But the reverse has been true and today the hotel business is one of the best revenue producers in the nation now they are as safe as they ever are without escort and
have no feeling of dread in that connection. The hotel business has been lifted to a high level and the attitude of the men who direct its efficiency is worthy of study. Over

industry has long been a topic of much importance among hotel men, especially those who got their start in the 'good
