Washington, D. C, Aug. 14, 1899.—Fair tonight and tomorrow.

The jury in the case of Cranfil against Hayden, charged with criminal libel, at Dallas, returned a verdict of "not guilty."

Galveston, Texas, Aug. 10.—W.D. Cleveland & Co. of Houston, one of the largest and oldest wholesale grocery and cotton factorage houses in Texas, went into voluntary bankruptcy Wednesday evening. The petition was filed with Deputy Clerk Burnett of the United States court at 9 o'clock at

night, and was given out at the office of the clerk this morning. the total liabilities aggregate \$441,987 and the assets are given at \$753,199.

Dr B H Carroll was in the city Sunday in the interest of the Texas Baptist Educational Commission. This commission is charged with the duty of equipping and endowing all the Baptist schools of the state which belong to the Baptist General Convention. There are five of these schools which make a system, with Baylor University of Waco, as the head. That is, one university, one female college and three academies. The convention appoints all members of the several boards, and so each school is directly responsible to the convention. The female college sends its graduates to the university for all post graduate degrees. The academies cannot carry classes above the sophomore year, but send their students to the university for junior and senior years. Dr Carroll reports \$85,000 raised to date for these schools, and confidently expects to reach \$100,000 by Nov 10, when the general convention meets in Dallas. He goes from this place to Plainview where, on Wednesday next, he addresses the Confederate Veteran's Association.
