## First Bank & Trust donates portable resuscitator

The First Bank & Trust of Clarendon recently purchased a portable resuscitator unit and donated it to the Clarendon Emergency Medical Services for use on one of the local ambulances.

This important piece of lifesaving equipment was purchased by First Bank & Trust and donated in memory of Emmett Simmons. It is one of the required pieces of equipment to meet the new Mobile Intensive Care Unit rating under standards imposed by the Texas Department of Health. It is valued at over \$600.00. This is the second such portable resuscitator donated by the bank. Previously, one had been purchased and given in memory of Van Kennedy and has already saved many lives. The other ambulance had no such unit until now.

The portable resuscitator is very lightweight and completely self contained. It enables EMS personnel to breathe for a patient who is unable to breathe for himself for whatever reason, delivering to him 100% oxygen at a sufficient rate to keep him well oxygenated while he is not breathing. This is very important if the patient is to have a chance of survival. If the patient begins breathing on his own, the unit will cycle and deliver 100% oxygen to him on demand and at the volume the patient determines. If this volume is not adequate, personnel need only press a button to increase this volume and assist the patient in his attempt. It also has the capability of delivering constant flow oxygen from 2 to 15 liters via nasal cannulas and masks if the patient only needs oxygen administered but is unable to breathe on his own and

adequately. An EMS representative stated, "We are very fortunate to have this fine piece of equipment on our ambulance. Very few services as small as ours have one. We certainly appreciate the support of the First Bank & Trust in our efforts to obtain our rating as Mobile Intensive Care Units. We especially appreciate the help of President Bronnie McNabb in acquiring this resuscitator. Past experience has shown us that some part of this piece of equipment will be used on approximately 125 to 175 calls a year."

"Emmett was a big supporter of our efforts. He was very instrumental in obtaining the first resuscitator for us. He had the desire to see Donley County have at least

## WTU filed for rate increase

West Texas Utilities company has filed for a general increase in its electric rates for retail customers.

Local Manager Jerry Chambliss said the application, filed Friday, is a systemwide request for higher rates. Simultaneous filings were made in all incorporated towns and with the Public Utility Commission of Texas at Austin for an increase in rural areas, unincorporated towns and in incorporated towns which have ceded jurisdiction over electric rates.

So far, a total of 19 municipalities served by WTU have opted to let the PUC analyze rate requests and to make decisions for them. These are Albany, Chillicothe, Dickens, Eldorado, Goree, Hedley, Lakeview, Matador, McCamey, Mertzon, Moran, Paint Rock, Roaring Springs, Robert Lee, Roby, Rotan, Rule, Trent and Weinert. WTU has filed complete information about the rate request with each of these towns.

The principal reasons cited for the new rate proposal is that the present rates are not adequate to support the investment WTU has made in necessary new facilities since the last rate increase, Chambliss said.

WTU's current construction program, the core of which is the coal-fired power plant at Oklaunion, is the biggest and most expensive in the Company's history. By the time the proposed rates become effective, WTU will have invested more than \$84.4 million in new facilities and must spend considerably more in the years ahead to

No major changes in rate

## Quilting favorite pastime

No other form of needlework art seems to have become so closely involved with the history of our country and with the lives of our people as quilting. Quilting is the sandwich of two layers of fabric with padding between, held together by stitching.

Quilting has been practiced for thousands of years. In the middle ages, soldiers wore padding and quilted coats and hoods under their armor. The Dutch and English Colonists brought quilts to America to protect themselves from the severe cold of the winters, it was used to cover backings of chairs and fireside benches, as well as coverings for their beds. It was made into coats and petticoats. Quilting was and is a favorite pastime. In the early

days, women and girls gathered in quilting bees. They would quilt all day, and in many cases, the men and boys would come in the evening and there would be supper and dancing.

# Governor declares Green Thumb/STEP Day

Governor Mark White has made June 1 memorable for almost 2000 hard-working older Texans by designating it as Texas Farmers Union Green Thumb/Senior Texans Employment Program Day in the state.

Citing the "meaningful employment opportunities" offered by the two senior employment programs since the early 1970's, the Governor signed a special proclamation during ceremonies at the Capitol.

Texas Farmers Union has sponsored the Green Thumb program in Texas since 1970. The largest and oldest federally-funded senior employment program, Green Thumb has more than 17,000 enrollees nationwide, including 1,059 in 108 Texas counties.

In 1973, the Texas Legislature adopted a TFU proposal to establish the Senior Texans Employment Program (STEP), which now received both state and federal support through the Texas Department on Aging. STEP employs 930 workers in 122 counties.

Governor White said that through the two programs, STEP and Green Thumb workers "have found a new lease on life and have made major contributions to their communities."

"Citizens of Texas are grateful for the rejuvenation

of their rural areas and the reclamation of lost manpower these programs provide," the Governor said.

The programs place workers aged 55 and over with senior centers, schools, libraries and municipalities to furnish services that would not otherwise be available.

TFU President Mike Moeller, who attended the signing ceremony along with officials from both programs and the Texas Department on Aging, said Governor White's proclamation "is clear evidence that the new leaders of this state value our strong rural heritage, and the past and future contributions of older Texans."

Moeller emphasized that STEP and Green Thumb are "true self-help programs designed to serve those who have the most faith in the work ethic and in the nation itself: older workers."

"Most of these people were raised on farms and they know what it means to work. For them work isn't a necessary evil, a means to an end; for them it's a worthy end in itself," he said.

The two programs not only provide rural elderly persons with work and rural communities with much needed services, he added, but also actually save the taxpayers money.

"A study by the American Association of Retired Per-

sons estimates that for every dollar going into senior employment, the government saves \$1.15 in benefits the workers could be receiving if they were unemployed," he said.

"So this recognition is not just for the idealistic purposes of these programs; it's also for the very real and practical advantages that accrue to all of us-rural and urban-as citizens and tax-

payers," he concluded.

Green Thumb worker Cleo Holder, 82, of Dripping Springs, who was honored at the ceremony and received a pen from the Governor, knows first hand how important employment can be for an older person.

A cook at the Dripping Springs senior center since 1977, Holder has found that it's "almost impossible to get by on Social Security because things have gotten so high that you don't have anything left (out of Social Security) to buy clothing or much else."

Even more important to Holder, however, is the sense of purpose she derives from her work. "I think

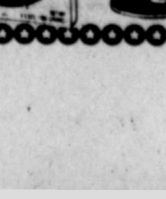

## Fire Department telephone changed

With arrival of the new  
telephone books, Clarendon  
residents will notice that the  
Fire Department number has  
been changed from 874-3755  
to 874-3533. The old phone  
number will soon be dis-  
connected and local residents  
should make note of the new  
number immediately and  
begin to use it now.

With this new change, all  
calls will be coming into the  
Donley County Jail and will  
be dispatched through there  
radio. This number is also  
the same for the Sheriff's  
Department and the High-  
way Patrol. It should also be  
used to request an am-  
bulance as they have the  
capability to dispatch EMS  
personnel via pagers directly  
from the jail. The number at  
the funeral home will not be  
disconnected but Clarendon  
folks can get used to having  
one number for Fire, Law  
Enforcement, and Emergen-  
cy Medical Services.

This change should greatly  
simplify things and will  
eliminate the need for per-  
sons to have three or four  
numbers by their phone. It  
should also eliminate the  
need to make a decision on  
the specific service they need  
and has the advantage of  
eliminating multiple re-  
quests involving several  
agencies such as occurs in an  
accident, for example, where  
law enforcement, EMS, and  
Fire Rescue are all required.  
With just one call, all of  
these can be dispatched  
simultaneously.

Howardwick residents  
should look up their emer-  
gency numbers in the front of  
their directories and know  
them.

Callers should be ready to  
provide the following infor-  
mation when calling: Name,  
address and/or location,  
nature of the problem, the  
phone number they are  
calling from, and any other  
information the dispatcher  
requests. Please do not be  
impatient. The dispatcher is  
trained to obtain certain in-  
formation and in many cases,  
an extra 30 seconds to one  
minute on the phone will not  
cause the problem to become  
any worse and can save per-  
sonnel a great deal of time in  
trying to locate the problem.  
Please try to stay calm and

do not hang up until told to  
do so.  
Remember to note the new  
changes. In Clarendon for

Law Enforcement, Fire, Res-  
cue, and Emergency Medical  
Services the number is 874-  
3533.
