Guss Johnson, county treasurer, was down from Clarendon Sunday visiting.

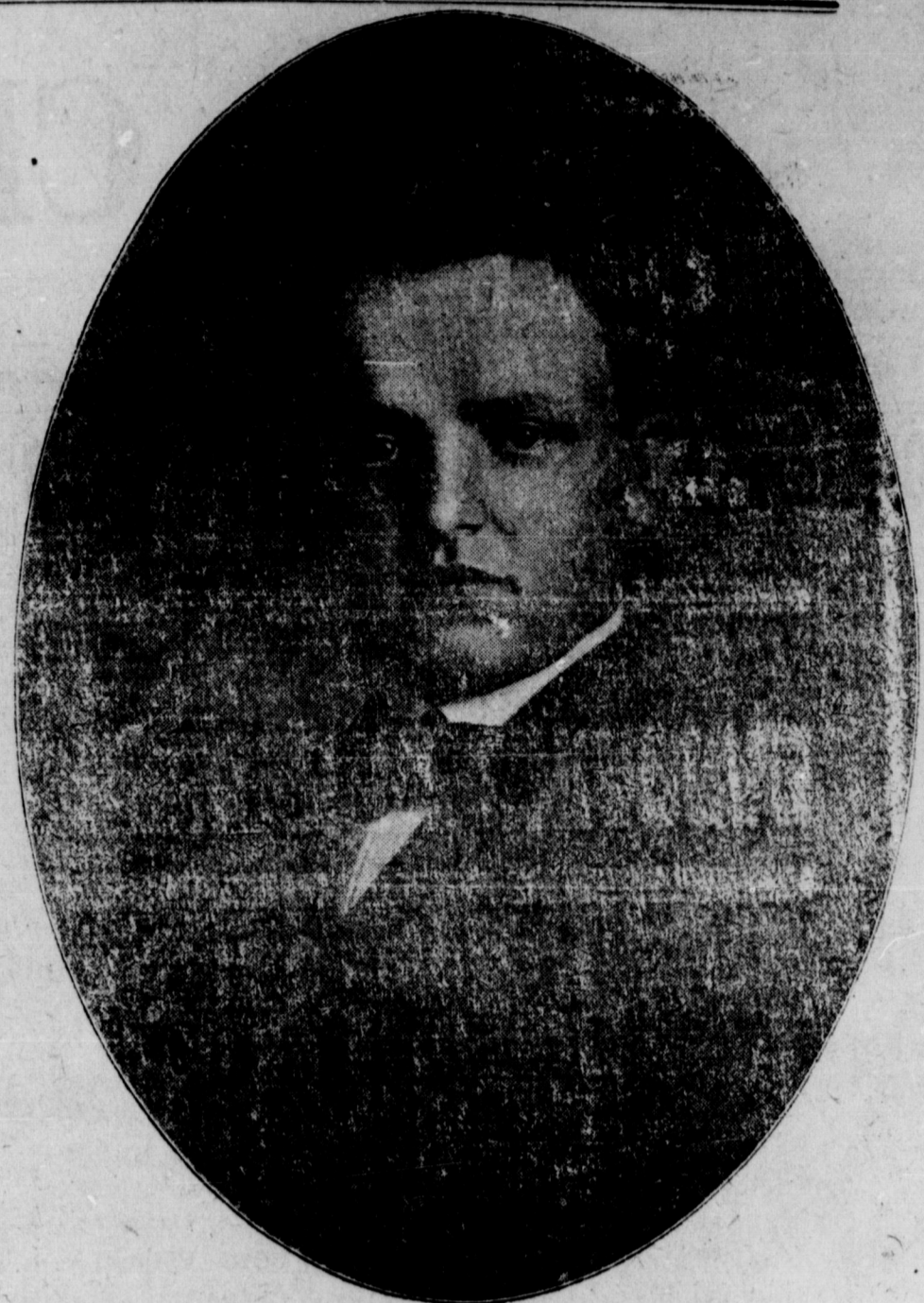
Thos. Willis came down from Clarendon Sunday to spend the day with his son, E. H., and family.

Hereford, Tex., July 8—Dr. W. J. Rogers died here Saturday afternoon. His remains were shipped to Pilot Point, Texas, Sunday for burial. Funeral services were conducted by the Masons of his late residence.

Dr. Rogers was about the oldest practicing physician in the Panhandle. He came to Hereford about nine years ago and has resided here since that time. He was 68 years old at the time of his death.
