

County Receives \$34,000 Grant for Child Development

Governor Preston Smith today announced his approval of an Office of Child Development grant of \$34,000 in new federal funds to North Texas Community Action Corporation in Gainesville for Summer Head Start.

The grant is funded under Title II of the Economic Opportunity Act, and also involves \$6,862 in unexpended funds making a total of \$40,862. The program is effective

April 1, 1972, through March 31, 1973, and classes will be taught May 29 through July 21, 1972.

Operation of the program has been delegated to Cooke County Public Schools in Gainesville which will conduct 11 classes in seven centers five days a week, four and one-half hours a day, and will serve 200 children ages 5-6. Staff will include 11 teachers, two other professionals, 22 nonprofessionals and 21 volunteers.
