Grand **Jury** acts on 29 indictments in July

By Janet Felderhoff While impaneled for its July 2005 session, the Cooke County Grand Jury returned 29 indictments. Grand jurors are selected from upstanding and responsible citizens of the community and serve six-month terms. The Cooke County Grand Jury generally meets once per month. There are times when it may be necessary for a grand jury to investigate a case before the case is indicted. In that event, the grand jury may hear live testimony from a winess.

near live testimony from a witness. According to Cooke County District Attorney Cindy Stormer, the Grand Jury reviews the facts of a case and determines if there is sufficient evidence to hold a person over for trial. They review only felony cases. Misdemeanor cases (lesser crimes) are charged by a document called an "information" (felonies are charged by indictments). It is not necessary for a grand jury to review misdemeanor cases.

cases. Indictments Charges of criminally negligent homicide were considered against Marion Weiss, 69, of Shreveport, Louisiana. She was the driver of a 2004 SUV involved in a two-car collision on U.S. Highway 82 in Muenster on Sept. 3, 2004. Weiss reportedly fell asleep while driving and her eastbound vehicle veered into the far right westbound lane hitting a 1994 Nissan Sentra driven by Mickey Anderson of Blossom, Texas. His wife Stella Anderson, a front seat passenger died as a result of nuries sustained in the accident. The Grand Jury returned a "no bill" in the case and no charges will be presed. DA Stormer explained that a "true bill" is what the grand jury returns when it decides that there is sufficient evidence to hold a person over for trial. 





It's for the birds

It's tor the birds have many natural predators. To make them feel more secure in your yard and more likely to stay, try to hang feeding stations near trees or bushes where birds can hide, if necessary. Evergreens are particularly appealing to birds because they provide shelter, protection from the weather, and an ideal nesting site. If you're adding trees or shrubs to your yard, locate them on the west or north ends of the property to help block the wind. Bird baths should also be placed near a tree or other structure that can potentially block colder north winds. And, of course, be sure to keep your cat indoors since more birds are killed each year by cats than from any other Cause.

Congress approves Energy Policy Act

Several initiatives in the recently approved Energy Policy Act of 2005 affect ag producers. Secretary of Agriculture Mike Johanns said, "A reliable and affordable energy supply is critical at a time when farm production costs are increasing."

Included is a provision designed to increase the use of homegrown fuels and reduce dependence on imported oil. Specifically, the Act calls for the use of 7.5 billion gallons of biodiesel and ethanol by 2012. The new legislation also extends the biodiesel tax credit through 2008 and expands the small producer tax credit, providing incentives for producers who want to start a biodiesel facility or ethanol plant.
