

Theresa (Streng) Moster dies at 95

Theresa (Streng) Moster died at 9:40 p.m. on Feb. 4, 1993 at St. Richard's Villa following a long illness.

She was born on March 29, 1897 in Muenster to Pete Streng and Magdalena (Huff) Streng, Muenster pioneers, who were immigrants from Luxembourg. A lifelong member of Sacred Heart Church, she was baptized in the same church, where she received her First Holy Communion at age 13 as was the custom, received the Sacrament of Confirmation in June 1913 and was married in Sacred Heart Church to Leo Moster on Nov. 14, 1914 at 17 years of age.

Theresa Moster was a homemaker; a member of St. Anne's Society; of the Third Order of St. Francis; a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother whose life covered only a few years less than a century.

Survivors include one daughter, Florence, Mrs. Richard Grewing of Muenster; and two sons, Joe Moster of Muenster and Brother Thomas Moster, OSB, of Subiaco Abbey, Arkansas; also one brother, John (Jim) Streng of Muenster; 12 grandchildren; and 28 great-grandchildren.

Theresa and Leo Moster also adopted two sons, Steve and Frank Moster, orphans who arrived on the Orphan Train in 1920, both are now deceased. Steve died April 9, 1991, and Frank died in battle during World War II, on Dec. 9, 1943 in Salerno, Italy.

She was also preceded in death by her husband on Jan. 6, 1946 and their son, Charles, on Dec. 18, 1960 in an oil field accident; one granddaughter, Teresa Grewing; her only son-in-law, Richard Grewing; her parents and all her brothers and sisters, except one brother.

Mass of Christian Burial was offered in Sacred Heart Church on Monday at 10 a.m. with Abbot Jerome Kodell, OSB, of Subiaco Abbey as celebrant, and assistants Father James Moster, OFM, Cap; a great-nephew of Lawrence Kansas and Father Jeremy Myers of Garland, Texas, a family friend, who also delivered the homily; Father Victor Gillespie, OSB, was narrator of services. Concelebrants were Father Eugene Luke, OSB, and Father Denis Soerries, OSB, of Subiaco Abbey; Father Stephen Eckart, OSB, of Lindsay; Father Nicholas Fuhrmann, OSB, of Gainesville; Father Harry Fisher of Valley View; and Father Camillus Cooney of Muenster. Also present in the sanctuary was Brother James Lindsay, OSB, of Subiaco Abbey, a friend of the family.

Participants in the funeral liturgy were introduced by Peggy Grewing, a granddaughter, for presentation of symbolic gifts in the entrance procession. They were Theresa Moster's great-grandchildren, Melanie Bayer offering a white carnation; Courtney Grewing carrying a gold carnation; Loren Frost carrying a red rose; Melinda Fanning offering a loaf of bread; Aaron Sicking presenting the weekly Church Offering envelope; Leslie Grewing carrying Theresa's rosary; and Deann Bayer and Jeff and Justin Serna who would later present the bread, water and wine at the altar for the sacrifice of the Mass.

Dr. Susan Moster, a granddaughter, gave the First Reading from the Old Testament. Stephanie Grewing, a great-granddaughter, gave the Second Reading from the New Testament.

Prayers of the Faithful and Petitions were read by Carol (Grewing) Frost.

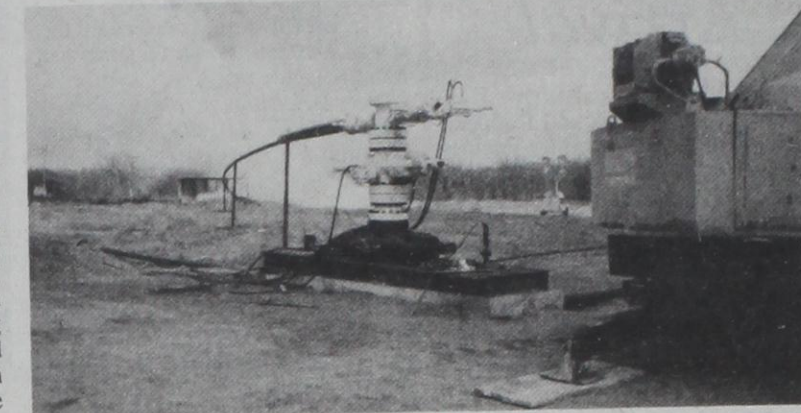
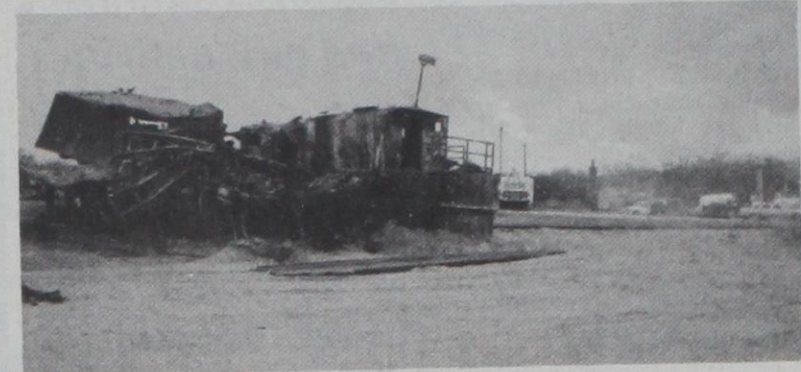
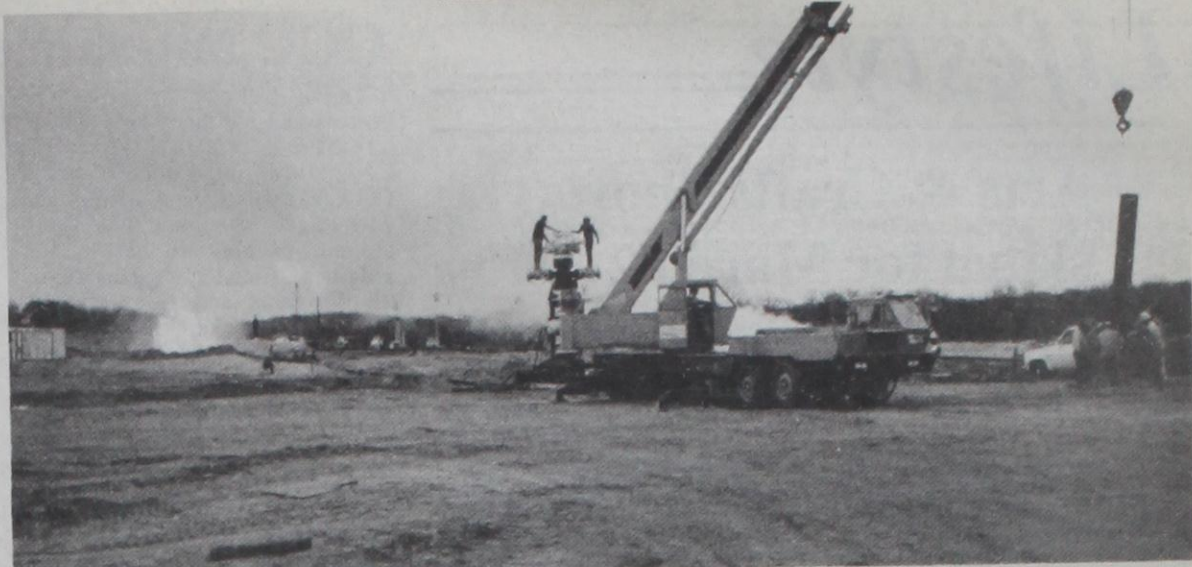
Mass servers were grandsons Scott Frost, Brandon Bayer and Matthew Bayer.

Burial was in Sacred Heart Cemetery, directed by McCoy Funeral Home of Muenster. Pallbearers were four grandsons and two great-grandsons: Wayne Grewing, Jamie Moster, Frank Moster, Chris Moster, Ryan Bayer and Jason Frost.

The family requested that memorials be directed to Subiaco Abbey Fund or Sacred Heart School Trust Fund.

Services in Sacred Heart Church on Sunday included praying of the Rosary at 4 p.m. and Vigil at 7 p.m. Following the 4 p.m. Rosary, Eileen Fisher sang "Only a Shadow." During the Wake service at 7 p.m., Eileen Fisher and David Fette sang "The Lord Is My Shepherd" and the "Edelweiss Benediction." Father Eugene Luke gave a brief homily and several friends and relatives gave brief comments. Following the family rosary in the McCoy Chapel Monday morning, Brother Thomas Moster read a tribute to his mother that he said reflected her attitudes.

Eight storage tanks were put in place to hold oil and gas as it is brought up from the ground. Flues and pits are used to burn fuel that cannot be stored. 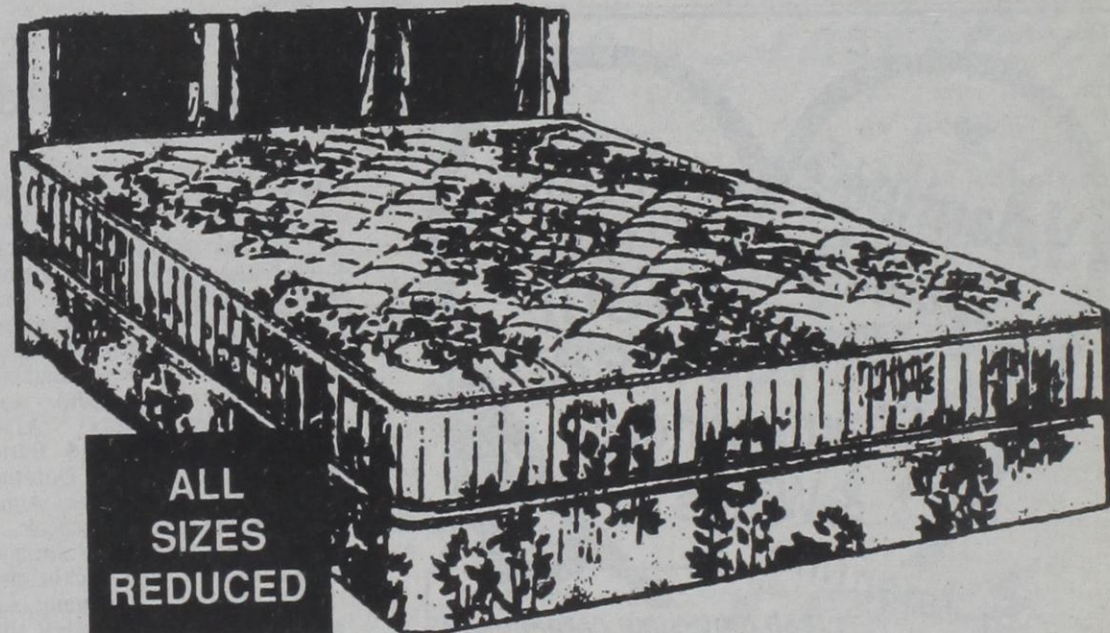
A brochure prepared to advertise MMH and its physicians were viewed by the board. It will soon be ready for distribution by bulk mailing.

CCC announces annual creative writing competition

The official call for entries has been issued for this year's annual Creative Writing Awards Competition at Cooke County College, and aspiring writers are encouraged to submit their short stories, poems and essays for judging. Official entry deadline in all divisions and categories of competition is noon, March 31.

Entries are to be submitted to Linda Coolen, competition director, at her office in Room 120 on the

CCC campus, or they may be given to any other member of the CCC Division of Communication & Fine Arts faculty.

Again this year, there will be cash prizes and certificates of achievement awarded for top entries in short story, poetry and essay categories of five main divisions or "contests" for non-professional writers. The youngest age group division is the Jerry Simpson Memorial Contest for middle school students.

The Brad Dill Memorial Contest is for high school students; the Layuna Hicks Contest and the Jack Joyce Memorial Essay Contest are for students enrolled this year at Cooke County College; and the CCC Creative Writing Contest is an "open" division for non-student adult residents of Texas and Oklahoma.

Top entries in short story, poetry and essay divisions will be published next year as space permits in *The April Perennial*, Cooke County College's popular annual literary magazine. The newly-published issue containing winning entries from last year's competition will be distributed on Awards Day this year.

The Awards Day ceremony is set for 11 a.m. April 29 in the CC Little Theatre.

All entrants are reminded to follow the prescribed manuscript format which, basically, calls for entries to be typed and double-spaced, and a title page must contain the name of the contest (division), the entry title and the contestant's name, address, telephone and social security number. Student entrants should also include the name of their English or creative writing teachers. Only the title should appear on the pages of the entry itself.

Poetry entries must not exceed 100 lines; short stories cannot be more than 3,500 words; and essays must range from 500-1,500 words. Originality and good taste in language and subject matter are required.
