The new area codes will not change new area codes will not change
the local calling scope. Most local calls may be made using
only seven digits, when callers only seven digits, when callers

completed by dialing ten digits. Lompleted calls can continue to be
made without dialing "I" first Locale without dialing "I" first
mar incurring a toll charge or incurring a toll charge.

Yearling bulls should weigh 1,050 to 1,250 pounds, gaining about two pounds a day until he reaches $85 \%$ of his mature should slow down. <br> In multiple-sire herds, group bulls of similar ages to prevent bulls of similar ages to prevent social domination. often destroying all of the nutlet often destroying all of the nutlets
