The boys from Brown county who are attending A. & M. College under the group plan were highly commended in a letter received by County Agent C. W. Lehmberg from Daniel Russell, head of the department of Rural Sociology at A. & M., this week.

The Brown county group, headed by Mrs. W. C. Sturdivant, includes Fritz Sturdivant, Bill Newby, Bob Ehrke, John Wood, Kenneth Bingham, all of Brownwood, and A. C. Dameron of Balket. Under the group plan a group of boys with a chaperone live in one house and share all expenses equally, the college paying part of the expense and the boys the rest.

58 Adults Enrolled In Educational Work

A total of 58 students are enrolled in the three emergency education projects for adults now under way in Brownwood. Two of the projects are being conducted at the Mexican school with Mrs. Bourland and Pearl Daves conducting classes in cooking, sewing and English. Classes in typing, music and English are being taught by Hattie Oliver at Melwood Avenue Baptist church.

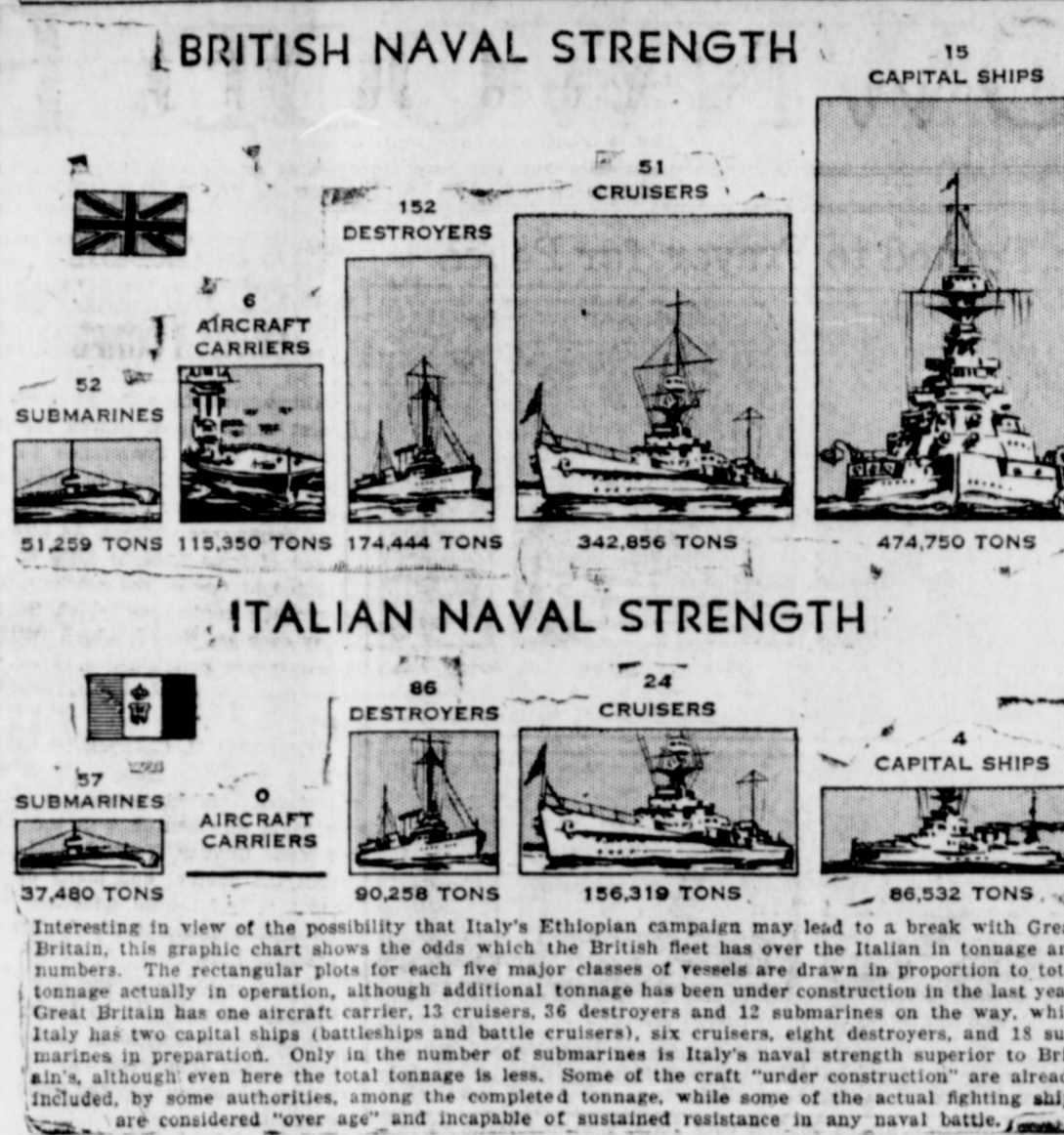
MAINTENANCE MEN OF SANTA FE MEET HERE

Comparing Strength of British and Italian Fleets



Interesting in view of the possibility that Italy's Ethiopian campaign may lead to a break with Great Britain, this graphic chart shows the odds which the British fleet has over the Italian in tonnage and numbers. The rectangular plots for each five major classes of vessels are drawn in proportion to total tonnage actually in operation, although additional tonnage has been under construction in the last year. Great Britain has one aircraft carrier, 13 cruisers, 56 destroyers and 12 submarines on the way, while Italy has two capital ships (battleships and battle cruisers), six cruisers, eight destroyers, and 15 submarines in preparation. Only in the number of submarines is Italy's naval strength superior to Britain's, although even here the total tonnage is less. Some of the craft 'under construction' are already included, by some authorities, among the completed tonnage, while some of the actual fighting ships are considered 'over age' and incapable of sustained resistance in any naval battle.

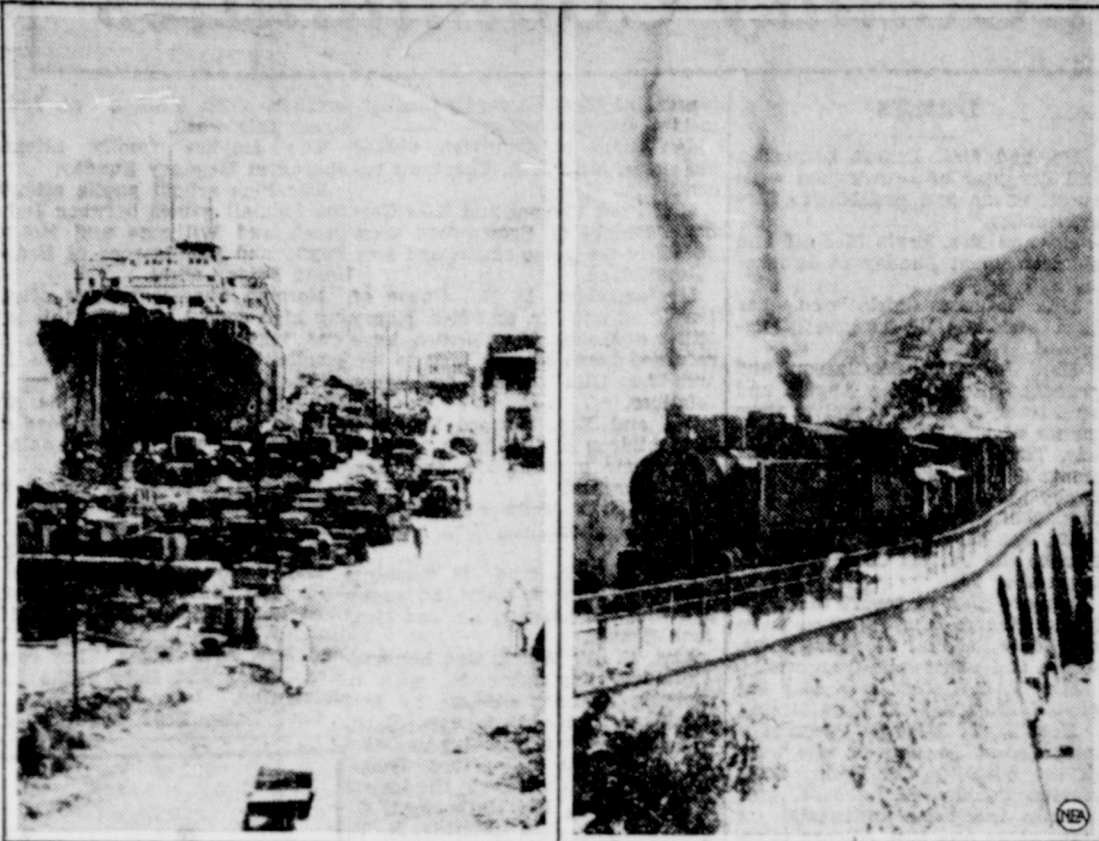
