Area enters new year with alarming wildfire threat. Raging fires cut a path 20 miles by four miles wide around Montague County. Nocona was evacuated, but the town was spared. Five buses from Muenster ISD and two from Sacred Heart were sent to help assist with evacuation. The Red Cross set up shelters in Muenster, Bowie, and Henrietta.
