

## County commits to reduced budget; sets .4624 tax rate

Cooke County Commissioners Court held a special meeting on Monday, Aug. 16, which included hearings on the proposed budget and proposed tax rate. The Court held firm on keeping the proposed budget cuts, including some positions, that allowed them to reduce the amount of the 2010-11 budget by almost a half million dollars. Speaking of the proposed \$30,263,678.00 budget, County Judge John Roane remarked, "I believe this is a realistic budget, one that reflects lower taxable values this year. Cooke County is not in trouble financially. But we are not in trouble because we have made the hard decisions and have adjusted our spending according to the times."

Judge Roane added that more adjustments may be necessary in successive years so as not to place an increased burden on taxpayers. "I believe our duty is to spend the public's money wisely, not coming back year after year for another bailout while maintaining the status quo." During the Public Hearing on the proposed budget, several people made comments and suggestions. Steve Gaylord's included all County officials and employees taking a 5% pay cut rather than eliminating any positions. He disagreed with cutting a position in the County Court At Law since the Court brings in revenues that may be reduced with one less employee. Gaylord recalled that

building a new County jail was supposed to save money. "By my calculations, our jail costs have almost doubled from \$1.8 million in 2004 including the cost of \$676,000 for housing prisoners," he said. "This current year, our jail costs including servicing the jail debt are projected to cost Cooke County \$3.3 million. That is an increase of 1.5 million a year or 83%." A larger jail was built to bring in revenues from housing out-of-county prisoners, Gaylord noted. That hasn't been true. He said, "According to the latest budget on the Cooke County website, there have been no revenues from boarding out-of-county prisoners this past year and we only collected \$167,000 the previous fiscal year from

According to Muenster VFD Chief Herbie Knabe, they served just under 900 plates, which is fewer than last year. He felt the extreme heat had everything to do with fewer people attending. The Auction made up the difference and he estimated that they raised about \$6,000 more than last year's event. "The Auction was way up," said Knabe. "We did extremely good. We had some good items donated." Retired members of the Muenster Volunteer Fire Department and their spouses

The Muenster ISD Board of Directors met Aug. 11 in an attempt to finalize preparations for the opening school day, including the approval of the Student Handbook/Code of Conduct and Employee Handbook. Always a concern of parents is the student dress code. The Handbook states that the District's dress code is established to teach appropriate grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. boarding prisoners."

Five jailer positions were intended to be cut in the early stages of the budget planning. Since then, the Sheriff found prisoners from out-of-county to house in the jail.

Commissioner Gary Hollowell and Judge Roane explained that the moment that becomes a deficit to the County, the whole deal will be called off. If they don't come, we will close it," said Judge Roane.

Ken Arterberry disagreed with cutting the employee in Judge John Morris' County Court At Law.

Jimmy Mosman suggested a budget that would allow no increases in taxes.

Judge Morris made another appeal to keep his employee.

District Judge Janelle Haverkamp came to correct numbers that Judge Morris had reported incorrectly on her court at the previous meeting.

Steve Harlow appealed for more patrol deputies and continued funding for Noah's Ark.

Commissioner Leon Klement responded to some comments on renovation of the courthouse. He said that people complained about taking out good aluminum windows and replacing them with wooden windows. He said that the aluminum windows were single pane and many no longer opened. The new windows are double panes with good wood. He said Cooke County was the first courthouse that the Texas Historical Commission allowed to install double pane windows.

"This proposed budget is nearly half a million dollars less than this year's operating budget," reported Judge Roane. "It is over a million and a half less than what was requested. If the economy remains sluggish, more cuts may be necessary next year. But, by addressing the

problem this year, drastic measures will not be called for later to keep our budget balanced."

In a vote after the hearing closed, Commissioners Court voted 4-1 to approve the budget as it was proposed. Commissioner Steve Key cast the dissenting vote.

A Public Hearing on the proposed tax rate drew more comments from Gaylord, Arterberry, and Mosman.

In clarification, Judge Roane said that it is true that none of the employees or elected officials in Cooke County got a raise in salary this year, but it is also true that their insurance cost is up. Also, everybody will receive their longevity pay increases.

Commissioner Key noted that he favored possibly shaving the Road & Bridge tax by a penny this year. He said he'd feel better about the whole process if Road & Bridge had suffered some pain in the cuts.

Commissioner Hollowell responded, "Histori-

cally what we've said for four years is we don't have enough money, we don't have enough employees, we can't get our jobs done. So, now we say let's cut our budget." He said that cutting the Road & Bridge funds would quickly break the east side precincts.

In two separate votes, Commissioners adopted a total tax rate of \$0.4624 by a vote of 4-1, with Commissioner Key casting the nay both times vote. That rate is the effective tax rate. They voted and approved a Maintenance and Operating rate of \$0.4297 and an Interest and Sinking rate of \$0.0327. The taxes will be used to help fund the County budget as follows: General Fund .3096; Road & Bridge .1050; Permanent Improvement .0150; FM & Lateral Road .0001; and Interest & Sinking .0327.

## From the MISD Superintendent's Desk

Muenster ISD is ready and very excited about the start of a new school year, especially after receiving notification of an "Exemplary" rating from the Texas Education Agency for Muenster ISD and "Exemplary" ratings for both the Elementary and Secondary campuses. I want to congratulate all the faculty, staff, administrators, students, and parents for this accomplishment. An "Exemplary" rating acknowledges the hard work that teachers put forth and the response of students to the efforts of the teachers.

As superintendent of Muenster ISD, I have high expectations for the district. High expectations of Muenster ISD are not new to this community, as Muenster ISD has a tradition of success. But what is success? Success can be defined in many ways. I believe that Muenster ISD has a tradition of success not because Muenster is better than anyone else, but because of high expectations. When one has high expectations, sets goal accordingly, and works tirelessly to achieve those standards, then success comes. I also believe there are underlying causes for success. Strong family core values in this community help support high expectations. I knew prior to coming to Muenster that those family values are important to this community. That is the main reason I wanted to come and be a part of this school and community. I too am very excited about the start of the 2010-11 school year and all the challenges it will bring. These challenges will give us opportunities for success!

I want to share some of the visions and plans that the Board of Trustees has for the District. The Board is not only focused on the present needs of Muenster ISD, but is also looking at future needs for educating students 25 years from now. Current facilities upgrades include resurfacing the track, finishing the field house, and building of a practice gym. With the current fund balance that Muenster ISD has (just over \$4 million) and due to recommendations from school finance specialists to spend down fund balances to the recommended two month operating needs, the Board has decided to use fund balance to pay for the upgrades listed. The cost for the upgrades will be approximately \$1.5 million.

In trying to answer questions concerning the Elementary and Junior High buildings, I assembled a "community committee for facilities upgrades" to see if there is support for new classroom facilities. The committee consists of parents, business owners, community members, teachers, and administrators. We asked Darren Bindel (chairman), Traci Bohl, Maurus Hacker, Dalana Peel, Rusty Richardson, Michelle Sandmann, Ron Trubenbach, Deanna Hellman, Deb Klement, Jill Reiter, Ralph Gourley, Troy Sicking, Sharon Browning, and Lou Heers to be committee members. I am very appreciative of each of these individuals because they have given up their precious time to meet on two occasions to tour and discuss current facilities.

Buildings are 40, 50, and 60 years old. Current problems with facilities include overcrowding, electrical, heating and cooling efficiency, mold, water leaks around foundation, asbestos, and lack of technology not only make for instructional issues but also health and safety issues. With much discussion, the committee unanimously recommends that

the Board pursue facilities upgrades for elementary and junior high. There will be much more discussion with community meetings for individuals to make comments and ask questions in the near future.

Last, I want to dispel rumors that home football games have been cancelled and moved to other facilities. Due to the condition of the football field, the junior varsity football home games scheduled for Aug. 26 and Sept. 2 have been rescheduled to be played in Ponder and Nocona respectively. The varsity home game scheduled for Sept. 10 against Bells will be played in Muenster Stadium, and all home games following Sept. 10 for varsity and sub-varsity on the schedule will be played at Muenster Stadium.

I am extremely excited about the first day of school on Aug. 23. If anyone has questions concerning Muenster ISD, I encourage you to call the administration office at 759-2282.


