Blightly in accidents decrease slighty in 1992, but fatalitie Department game wardens reported
71 boating deaths in 1992 compared to 52 the previous year. That is still
well below the 88 boating-related well below the
deaths in 1987
According to the department's
statistics, there were 215 boating accidents in 1992, down from 226
in 1991.
in The largest number of accidents occurred while boaters were just
cruising around the lake - 105 in crusing around the lake - 147 in 1991. Ninety of
1992 and last year's accidents occurred on
Saturday, 73 on Sunday. The prime time for an accident was from noon to 7 p.m. ( 139 accidents).
Memorial Day weekend, which Memorial Day weekend, which
traditionally launches the recreational boating season in
Texas, typically is the most Texaserous time to be on Texas

deaths - one involving a boat deaths - one involving a boat -

Boating can be stressful and studies have shown that exposure to the sun, wind, engine noise,
vibration and constant motion can vibration and constant motion can
slow reaction time significantly. Boaters also should avoid alcohol, which can double the effects of
other stress factors. In addition to other stress factors. In addition to
having U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices on board for each person aboard, boaters also should have a Coast Guard-
approved marine fire extinguisher approved marine fire extinguisher,
navigation lights at night and a horm or whiste for boats 16-26 feet long. For more information, call the
