ADC TOTALS DROP - Development of a corps of intensively a 17-per-cent drop in aid to dependent children payments, says the State Welfare Department.

In the past fiscal year the number of families receiving ADC declined from 13,147 to 19,662 for a savng of \$3,103,614. The Department said specialization enabled case workers to help some their problems.

The Department report also showed a decline in the number eceiving old age assistance from 5.38 per cent of the population over 65 to 5.29 per cent. Average monthly check for year was \$52.89.






