reached by the Board of Governors concerning the proposed increase in postage rates. Effective April 3, 1988, the new
rate for first class postage will be 25 tate for first class postage will be 25
cents. This is the first increase in postage in three years. Although no
one welcomes an increase in postage. one welcomes an increase in postage.
it should be placed in perspective. should be placed in perspective.
For example, in 1932 a first class postage stamp cost 3 cents. With adjustments for inflation, that same tamp would cost 25.5 cents.
