WORK RELIEF WILL CONTINUE TO NOV. 1

Brown county's work relief program which was resumed last Friday morning, will continue until November 1, it was announced this week. During this time 465 men and forty women will be given employment.

The receipt of \$5,000 from the Texas Relief Commission enabled county relief officials to resume work relief projects after they had been shut down for some time. In addition to the \$5,000 check, county officials had conserved a considerable sum from last month's relief checks.

Projects on the work relief program now under way are:

Precinct 3 road work: Average of 25 men working three days a week for three weeks.

Canning plant: Four men and two women working daily for an indefinite period.

Brownwood High School athletic field cleaning off, leveling and sodding: Ten men per day for 15 days.

Drough relief program of receiving and unloading sheep and hides: Seven men per day for an indefinite period.

Community House sewing project: Eight women per day for an indefinite period.

Precinct 4 road work: Average of 45 men per day working three days a week for three weeks.

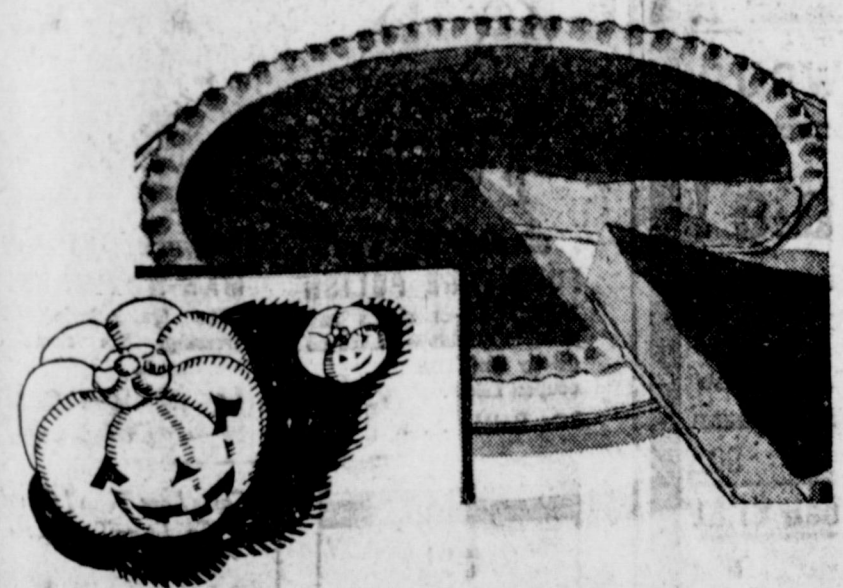
Clearing land to water level at Lake Brownwood: Thirty-five men per day for 17 days.

Precinct 2 road work: Average of 25 men per day three days per week for three weeks.

Precinct 1 road work: Average of 30 men per day three days a week for three weeks.

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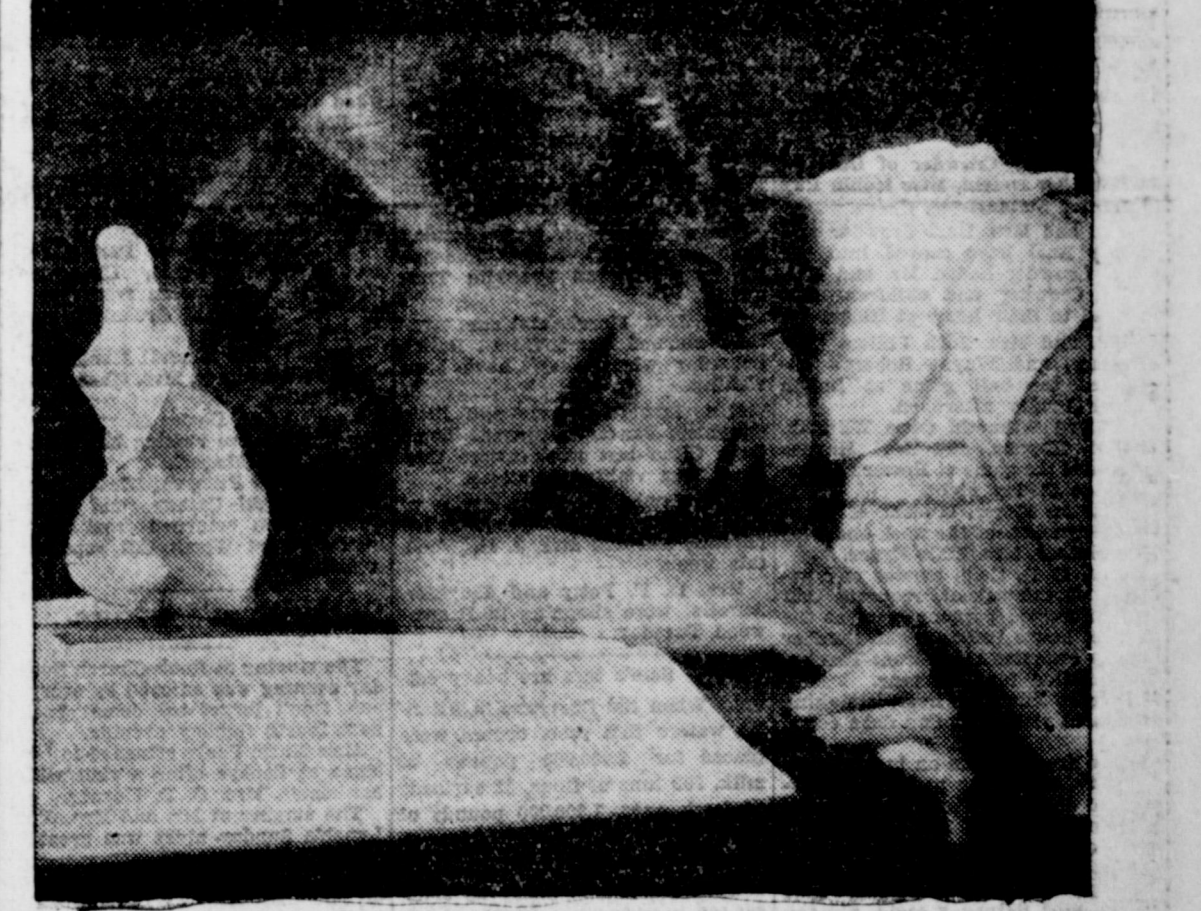

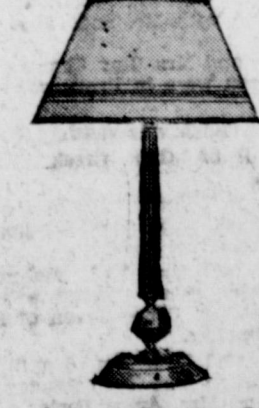

Perfect Family Program At Lyric

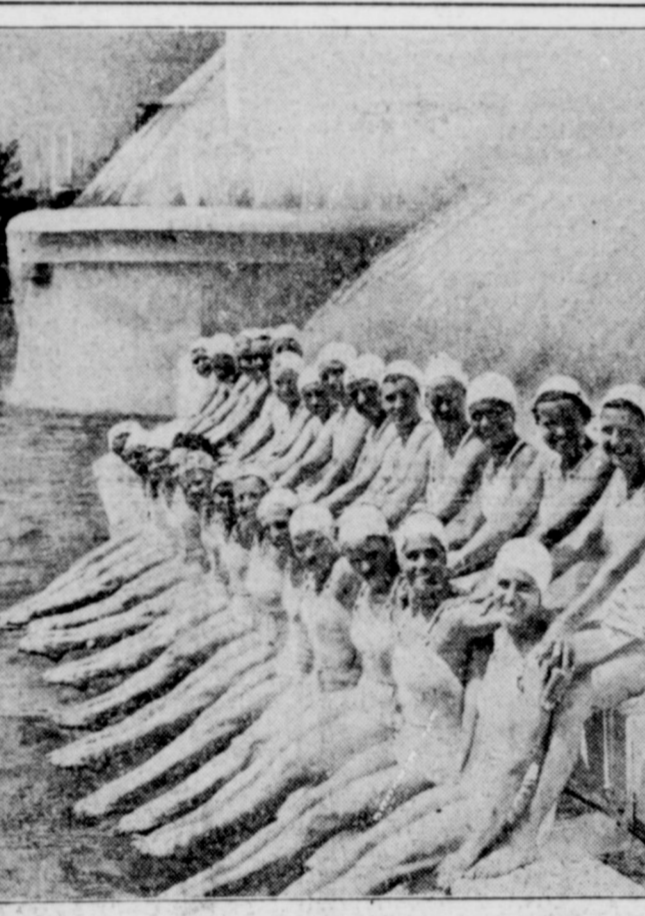
