





The maps are published as is bounded by minutes of latitude and longitude. The fifteen minute series consists of about 250 square miles in each quadrangle, and the seven and one half minute series about 60 square miles in each quadrangle.

In addition to the culture features, the map will show the elevation and topography of the land by means of contour lines at vertical intervals of five, ten and twenty feet.

Topographic maps are used as base in planning the develop ment of our natural resources. Local, county and state engineers use them in planning and locating highways and roads, airports, power and pipe lines. They will also be used in studies on water conservation, flood control, irrigation, drainage, geology and oil and gas exploration.

When the maps are published in 1961 they will become a part of the standard topographic atlas County Commissioner Precinct 3 of the United States. Copies will be available from the Map Distribution Unit, U.S.G.S., Federal
