two steps, Onken said. Both nutrients native to the soil and those from previous fertilizer applications, or the supplying power of the soil, he said. The amount of fertilizer required by the crop to produce a given yield is then determined. The difference between the nutrient given yield and the produce a supplied by the soil is fertilizer rate, Onken said.
To derive a more accurate fertilizer rate, additional factors, presented by
tortilemists, must be taken into account. Nutrients measured in a soil sample are not equal pound-for-pound to a current year's, or applied, fertilizer, he said. Factors such as yield potential, soil sample depth and measured amount of nutrient influence its value relat
to be applied.
