





Caperiment Crops.

In a brief but interesting interview with O. H. Leidigh, special agent in charge of the U.S. Agricultural Station here, we learn that he has planted as follows:

Eleven kinds of winter oats, 3 acres; twelve kinds of winter barley, 4 1-2 acres; eighty-one kinds of wheat, 28 acres; the oats are from France; barley mostly from Africa aud China; wheat from Russia, Central Asia, China, India, Arabia, Africa, Spain and Italy.
Owing to the delay Mr. Leidigh Arabia, Africa, Spain and Italy. experienced in locating the station at Amarillo the planting is about two months late, but it is greatly hoped that the most hardy varieties will make a good showing anyway. 





Experiment Crops.

In a brief but interesting interview with O. H. Leidigh, special agent in charge of the U.S. Agricultural Station here, we learn that he has planted as follows:

Eleven kinds of winter oats, 3 acres; twelve kinds of winter barley, 4 1-2 acres; eighty-one kinds of wheat, 28 acres; the oats are from France; barley mostly from Africa and China; wheat from Russia, Central Asia, China, India, Arabia, Africa, Spain and Italy Owing to the delay Mr. Leidigh ROCK experienced in locating the station at Amarillo the planting is about two months late, but it is greatly hoped that the most hardy varieties will make a good showing anyway. On his return from Washington in the Spring Mr. Leidigh will plant fifteen acres more. Having finished his duties here, he left for his home last Tuesday. 
