## Why is a Donley County jail bond needed? <br> Wellington has advised that because of

"All we need is three cells and a drunk 'ank", is a much quoted phrase as discussion about the jail bond continues. According to Bob Frisby, who worked to compile the preliminary jail facilities eport this is not far off. The new jail plan calls for one more cell than the old one and has a drunk tank (detoxification chamber). The real difference is in the requirements demanded by the state of Texas, before a jail can be opened for operation.

County officials not present at the meetings held in regard to the jail report do not know what the requirements ane. Frisby said last week in a call from San Antonio.
The only records available for the study to determine the requirements of the Donley County jail were prisoner feeding" records dating from January 1, gaps in time amounting to $32 \%$ of the time period Information was obtained from law enforcement officials, and a past Donley County sheriff.
This information was used to determine the size and requirements for the present ail plan. The plan is minimal for the requirements and was designed so that if
there is future need to enlarge it, it can be done with the least loss of present structure for the greatest economy possible.
Donley County is debt free, the only exception being $\$ 15,198.75$ due on road machinery. This amount is to be paid for out of county precincts allotments
An expenditure of about $\$ 46,000$ has been attributed to the jail for an architect. The expenditures have been $\$ 9,000$ for the feasibility study which was required. The study was made before any work could be done on either the old jail (which was slosed by the state officials for failure to meet standards) or plans for a new one. $\$ 13,000$ was paid for a state qualified architect for the courthouse. This was a matching funds arrangement with a grant of $\$ 6,500$ coming to the county. Thus the county was out only $\$ 6,500$ for architects fees of the $\$ 13,000$. The cost of the architect for the jail was $\$ 19,950.00$. The state requires that plans be submitted, in detail, for approval by representatives from the Texas Jail Standards Commis-
Donley County will have no jail if Texas Jail Standards are not met. Three
adjoining counties are without jails now Armstrong County jail was closed for failure to comply with standards, Hall County has no operating county jail (Memphis has one cell which operates as a city jail facility) and Donley County has no ail. Hall County has recently passed a jail bond for approximately $\$ 340,000$ to tak care of their needs. Donley County has on hand from Revenue Sharing Funds $\$ 160,000$ to apply to the cost of a jail. This money to apply to the cost on jail. This bank until it could be applied to capital improvements with the county jail as priority. With this amount ( $\$ 100,000$ ) the priority. With wis amount (\$180,000) the ail bond of $\$ 180,000$ has been authorized the size of the Hall County bond If the jall the size of he lall County bond. If the jal bond should fail and the Revenue Sharing Funds used for other capital improve ments, either there would be no jail in the future or the cost would be far greater that it is at present.
Inflation at the annual rate of $18 \%$ would raise the cost appreciably in addition to complete funding by bonds for a jail.

Just this week Donley's access to out of town jails appears to be ending
recent Supreme Court rulings and the potential threat of lawsuits for liability County and, cell space for Donley County and other counties may be cancelled. Other counties are expected to be forced to follow sulte because of the exhorbitant cost of this type of liability insurance

Jail and courthouse bonds are not set at a certain tax rate and added to taxes. Their rates are established through the increase in ad-valorem valuation to make the payments. With the present valuation there should be about 16\% increase or about $\$ 5.00$ per person in Donley County for a 10 year period to repay bonds. If Revenue Sharing Funds are renewed and funds from this source applied to the bonds, the cost will be much less.

Law and order need a jail to be enforced. There is nothing like the sure knowledge that violations of the law will be dealt with swiftly, surely and justly to slow down the incidence of such behavior. Donley County has always had a name for desiring enforcement of the law. The chance to prove or disprove this will come on August 26,1980 when the $\$ 180,000$ bond election is held.
