Clarendon team All-State, chosen to participate in three All-Star games, and signed a full basketball scholarship to play for Frank Phillips Junior College. Clarendon H.S. boys basketball team won district and bi-district championships. Clemmy Smith was named Golden Spread Freshman of the Year in basketball by the Amarillo Daily News. Clarendon Elementary opened a new elementary library. Clarendon CISD added a Junior High Principals position and incorporated Site-Based Decision Making into the budget process. Clarendon CISD and Clarendon Junior College cooperated in providing dual credit for Advanced English 4 students. Clarendon CISD served as District 2-AA UIL district director and hosted the Elementary UIL contest.

Clarendon CISD hosted the District 6-A tennis tournament. Clarendon Elementary initiates a new Head Start Program for four year olds. Mike Work, Clarendon Elementary Principal, was voted Outstanding
Elementary Principal for Region XVI from Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association. ClarenElementary Principal for Region XVI from Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association. Claren Clarendon CISD was awarded a $\$ 11,500$ grant from the TEA for a T-STAR educational satellite system.
