Felony fugitive warrants have been issued by Donley Dounty Justice of the Peace Carroll Lewis for two men wanted in the burglary of the James Gillispie home about a month ago.

### **Memorial Day Weekend Quiet, Only Two Accidents Reported**

At least 31 people either visiting Donley County or travelling through the county during the three-day holiday weekend are a little sadder but wiser this week.

### Two Clarendon Teachers Mark Retirement Sunday

Sunday will mark the she was service, were the official retirement date of two Clarendon elementary school teachers who, combining their total years in the school system, account for more than 44 years of teaching in Clarendon.

Retiring as of that date will be Wilma K. Batson and Mildred P. Hendrix, who for many years, have occupied teaching desks only a few feet apart in the school here.

Mrs. Batson began her teaching career in 1930 at the age of 18 when she began teaching youngsters at the old Ashtola School when it was a two-room school with only a handful of pupils. For the past 17 years, she has taught in the Clarendon system

Mrs. Hendrix began her teaching carrer in 1934, serving the schools in Hall County (Bethel, Brice and Leslie) for 10 years before moving to Donley County to teach a total 29 years. Her tunure with the Clarendon Schools began 27 years ago, and has consisted of instructing the first and third grades all of those years.

Mrs. Batson has been a life-long resident of Donley County, and lived in Lelia Lake all of her life until moving to Clarendon following her husband's death in 1964. She was the daughter of the Mr. and Mrs. H.R.

one and two room variety, including Ashtola, Windy Valley (just a few miles south of Lelia Lake) and the early Clarendon School.

She has many fond memories of the children that have passed through her classes, including one youngster that expressed sincere wishes that "he wished she was smart enough to go on to the third grade with us". Like most people, Mrs.

Batson remembers the pleasant happenings more vividly than anything else, but she can also remember the days when teachers made only \$70 a month and considered themselves lucky.

For many years, she said, teachers were required to see that kindling and coal were brought into the classroom at the end of each day, ready for use the following morning. When the oil burning heaters were acquired in the schools where she taught, it was a day to remember, she says.

"All in all, it has been a joy to teach the hundreds of young children that have been in my classes down through the years," she said. "It brings a lot of fond memories to know what you've done for children in your career.'

Mrs. Batson began her teaching work when a teaching certificate could be obtained after only one year of college study. She obtained her elementary teachers certificate after attending Clarendon College for one year and began teaching when she was only 18 years of age.

However, additional education was necessary to continue in her life-long career, and she obtained her BS Degree in 1949 from West Texas State College in Canyon. She also earned a Masters Degree in elementary education from the same college in 1959.

Following her retirement, Mrs. Batson plans to relax a lot, travel occasionally to visit friends and relatives and persue her hobbies of painting and sewing in her spare time.

The first years of Mrs. Hendrix's career was marred by an unfortunate memory. While teaching the first year at the Bethel School in Hall County, the school building burned competely to the ground during the last month of school.

Although the county school superintendent was willing to allow the students and teachers a long vacation and do away with the last month of school that year, the teachers set up shop in one of the houses furnished teachers at that time. borrowed desks and books and continued teaching until

moving on to Chamberlain where she taught for one year and then to Martin School for two more years. Then, she assumed teaching duties at the Clarendon School which was located in the present city hall building. She has been with the local

The only true constant is change. This universal cliche may take on some special economic meaning for the cattle industry. Some of the top ageducators and officials of the beef business are now saying cattle feeding on a commercial scale may be permanently changed. Reason for the change is as simple as up and down. Rising input costs (especially grain) and lower market prices make it quite often an unacceptable business risk to feed cattle on grain rations for the conventional 120 to 180 days in a commercial feedlot. Advocates of a 60 or 90 day feeding program are becoming more popular. Some proponents of the change are backing a current study to revamp the quality grading systems now used for beef classification. In essence the proposed overhaul would reduce the relative standard of palatability (taste) in favor of an absolute test of tenderness.





Bereavement and loss are always with us. Ever since Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit people have been losing loved ones and friends. David wept at the death of this best friend. Jonathan. Jesus Wept at the tomb of Larazus. It is human nature to feel a deep sense of loss when we lose loved ones

All of us realize that human words are not sufficient when we experience such loss. Friends, kind words, and love given all help; but they do not ease the great hurt and sense of loss.

Only God can help when we are bereaved. The Bible tells us: "If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small" (Prov. 24:10). Most of us say, "Amen!" to this. God is not chiding is, but just reminding us that our strength is small. Job asked God to remember that he was but dust. Jonah spoke of his soul fainting within him (Jon 27). Each of us have to confess our smallness and dependence upon God when it comes our time to lay a loved one or friend to rest. Yes, our strength is small. yes, we do faint and grow weary

The prophet of God reminds us that our Creator "fainteth not, neither is weary" (Is 40:28). When our heart is faint, we are encouraged to trust in God. He is the same today, yesterday, and forever. He never changes. The multitudes turned from following Jesus one day and He said to his disciples: "Will ye also go away?" The Apostle Peter spoke an eternal truth when he replied: "To whom shall we go Lord, Thou hast the words of eternal life." To whom can you go but

When we face great loss, we are encouraged to bring our burdens to the Lord. The Bible says, "And the Lord, He it is that doth go before thee; He will be with thee, He will not fail thee, neither forsake thee; fear not, neither by dismayed" (Deut. 31:8).

The Psalmist discussed the loss of father and mother. What person, whether as a child or adult, who has not felt a quaking within at the thought of losingmom anddad. Yet, the writer of Psalm 27 said, "When my father and mother forsake me, then the Lord will take me up" (Ps. 27:10).

We miss the comfort of God because we fail to turn to His Word, the Bible. When our soul faints within, the Bible encourages us. Said one: "This is my comfort in my affliction: for Thy Word hath quickened my (refreshed me, caused me to get up and live). another said, "Unless Thy law had been my delight, I should then have perished in mine affliction."

Nobody's Perfect But.

Although the pageant is not expected to actually bring a lot of money into town like the Miss America Pageant would, we consider it an honor for Clarendon to be the host city for this

Perhaps the people who come to Clarendon this weekend will be a bit disappointed with the size town we have here, but we're sure that most will enjoy the wide-open spaces that surround this community and the beautiful scenery that is typical of the Panhandle.

Moreover, we're sure that many of these folks will agree with us that it will be a pleasant change from driving the crowded freeways and expressways of the larger cities in Texas to get somewhere.

After all, about the only traffic jam in town is usually in fron After all, about the only traffic jam in town is usually in front of the post office about 9:30 each morning. What could

Speaking of traffic jams, if you happened to be one of the thousands who visited Greenbelt Lake during the holiday weekend, you found true togetherness. Many late arrivals were forced to camp far from the water's edge, creating one of the largest congestion areas this country has seen since Labor Day weekend last year.

Just by watching the traffic flow into town from the east and west, it appeared Greenbelt received more than its share of patronization from far and wide over the weekend. Out of curosity, we visited the lake late Saturday night with

friends and found the entire north and east sides of the lake a mass of reflectors in our headlights. Many families were still fishing at a late hour, taking advantage of the few boats still on the lake at that time of day.

Perhaps the amazing part of it all, is the fact that Greenbelt Lake has had only three deaths in its history. Even one of those did not involve drowning. This low death toll has made the lake perhaps one of the safest in the State of Texas.

While researching other news stories around the court house this week, we checked with Peace Justice Carroll Lewis, who also acts as coroner for Donley County, and found that only two persons have been victims of drowning since the lake was completed several years ago.

The first recorded death in the waters of Greenbelt was on August 11, 1968, when Joseph Shadle drowned after a boat occupied by he and his father overturned. Kevin Mooney of Amarillo was the second victim, being one of the occupants of a small boat which sank on June 30, 1974.

The third death related to Greenbelt Lake was on July 17, 1972, when a cave being dug by several youngsters collapsed and killed Richard Pearson.

Perhaps much of the safety record for the lake should be credited to the lake patrolmen and Texas Game and Wildlife officers who keep a vigil around the shores of Greenbelt Lake. Many people who receive citations for violations while operating boats around the lake don't like to pay the fines involved, but by the same token, have violated laws designed

This weekend was no different, since at least four people were ticketed by game officers for not having enough life jackets in the boat to take care of all passengers. This is an open invitation for disaster since it is not unusual for high winds to strike lakes in this area with little warning.

One other thing we would like to point out is the fact that although state game officers cannot issue citations for occupants of a boat not wearing life jackets, the lake patrolmen who are employees of Greenbelt Water Authority

This comes as a surprise to some people. Although the lake patrolmen generally warn the occupants of a boat to wear the protective gear before issuing any tickets, a few people find themselves in JP court dishing out money for unnecessary

Several weeks ago, we had an article in this space relating to a clean-up campaign in Clarendon in preparation for the visitors that will be received here this weekend. The article was a little difficult to write since our building was one of the real buggers and needed a lot of work done cutting weeds and picking up trash and junk around the rear.

We would like to point out that this has been done, even though it wasn't an easy task. It's a lot like our Christmas shopping intentions every year. We intend to start early, but somehow it is never finished until the last moment.

In an ad on the classified page of today's paper, there is a notice that the Clarendon Press will be closed Friday. We will be closing for a three-day weekend mainly because it was necessary for our employees to work Monday while others were enjoying a long Memorial Day weekend.

We are asking that any business that needs to be conducted prior to next Monday be done before closing time Thursday so it won't be necessary for our employees to come into the office

off and on throughout the weekend. We've found that the Monday holidays were definitely not designed for weekly newspaper people when that were enacted by Congress. There is simply to much to do on Monday around our offices to even think of taking the day off.

After working all day last Tuesday and all through the night, until about 8 a.m. Wednesday, we thought we could take a few hours of sack time at home without being disturbed. However, things around our house don't operate

No more had we crawled between the sheets when the telephone began ringing with what we considered unnecessary calls. To remedy the situation, we took the phone off the hook and went back to bed.

A couple of hours later, we heard a beeper tone which General Telephone uses to warn customers that their telephone is not in service. To us, it sounded like a lullaby and we drifted back to sleep.

About three that afternoon we found that the telephone

company had disconnected our home phone because we wouldn't hang the receiver up. After calling the Memphis office and explaining why the receiver was left off the hook, M.L. Van Arsdel, an old friend, patiently explained to us that seven phones left off the hook could disable 100 telephones. The telephone people

were very courteous and reconnected the telephone only a few We appreciated their situation, and they ours. But just to make sure we could sleep in peace next time, the telephone system at our house has been altered by the telephone company. If you ever call and can't get an answer, it's because we've turned the bell down so low we have to sit on top of the telephone to hear it.






