Clarendon's Economy Growing

According to the State Comptroller's latest figures, Clarendon is still growing. In January, sales tax receipts climbed to \$20,155.33, up 4.41% from 1989. While the town's growth rate has been slow, it has been pleasantly stable.

In contrast, area towns had their ups and downs. Armstrong County (Claude) was down 6.78% over the previous year. Briscoe gained 1.6%. Carson County (Groom, Panhandle, Skellytown and White Deer) fell by 5.31%. Childress climbed 5.22%. Wellington--which has been suffering for several years--gained 17.65% over the previous, depressed year, a welcome improvement. Lefors, McLean and Pampa (Gray County) were off an average of 4.12%, but Lefors itself was off 42.41%.

Hall County offered really mixed signals. Overall, the county was off by 3.49%. Estelline was down 32.92% and Memphis off 2.14%. But Lakeview was up 60.56% and Turkey up .54%. Hutchinson county was up 10.66%. Motley was up 9.28%, primarily because of the revival of Roaring Springs, up a whopping 51.32%. Matador was down 12.14%.

More urban areas of the Panhandle did not fare as well. Potter county was up only 1.83% while Randall managed an increase of 3.31%.

All of the figures above are nominal dollars. The are not adjusted for inflation. Real retail growth is obviously less than the raw figures indicate. However, at a time when many area towns have lost sales revenue, Clarendon has done well to hold its own.

of an area's economy. Yet the figures offer hope that the area's recession is waning and better times are at hand.

Business people in that area generally seem to be upbeat--more optimistic than earlier. Clarendon and neighboring towns are organizing to build up area's economic vigor. Most folks feel that the worst is over.



"And There Was No More Sea"

by Jon Leggitt

In his stunning vision of the new heaven and the new earth recorded in the twenty-first chapter of Revelation, John remarks that "the first heaven and the first earth were passed away; and there was no more sea" (verse 1). Why would he mention the absence of

the sea? John was, of course, about to describe the new Jerusalem, the holy city, "whose builder and maker was God," where all things that distress, all things that cause anguish and pain, would be forever gone, and one of those distressing things, in John's mind, was the sea.

Virtually all ancient peoples, it seems, and the Jews in particular, were terrified of the sea. They did not possess the compass, and, as much as was possible, hugged the shoreline when travel on the sea was absolutely necessary. The Jews, at the height of their power and prestige--in Solomon's day-hired themselves a navy. They wanted as little to do with the sea as possible. In that beautiful city, John was saying, among the countless other blessings, we won't have to be afraid of the sea anymore.

"O when I get to Heaven going to sing and shout,

I'm going to lay down my heavy

There's nobody there to turn me

I'm going to lay down my heavy load.'

I don't think it ever occurred to me that once I made it through the Pearly Gates, anyone might want to throw me out. But this old Deep-South spiritual was sung by slaves who had been ripped from their homeland. It was sung by slaves who, following emancipation, often found that they had no place in society. Like John the Revelator, they longed for a time when their worst fears would be laid to rest. They sang of a day of freedom ac-

ceptance, and peace. What is modern man's worst fear? Nuclear holocaust? Worldwide famine? The wild, unstoppable spread of AIDS? A point of no return in the pollution of our world? These cause us to tremble, but ultimately, modern man's deepest fear is probably the same as that of his progenitors--the fear of death.


But in describing why we should give our utmost devotion, worship, and praise to Jesus, the writer of Hebrews says, "...He also Himself likewise took part of the same [flesh and blood]; that through death He might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; And deliver him who through fear of death were all their lifetime sub-

ject to bondage" (2:14-15).
"And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes," John continued, "and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away" (Revelation 21:4). What do you fear most? It will be gone in Glory.

"Agreed," one might well say, "but must I wait for the next world to get relief from my fears?"


No. Listen as the Lord speaks to His weak, fearful, cringing people--"thou worm Jacob," he refers to Israel: Fear thou not: for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness" (Isaiah 41:10).

"Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32).


