building airplane wings during World War II. He worked for Texas Highway Department grading and building roads and was a guard for convicts who worked on
the rads. He drove a milk truck for G. W. Bradshaw. Most of all, he G. W. Bradshaw. Most of all, he
loved farming and raising cattle. Granddaddy always believed in helping other folks that were less fortunate, right down to sharing his
last biscuit with a stranger during
the depression. He loved to be kind
to others, especially children. What he taught us grandsons and the kind and loving way he taught us will never be forgotten. We owe everything we know to him.
