthorn's book. You may want to include a delicious dish from another culture with your own traditional Panhandle holiday dinner.

It would require more than one article to relate the many fascinating seasonal events and traditions which have developed from the mingling of numerous cultures throughout our great state. *Christmas In Texas* sparks the reader's awareness that some of these celebrations will still be occurring as you celebrate your own holiday season.

At this time, Burton Memorial Library extends best wishes for your holiday and a productive New Year. Hopefully, you'll continue to "check it out".

Drivers License Gets New Look

Texas driver licenses will have a new look beginning early in 1995. The new licenses will be more convenient for Texas' 15.6 million license and identification card holders and will provide more security features, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety.

"We're always looking for new ways to prevent criminals from using drivers licenses for illegal purposes," said DPS Director Col. James R. Wilson. "The new licenses and identification cards will be harder to forge or alter. A real bonus is that the same technology that makes the new licenses more secure will greatly reduce the time it takes to get the card into the hands of the owner."

The DPS will begin phasing in the new technology in January. New licenses will be available in all 243 towns and cities with driver license offices later in the year.

Current licenses need not be replaced. They will continue to be valid until their expiration date. Fees will remain the same.

The new licenses will have a look similar to a credit card, but will be easy to distinguish because of colorful images of the digital imaging technology also will enhance the licensees' photographs.

"The new format will include a magnetic stripe, a bar code and a special laminate to maximize security," said Judy Sibert, DPS project manager for the digital image driver license system. "Licenses issued for Texans under the age of 21 will look different from regular licenses, making it easier for merchants to determine a customer's age."

The application and renewal procedures will change very little. Applicant's thumb prints will be taken using imaging equipment, eliminating the mess of ink. Photos will be taken with video cameras linked to computers, allowing technicians to better assure a good likeness of the applicant.

"A real benefit to licensees is that the new system will allow us to get the license in their hands in a fewer than 10 days, instead of the current four to six weeks," Sibert said. "And as merchants adopt equipment capable of reading the magnetic stripe, these new cards will speed up check acceptance."

Sibert said another security feature will be a laminate embossed with the word "Texas" in lines on the front. The "Texas" will glow ultraviolet light.

Drivers with good records will continue to be able to renew for a second four-year period without returning to a license office.

The last major change in licenses was made in 1968, when pictures were added and the use of paper licenses was discontinued except for temporary licenses, learners' permits and certain special needs licenses.

Every year the enrollment grows by a certain percentage, the Pres gets a bonus. Raising money is a prime responsibility; give the President a commission. Pray that he/she becomes the richest person in Donley County.





The Lights Of Christmas

(NAPS)—As you gather around a brilliantly-lit Christmas tree, see homes and stores aglow with beautiful lights and decorations or see pictures of the magnificent national Christmas tree in Washington, D.C. all lit up, you might like to take a moment to think about where this bright Christmas custom comes from.

The lights on the Christmas tree, legend says, were the result of a bright idea by Martin Luther. Walking in the woods one winter evening, he saw starlight glimmering through the branches of an evergreen; brought the tree home and trimmed it with candles so the whole family could enjoy the spectacle. Ever since, lights and Christmas have gone together.

As for the national Christmas tree, its light comes from what to many is a surprising source. A coal mine. For one thing, coal is the nation's most abundant and reliable energy source.

When President Clinton turns the switch that lights the national Christmas tree and the 57 smaller trees that represent the 50 states,

the U.S. territories and the District of Columbia, the electricity will be supplied by coal.

What's more, for the fifth year in a row, the 57 live trees that form the "pathway of peace" were grown on reclaimed coal mine lands. After the holidays, the donated trees will be planted in Washington-area parks.

Before being reclaimed, the surface mine where the trees grew produced half a million tons of coal to provide electricity for residents in Ohio.

Today, this former mine is a commercial tree farm, with over 250,000 trees growing on reclaimed coal mine land near Belmont, Ohio. The National Coal Association donated the trees; Cravat Coal provided the transportation.

Over two million acres of mined land have been reclaimed by the U.S. coal industry since 1974. The Christmas trees are a cheery example of how this land has been put to productive use; and something else to celebrate this holiday!
