personnel and these will be needed to communicate with the National Weather Service and storm spotters in the immediate area as well as for fires, ambulance, and law enforcement needs. When a large number of people call in all the phone lines are jammed and prevents necessaiy mergency calls from coming in and going out. Your best action is, if yo re unsure whether or not you should seek shelter, just go ahead and do in, put them where they are handy.
