

President Obama has been accused of falling short of his campaign promises for a more transparent government. It certainly appears that the Obama administration is borrowing from George W. Bush's playbook, at least when it comes to keeping information on particularly controversial government programs from being disclosed.

Despite harsh criticism from civil liberties groups such as the ACLU, Obama's recent decision to block the release of photographs documenting abuse of pris-

oners in Iraq and Afghanistan should not be blamed on his administration's lack of transparency. On this particular issue, at least, less disclosure might not be a bad thing.

The photos in question, which could number close to 2,000, are at the center of a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit filed by the ACLU in 2004. A federal appeals court

ordered the Bush administration to release the photos in September 2008. And in March 2009, the government's request for a rehearing was denied.

The Obama administration subsequently announced its intention to release the photos by May 28. However, according to the Washington Post, Obama "changed his mind after viewing some of the images and hearing warnings from his generals in Iraq and in Afghanistan that such a move would endanger U.S. troops deployed there." As Obama stated, "The publication of these photos would not add any additional benefit to our understanding of what was carried out in the past by a small number of individuals. In fact, the most direct consequence of releasing them, I believe, would be to further inflame anti-American opinion and to put our troops in danger."

In the wake of his reversal regarding the photos' release, Obama has been harshly condemned by political supporters and civil liberties groups. One ACLU lawyer went so far as to declare that the Obama administration "has essentially become complicit with the torture that was rampant during the Bush years by being complicit in its coverup."

Yet releasing these torture photos, some of which have already been leaked and/or described in detail by the international news media, will do nothing more "than titillate voyeurs and give radio talk-show hosts and television news channels something to talk about until the next news sensation arises. It certainly will not aid the cause of justice or increase government

After all, these photos are not revelatory. Previously released pictures in 2004 clearly documented the depravity of some American military personnel who took part in torturing detainees. Who can forget the horrific images of detainees stripped naked, hooded, stacked one on top of the other into human pyramids, and forced into sexual positions while smiling soldiers stood nearby.

As a result of the global outcry, 11 soldiers were tried and convicted, and others were reprimanded. According to a CNN/USA Today/Gallup poll, "Bush's overall performance rating sank to what was then the lowest of his presidency, 46 percent. The poll also showed support for the war at its lowest since before it began, with only 44 percent saying they believed it was worthwhile. It was a blow from which the administration, especially then-Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld, never fully recovered."

In the end, some good came of the release of that first set of photos--at least in terms of the nation engaging in an ongoing and much-needed national dialogue about the direction of the war, the Bush administration's stance on torture, and America's credibility in the eyes of the world. However, there is little good that can come from releasing the photos in question at this time. If the photos are as pornographic and offensive as those released in 2004, they could very well incite riots in Muslim countries and fuel intense anti-American sentiment.

Worst of all, they could place American military forces and civilians in greater jeopardy. For example, days after the Abu Ghraib photos were released, American contractor Nicholas Berg was beheaded, allegedly in retaliation for the prisoner abuses. The video footage of his execution was even posted on the Internet.

As Commander-in-Chief of the U.S. Armed Forces, one of President Obama's primary concerns must be for the safety of the troops. Unfortunately, the political firestorm which has erupted over the fate of the torture photos is obscuring this greater concern.

Releasing these torture photos will not shed any further light on the wrongs perpetrated. The cat, so to speak, is already out of the bag.

The real consideration should be the impact on the troops in the field. And with 20,000 American forces preparing to deploy to Afghanistan and the fighting season in full swing, as Pentagon spokesman

Geoff Morrell stated, "The timing is particularly bad." As it now stands, Obama has until June 9 to appeal the lower court's decision to the U.S. Supreme Court. If the high court agrees to hear the case, it could be next year before anything is decided.

In the meantime, as long as the appropriate oversight committees in Congress are aware of and have studied the photos, it's time that we focus on other pressing issues. These include protecting the troops, ending these wars, getting the economy back on track, and holding this president accountable to the rule of

# Texas shouldn't toll existing roads

Maintaining and improving transportation infrastructure in Texas has become nearly as daunting a proposition as driving through some of our state's most congested traffic spots at rush hour. Urban centers and communities across Texas have fast-growing populations, but face the challenge of crumbling and overstressed highways and consistent funding shortfalls.

Clearly, something's got to give, and it can't be the quality of our roads - or fairness to Texas taxpayers. As we work to meet our transportation needs, we must think broadly and avoid bandaid solutions that will ultimately exacerbate the problem.

Recently, there have been renewed calls for tolls on highways that have already been built and paid for with federal tax dollars. I believe taxing Americans twice for the same asset is fundamentally unfair, and I oppose any effort to place tolls on existing interstate

Double taxation is not the only concern. Overemphasis on tolling has serious implications for community safety and local infrastructure. Stud-

I was born in a small town in the Panhandle of Texas and am a Baby Boomer. I graduated from high school, served three years in the US Army, half my service in Vietnam. After being honorably discharged from the service, I returned home to Texas, earned a college degree, and have lived the American Dream. My family and I have much more than we probably deserve.

This article is not Democrat or Republican but rather my strong beliefs regarding the prospects of X and Y generations having the same opportunities that my wife and I have had in this great nation. There is a large segment of the American public that has bought into the fact that the government owes them something for nothing. This notion and attitude is going to destroy your ability to save money and educate your children. Actually, this is why I am writing this editorial in hopes I can reach our young families in Texas that have the ability to put all of this into perspective. If you care about your family's future, please continue to read because I am going to explain what is happening in terms anyone can understand. This information is public knowledge and can be verified.

Reality check! It takes 100 onedollar bills to make a stack one inch high. If you and your spouse work and earn \$60,000 per year, you have earned a stack of dollar bills 54 feet tall. After you pay your federal, state, and local taxes, 21 feet of your 54 feet of bills earned have vanished. This is before you pay your mortgage or buy a penny's worth of food or one item of clothing for your children.

The 2010 federal budget is a stack of dollar bills 586,204 miles high and would reach to the moon and back two and a half times or 23 times around the earth. Let that number soak in for just a

You must agree this has to be one of the most frightening things you have heard. The scary part is that each family is going to be taxed more to pay off this spending. The money the United States Congress has borrowed over the last few years is now totaling 12.1 trillion dollars. That is a stack of dollars that would stretch around the earth 83 times.

Our young families must realize the weight of this enormous debt is going to destroy this nation and everyone's children's and grandchildren's future. Every family's part of this 2010 budget is a stack of dollar bills 92 feet tall. Currently, 33 percent of all Americans pay zero federal taxes. If you work and play by the rules and pay your taxes, you and your children and grandchildren are the ones that will be paying off this enormous debt. If you and your spouse earn 54 feet of dollar bills and your part of the 2010 budget is 92 feet of dollar bills,

who pays the rest? Well, it is going on a credit card in your name, and the 71 feet of dollar bills you owe will grow with interest each year. I will let you in on a dirty little secret. For all of you that do not know, the President of the United States does not have the authority to spend one dollar that the Congress does not provide. All spending starts in the United States House of Representatives not in the White House.

If someone was harming your family in another way, you would not hesitate one second to take action. This crisis is much more serious than anything most of you have ever faced.







# NOTICE OF SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY'S APPLICATION FOR AUTHORITY TO REVISE FIXED FUEL FACTORS


On May 4, 2009, Southwestern Electric Power Company ("SWEPCO" or the "Company"), a subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc. ("AEP"), petitioned the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") to revise its fixed fuel factors under Texas Utilities Code § 36.203 and Commission Substantive Rule 25.236. If the Commission approves this petition, all of SWEPCO's Texas retail customers who pay fixed fuel factors will be affected. This petition affects only the fuel portion of the rates that SWEPCO charges for electricity in Texas and will not affect SWEPCO's nonfuel base rates.

SWEPCO is requesting a fuel factor revision to recover its estimated fuel and purchased power costs beginning no later than the August 2009 billing month, which starts on July 29, 2009. SWEPCO calculates its proposed fixed fuel factors (using a projected rate year of August 2009 through July, 2010) differentiated by voltage level, per kilowatt-hour (kWh) as follows:

If the proposed fuel factor revisions are approved, a residential customer using 1000 kWh per month will see an average monthly decrease of \$0.57 or 0.77% on their total electric bill. The effect of the revised fuel factors on other customers' bills will vary depending on the rate schedules under which they take service. The utility's collection of revenues as a result of these changes will be subject to final review by the Commission in the electric utility's next reconciliation.

The Commission has assigned Docket No. 36966 to this proceeding. 

Demand for Flu Treatment Drugs Very High The outbreak of Swine Flu (Type A H1N1 influenza) that recently developed in Mexico and the United States, surprisingly came near the end of the typical flu season in North America, and was therefore largely unexpected. It produced demands for and shortages of approved antiviral influenza drugs. Media reports earlier this month indicated that there were more prescriptions written for oseltamavir (Tamiflu) and zanamivir (Relenza) than pharmacists could fill. In certain areas of New York and California, the demand was up to more than 10 times what it normally is for this time of the year. These two antiviral drugs were approved by the FDA for the treatment of the flu, along with guidelines provided by the US Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

Antiviral drugs are reported to benefit those who get the flu by relieving symptoms, reducing the length of time a person is ill by one or more days, and reducing the potential for serious complications such as pneumonia. These drugs are also often prescribed for family members or other close contacts of persons who get a confirmed case of the flu.

# Notice of Application Requesting an Adjustment to Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor and Related Relief

On May 1, 2009, Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to approve an adjustment to SWEPCO's Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor (EECRF). Section 39.905 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act and Section 25.181 of the Commission's Substantive Rules provide for the Commission to authorize a utility to implement an EECRF and annually adjust it to ensure the timely and reasonable recovery of the utility's costs incurred in connection with satisfying energy efficiency goals established by the Texas Legislature. In July 2008, the Commission authorized SWEPCO to place into effect during 2009 an EECRF designed to recover approximately \$3.7 million in energy efficiency costs, based on SWEPCO's projected energy efficiency costs to meet its energy efficiency objectives for 2009.

SWEPCO's May 2009 filing asks the Commission to adjust the EECRF for 2010 to increase it by approximately \$3.2 million. The adjusted EECRF is requested to recover approximately \$7 million in energy efficiency costs in 2010, consisting of: (1) approximately \$4.4 million in projected energy efficiency costs for SWEPCO to meet its energy efficiency objectives for 2010; (2) a deficiency amount of approximately \$2.2 million in energy efficiency costs which SWEPCO incurred during 2008; and (3) a performance bonus of approximately \$0.4 million for SWEPCO's having exceeded its demand reduction goals for 2008.
