LOCAL COMPANY TO UNDERGO INSPECTION SAT.

COL. CULBERSON AND OTHER PROMINENT OFFICIALS TO BE PRESENT. WILL BE LAST INSPECTION UNTIL SUMMER TRAINING IN AUGUST.

The local company of the Home Guard will undergo inspection here Saturday, and the full equipment will be gone over. Col. W. L. Culberston, of Wichita Falls, will be in charge, and other prominent officials, among them Capt. Hankins, of Quanah, will assist. The opera house as barracks and equipment will be inspected in the afternoon at three thirty o'clock, while the men in ranks will undergo inspection at seven-thirty.

This will be the final inspection until the summer encampment at Austin in August and standing a good inspection will mean much to the company. Officers in charge of the company announce that every fellow must be present with his full equipment.

At present there are seventy-four men enlisted in the organization, and Capt. Nat Perrine, of Healey, is in charge; George Taylor, of this city, is first lieutenant and Byron Blevins second lieutenant.

TEXAS EXES ENJOY BIG BANQUET HERE THURSDAY

EX-STUDENTS OF STATE UNIVERSITY FROM FOUR COUNTIES MEET HERE ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF TEXAS INDEPENDENCE.

The Texas Exes from Childress, Collingsworth, Donley and Hall counties met here Thursday evening and enjoyed a banquet that was a complete success. Some sixty-four guests gathered about the table, and once more the happy memories of the University were related in humorous manner and the old songs and yells sung and given. Dr. H. L. Wilder, of this city, was toast master his humor was determining of the character of the evening's entertainment. As well as the lighter part of the entertainment, the members were reminded that they owed a duty to their alma mater and that it is to do all in their power to hasten the day when the University shall be taken out of politics so that it may have finances to do its work unhampered by legislative action. Music for the occasion was furnished by the Clarendon Orchestra.

Following the invocation which was given by Mrs. J. E. Nelson, Dr. Wilder made several humorous introductory remarks and the ex-students gave the "Hullabaloo" yell. Dr. Odum gave interesting sketches of the life of a pre-medical student. Hon. Sam J. Hamilton, the next speaker related various incidents in the life of a law student; while Loyd Stallings told of the ups and downs of an engineer. Supt. J. E. Nelson was the next speaker, and he gave interesting experiences that occur in the life of the "Pedogogy" while in the University. Mrs. A. T. Cole then told of the impressions of a parent about the University; she related how she was impressed during a visit to the University last fall with the greatness of the institution and declared that she was ready to work for the day when the shacks shall be removed from the campus, and there shall be many more fine buildings there instead. Ralph Kerbow and Hardy Benson, who were among the guests of the occasion, having been formerly students of the A. & M. College, told some of their experiences in that school. Supt. D. R. Hibbett, the next speaker, related some of the experiences of a freshman in the University going to show the short time which it takes him to learn how little he knows.

The honor students of the High School and of Clarendon College were guests of the occasion, and they responded with peppy speeches giving the reasons why they hope to go to the University of Texas.

Prominent speakers, among whom was W. A. Johnson, of Memphis, former lieutenant governor of this state, then spoke of how State University is valued by the citizens of Texas. Senator Johnson said that there was no doubt about the University of Texas being "the capstone of Texas education;" he related statistics that are well known to those who have been watching the progress of the University, in that there are more Methodist Students in the University of Texas than there are in S. M. U.; there are more Baptist students there than in the Baylor University; there are more Presbyterian students there than there are in Trinity University. The senator prophesied that the day is not far ahead when the great University will be taken out of politics and will then have sufficient income to make it a still greater school.

One of the most delightful numbers of the entire program was a violin solo by Miss Beatrice Story, Zig Uernewisen by Sarasate; this wonderful composition gave Miss Story a great range of expression, varying from the beautiful melody with muted violin to that which required marvelous execution; through

LARGE ATTENDANCE AT TUESDAY'S LUNCH

COMMERCE BOARD UNANIMOUSLY AGREES ON CONTINUING THE TUESDAY LUNCHEONS AND NEW INTEREST IS MANIFEST.

After a unanimous agreement of the Board of Directors for the Chamber of Commerce that the Tuesday luncheons should be continued, more interest was manifested in Tuesday's feed by the largest attendance that has been enjoyed in several weeks. Several speakers were enthusiastic in their support of the Chamber of Commerce, and pledged that more would be done this year to make the work a greater success.

Following the meal, Secretary McCordell read several clippings from magazines bearing on the subject of keeping the town before the other parts of the state by advertising it. He also announced that he had written to Austin to find out about the possibilities of installing a radio-phone. These are being installed at other places, and in the event that one can be secured here, the daily market reports and like news will be received. When called upon Messrs. Tom Connolly and R. A. Long stated that they had nothing to say, but were very well pleased with the interest that had been manifested in the Chamber of Commerce.

Rev. J. T. Griswold was the next speaker. He stated that he had been residing here for almost four months, and that during this time he had especially noticed the continuity and solidity of the work of the Chamber of Commerce. He declared that he believed they were building the greatest possible foundation for the permanent growth of Clarendon; and that he knows of no town where conditions, considered from every standpoint, are better than in Clarendon.

Frank Houston, of Childress, then spoke on the possibilities of gas for Clarendon, declaring that he felt sure that this city would have gas within the next few months. He stated that recently he was at a meeting for the purpose of considering the feasibility of gas for this territory, and that at that time it was learned that some of the large companies are preparing to pipe gas from Amarillo to Ft. Worth, and gas can be secured at the various cities along the line without having to go to the expense of installing the system. This announcement on the part of Mr. Houston met with hearty applause.

R. F. Morris compared the secretary and other officials of the Chamber of Commerce to Moses when he stretched forth his hand and the children of Israel were so long victorious. At that time it became necessary for others to hold up his hands, and in the same way it will be necessary for everyone interested in the progress of Clarendon to uphold the hands of the officers of the Chamber of Commerce. Following this adjournment was taken until next Tuesday.

WATER SYSTEM BOND ELECTION TO BE APRIL 11

PROPERTY OWNERS TO VOTE WHETHER \$75,000 IN BONDS FOR ENLARGING CLARENDON'S WATER SYSTEM SHALL BE ISSUED.
April 11th has been set as the date for the election to determine whether \$75,000 worth of bonds shall be issued for the purpose of building an overhead tank and making material additions to the water system. The plans that will be followed should the bond election carry call for an overhead tank of one hundred and twenty thousand gallon capacity at a height of one hundred and forty feet, and water mains all over the city so that fire plugs will be within two blocks of each other.
The water main will be built east and west from one side of the city to the other, and from this laterals will extend north and south assuring fire protection to every residence. The system that is contemplated could care for a city of five thousand people. Later, should the bond election carry, it would be decided whether the tank would be erected on one of the hills or near the present station.

LOCAL TELEPHONE EXCHANGE PREPARING FOR IMPROVEMENTS MEANING SEVERAL THOUSAND DOLLARS

ALMOST FOUR MILES OF CABLE WILL BE PUT UP COMMENCING THE FIRST OF NEXT MONTH. THE PRESENT CABLES ARE FULL AND THE DEMAND FOR PHONES IS INCREASING. THE IMPROVEMENTS WILL CONTINUE THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER.

KHIVA SHRINE BAND TO APPEAR IN CONCERT HERE APRIL 6TH

Arrangements have been perfected whereby the Khiva Shrine Band of Amarillo and the Panhandle of Texas will appear here Thursday evening, April 6th in concert. The concert will be staged under the auspices of the Clarendon Shrine Club and the ladies of the Legion Auxiliary. The Pastime Theatre has been secured for the evening and it is expected that Shriners and their families as well as many others will come here from all the neighboring towns and communities. The band has forty members and will bring a few special or vaudeville acts as well. It is expected that Rev. Paul Merrill, pastor of the Christian Church at Pampa will appear in a series of black-face songs as he is a popular member of the Khiva band.

BAND BOYS ARE MAKING GOOD PROGRESS

Under the management of the T. L. Benedict, the Clarendon telephone system has been built up to be one of the best in the Panhandle and better service is not enjoyed anywhere than here.

CAPT. L. H. CARHART DIES IN CALIFORNIA

News has been received here of the death of Capt. L. H. Carhart who, it is stated, was the founder of Clarendon. Death came to Capt. Carhart in the Old Soldiers' home at Sannetre California on February 25th. His burial took place February 27th will all military honors. Capt. Carhart was eighty-eight years of age, and had resided in Los Angeles for twenty years. As well as being prominent in the founding of this city, Capt. Carhart was the first editor of the Clarendon News.

He is survived by his wife, Martha J. Carhart who resides at 3265 Eagle St., Los Angeles.

In the next ninety days our city will present a much more attractive appearance and the building campaign will be forced as more houses must be provided to take care of the home seekers who recognize Clarendon as the best "home" city in all Texas.

The cup will be awarded at the Denton meeting of the Texas Press Association and The Clarendon News expects to be in the contest. A few years back The News won the third prize for Texas papers and did it with less modern equipment than we now have. The parallel is obvious, and if the Chamber of Commerce had done nothing but keep the dailypress of the state full of briefs about the progress and doings of Clarendon and Donley County, it would have justified the expenditure of the entire budget and more.

We heard of a prominent lawyer the other day who vigorously denounced the Ku Klux Klan for what he termed the "un-American wearing of masks" when only a few days before he had attempted to capitalize the friendship of a certain man holding a public trust to the advantage of a client. American politics, American business and American society are honeycombed with men and women wearing masks hundreds of times more dangerous to the liberty and happiness of the people of these United States than masks made from a gunnysack. There's a difference.

"Our daughter," Miss Minnie Florea, was married, Feb. 20th in Detroit, Mich., to Mr. Carl Whittington. We are now first experiencing the wedding of a "daughter." Miss Minnie Florea is the beautiful and accomplished "daughter" of the Texas Press Association, and every editor in Texas, member of that organization, is having the happy painfulness of "losing" a "daughter." Minnie Florea lost her entire family in the Calveston flood, she, herself, being tossed for hours and for a distance of sixty miles clinging to

a floating door. Her father, J. C. Flores, was editor of the Richmond paper and as a tribute to him, as a protection to the girl, the Texas Press Association "adopted" her at a subsequent meeting. She is a lovely young woman and has the best wishes of more Texas writers than could be given to any other woman. The News wishes its "daughter" and new "son-in-law" a wonderful journey through the rose and thorn strewn pathway of life.

The News holds the same view about the Four-Power Pact that it did about the Versailles treaty in that we believe that any reservation that makes clear America's duties and American limitations should be discussed and if found worthy given a majority vote of congress, on patriotic grounds alone. Regardless of politics the American congress and the American people don't have to swallow whole just any treaty or pact that its representatives may contrive. That's why this is America—when we can't amend or pass reservations then we are no longer the land of the free and the home of the brave.

In some towns the business men are called on to donate two to five dollars per month to support a band. Then they are asked to pay a like amount for street lights. In addition to this they are expected to invest from five to ten dollars a month for their chamber of commerce budget. In Clarendon, through the sound financing of the directors of the chamber of commerce, these expenses are all borne by the monthly budget of the organization. Besides this a substantial sum is provided for the public health nurse every month, without which the county would now be minus the invaluable services of that helping hand of the Red Cross. In addition to this the Clarendon Chamber of Commerce, through its secretary and his loyal official board and many others, is functioning better than any other like organization in the Panhandle of Texas and our city is getting more and lasting benefits as the days pass by. Just another way of saying that when you hear a man say that the Clarendon Chamber of Commerce costs too much for what it is doing, or that it isn't worth anything to the town and community, that man is either not informed or else is wilfully misstating the facts in the case.

THE LEGACY OF WILLIAM PENN

WOODROW WILSON

To think of William Penn is to think of him as a sort of spiritual knight who went out upon his adventures to carry the torch that had been put into his hands, so that other men might have the path illuminated for them which led to justice, liberty, and peace; and it cannot be admitted that a man establishes his right to call himself a college or high school graduate by exhibiting his diploma. The only way he can prove it is by showing that his eyes are lifted to some horizon which other men less instructed than he have not been privileged to see. Unless he carry freight of the spirit, he has not been bred where spirits are bred. William Penn, presenting the sweet enterprise of the quiet and powerful sect that called themselves Friends, proved his right to the title by being the friend of mankind; and he crossed the ocean not merely to establish in America, but to set up a free commonwealth in America and to show that he was of the lineage of those who had been bred in the best traditions of the human spirit. We should not be interested in celebrating the memory of William Penn if his conquest had been merely a material one. Sometimes we have been laughed at by foreigners in particular for boasting about the size of the American continent, and they have naturally suggested that we did not make it. But there is much merit in the claim that every race and every man is as big as the thing he takes possession of, and that the size of America is in some sense a standard of the size and capacity of the American people. But the extent of the American conquest is not what gives America distinction in the annals of the world. It is professed purpose of the Quaker, which was to see to it that every foot of the land should be the home of the free, self-governed people, who should have no government whatever which did not rest upon the consent of the governed. And the spirit of Penn will not be stayed. You cannot set limits to such adventures. After their own days are gone, their spirits, stalk the world, carrying inspiration everywhere they go, and reminding men of the fine lineage of those who have sought justice and the right.

Like sand on a bearing, worry cuts away the life elements of the individual, while irritation follows and friends decline, and business slips from us in proportion, as the metal ground from the bearing. To eliminate worry through proper attitudes of mind is like pouring oil upon a heavily laden bearing.

In the days now long gone, one accredited with a super-wisdom said: "A soft answer turneth away wrath," and his claim to wisdom has been strengthened, rather than diminished as the years have flown by. The following taken from a recent issue of the "Railwayman" published in Kansas City and edited by E. B. Sanders, Jr., son of E. B. Sanders of Amarillo, is in point:

"An eminent jurist once remarked that eight cases out of ten coming into his court for adjudication could very easily, and much more satisfactorily, have been handled outside of court if the opposing parties would only have made the right efforts to effect a settlement.

"That some statement can readily be applied to almost every argument and question arising between individuals. Every time we feel an argument coming on we think of the old saying 'Never stop to argue, just let trouble amble by,' and as a result we have few arguments.

"We bring this matter to your attention because the thought came to us the other day in a very impressive manner. A passenger boarded a Rockhill car at Twelfth Street and handed the conductor a transfer which was not only about six hours too old for use but punched on a Broadway-Union Station car.

"The conductor looked at the transfer and very politely explained to the passenger that he couldn't accept it. Assuming an air of dignity and self-importance the patron proceeded to 'call' the conductor in terms unbecoming a gentleman. Here was a big chance for an argument. Other passengers on the rear platform (the car was crowded) craned their necks to see the 'fight,' but there was none.

"I'm sorry you feel that way about it, and I, being a gentleman, won't argue the matter with you," explained the conductor. "In your business, whatever it is, you probably have certain rules to follow. Or-if you are the boss you expect your employees to carry out your orders. Isn't that right? In this business we also have certain rules to follow. I am only carrying out instructions when I refused your transfer, which is not acceptable at this point or at this hour. No doubt you do not understand our transfer rules or I am sure you wouldn't have passed this one off on me. We are all liable to be mistaken at times. I often make mistakes myself. You see my viewpoint now, don't you."

"We felt like reaching over and throwing our arms around that conductor. Here was a real fellow—a big asset to the company.

"The passenger paid his fare and said nothing at the time. But when he left at Thirty-first Street he passed by the conductor and remarked: "Thanks for the transfer information old man. You treated me white and you're a gentleman. I won't forget you."

"And he didn't forget. He wrote the company that very night, explaining the circumstances and highly commended that conductor for his

extreme courtesy to passengers.' "We asked the conductor before we left the car if he had many experiences like that one.

"I have several every day," he replied. "Some are ever transfers, others over the amount of fare dropped in the box and many others of a trivial nature."

"Don't you ever lose your temper at times?" we inquired, wondering at the coolness this conductor had just displayed.

"I found out long ago that it doesn't pay to lose my temper. The company didn't hire me for that purpose. A little courtesy on my part always settles all arguments and it leaves a good taste in my mouth. It surely is the only way to make friends and I have a host of them on this line. Why, last Christmas I'll bet I received a hundred cigars from my customers—I call them customers. It wasn't me personally that they especially liked but they enjoyed the 'brand' of service I always try to give them."

"And we have been thinking about this incident ever since. That's why we want to tell everyone else about it."

"There are too many arguments between our employees and patrons; only ten a year is ten too many. Arguments lead to bitter feelings on the part of both parties concerned. We are after the friendship of every patron and arguments don't promote friendship.

"Let's use a little tact a certain amount of diplomacy in dealing with our customers. If we are in the wrong then let's don't waste any time in getting over on the right side.

"Let's promote a company of good fellowship and sell stock to ourselves and all our patrons. It's a paying investment and the easiest thing in the world to sell if we but make the effort.

"And above all else let us follow the example of the conductor who have mentioned—and just let trouble amble by."—Amarillo News.

ELECTION ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Clarendon deems it advisable to issue bonds of the said City, for the purpose hereinafter mentioned:

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLARENDON, TEXAS, that an election be held on the 11th day of April, 1922, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted:

"Shall the City Commission of the City of Clarendon, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City of Clarendon, in the sum of seventy-five thousand (\$75,000.00) Dollars, payable serially, ten to forty years from the date thereof, with the option of redemption at any time after ten years from their date, bearing interest at the rate of six percent per annum, the interest payable semi-annually, and to levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem them at maturity, for the purpose of water works improvement in the City of Clarendon, as authorized by Chapter 1, Title 18, RS 1911, and Article 882 RS 1911, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas."

The said election shall be held at the Mayor's office in the City of Clarendon, and the following named persons are hereby appointed managers of said election, to-wit:

W. T. Clifford.
The said election shall be held under the provisions of the said Chapter 1, Title 18, RS 1911, and Article 882, RS 1911, and the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, and only qualified to vote.

All voters who favor the proposition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed upon their ballot the words: "For the issuance of bonds."

And those opposed shall have written or printed upon their ballot the words: "Against the issuance of bonds."

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the Laws of the State, regulating general elections.

A copy of this order signed by the Mayor of the City of Clarendon, attested by the City Secretary of said City, shall serve as a proper notice of said election.

The Mayor is authorized and directed to cause said notice of election to be posted up at the City Hall and at one public place in each of the voting places of the City of Clarendon, for at least thirty full days prior to the date of said election.

The Mayor is further authorized and directed to have said notice of election published in some newspaper of general circulation, published in said City, and which notice shall be published once each week for four weeks, the date of first publication being not less than thirty full days prior to the date of the election.

JUST WHAT IS THE NATION DOING FOR DISABLED EX-SERVICE MEN?

Sometimes we hear murmurings that might lead one to believe that nothing of consequence is being done in this country for the disabled ex-service men on the world war. The News takes pleasure in presenting herewith a brief statement of what the government is doing for the disabled boys, issued by Director E. C. Forbes, of the United States Veterans Bureau. Read it—there's lots of information in it:

- Veterans Bureau is:
1. Paying out over \$1,000,000 in cash every day, including Sunday, directly into the hands of the disabled boys, and to levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem them at maturity, for the purpose of water works improvement in the City of Clarendon, as authorized by Chapter 1, Title 18, RS 1911, and Article 882 RS 1911, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas."
 2. Providing, without cost, hospital care and treatment to 30,000 veterans. This care includes board and lodging and represents an expenditure of \$30,000,000 per annum;
 3. Giving vocational training, without cost, to over one hundred thousand disabled ex-service men at an expenditure for tuition and supervision of \$30,000,000 per annum;
 4. Mailing out six hundred and fifty thousand checks every month, representing \$42,000,000;
 5. Conducting an insurance business for over six hundred thousand ex-service men without any cost of administration to them. Insurance in force: Three and One-Half Billion;
 6. Conducting over fifty thousand medical examinations every month;
 7. Giving outside treatment in cases where hospitalization is not required to twenty thousand ex-service men every month;
 8. Receiving one thousand new claims every day, in addition to the million two hundred thousand already on file; employing four thousand ex-service men and women in carrying out the work;
 9. Requiring for 1922 expenditures in behalf of the disabled ex-service men, \$510,000,000—more than the entire expenditure of the whole United States in 1897;
 10. The United States of America is already doing more for its disabled veterans than any country in the world, despite the fact that their losses were far heavier than ours.
 11. Do these facts indicate that the disabled ex-service man is being neglected?

MISS JAMIE RUTH McCARTER WINS DENTIST BOAT GUESSING CONTEST

Miss Jamie Ruth McCarter of Decatur, Texas, won first prize of three settings of eggs offered by the Dentist Railroad for the closest guess to the number of persons going thru the Poultry Special Exhibit car on the 22 day poultry campaign recently conducted. Her guess was 12,126, the exact number going thru the car was 12,147.

Russell Morris of Seymour and J. M. Everhart of Habel tied for the second prize of two settings of eggs on their guess of 12,100. Since this tie has been discovered it has been decided to divide the second prize of two settings between them, giving each one setting of eggs. Miss Inez Reeves of Monday guessed 12,200, winning the third premium of one setting of eggs.

No definite time was sent for the close of this contest, however, since cards containing guesses have quit coming in it has been decided to announce the winners March 6th and prepare immediately to award the premiums. No guesses will be conducted which are received after March 6th.

Exact count was made with an automatic counter each day as the crowd passed thru the car; also the crowd at the morning meeting was counted. The complete count is as follows: 6,165 attended the morning meetings, 12,147 passed thru the car, making a grand total of 18,312. This is an average of 290 per day at the morning meetings and 652 thru the car each day or a total of 882 people reached thru the Poultry School each day for 22 days.

It seems strange that when there were so many numbers that might have been guessed that the nearest one to the correct number missed it by 21. There was great interest taken in the guessing contest, eleven hundred and fifty guesses being received. Those guessing seemed to be divided into about six groups. One large group guessed around six thousand. Another group guessed around ten thousand. A great many guessed a little over thirteen thousand and a large number guessed eighteen to twenty thousand.

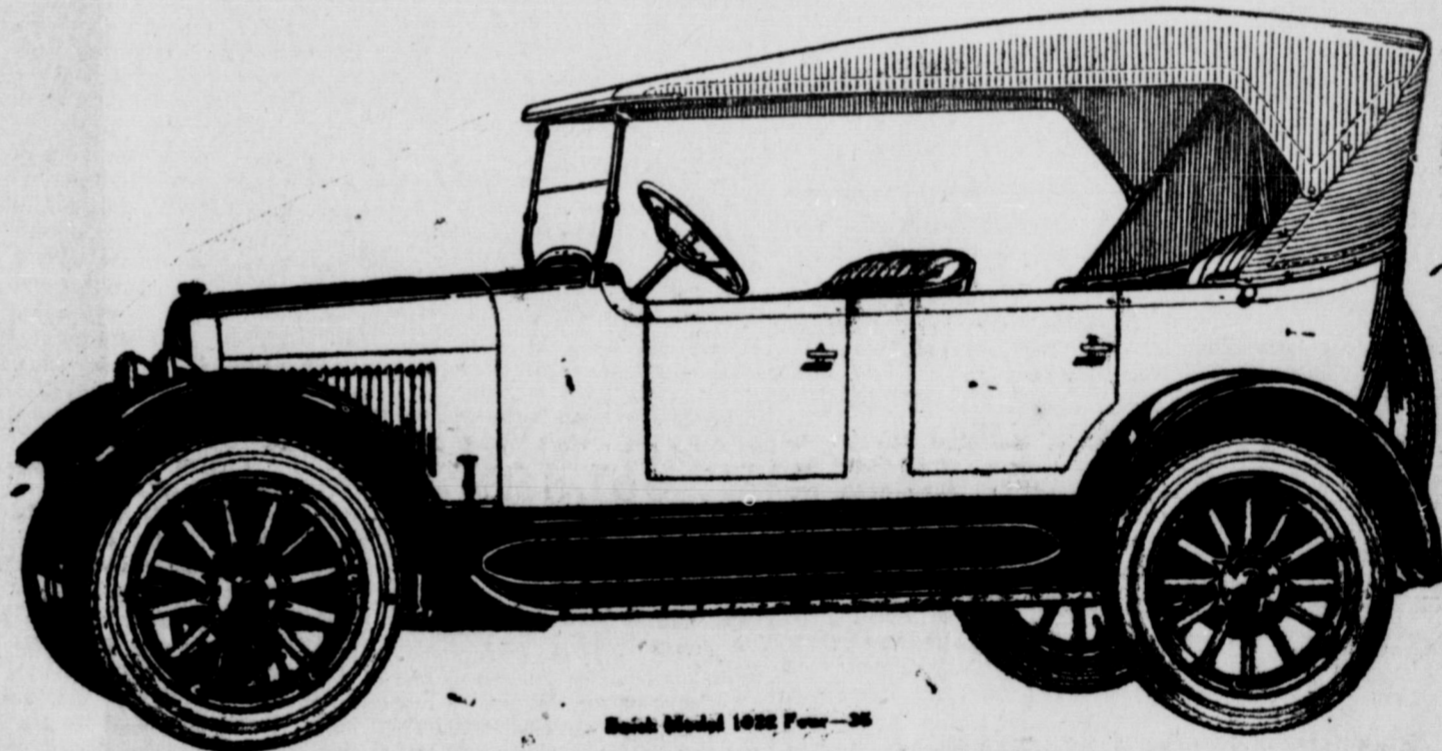
