## Construction brings frontage road changes

As part of the new construction of the I-35/U.S. 82 interchange, frontage roads will be converting to ONE-WAY permanently. The first stretch of road to change will be the I-35 frontage roads from U.S. 82 to FM 51 (California Street). The frontage roads will mirror the direction of travel on the freeway.

Each frontage road will only have one lane of traffic during part of construction, but will ultimately hold two

## Chamber Banquet features young German folk dancers

Muenster Chamber of Commerce moved into the new year with plans for its annual installation banquet. It will be held on Saturday, Jan. 29 in the Community Center. The evening begins with a social hour from 6-7 p.m. Beer, wine, and hors d'oeuvres will be served.

Slated to entertain for the evening are Whitney High School's traditional German folk dancers.

The students are in German Folk Dance at Whitney High School. According to their sponsor Lisa Mays, this year marks their 10th year to participate in German Folk Dancing. She added, "It is also the first year that we have been able to offer German Folk Dance as an actual fine arts class. We have 16 students enrolled in the class and about four to six more that come to early morning dance rehearsals. We participate each year in the Regional (Plano) and State (Austin) German competitions, where we received 2nd place last year. At the State level of the Texas German competition, schools from all over Texas come to compete and only the top 15 German Folk Dance groups are invited to compete. We do a number of dances that include lifts and even 'Schuhplattlers' (a type of dancing done by the males that includes stomping and slapping the feet and thighs). All of the dance moves are strictly proscribed and have traditionally been danced in the same manner for up to a hundred years or more. Often the steps are influenced by the movements and

rythms of the traditional guilds, i.e. there are blacksmiths' dances, fishermen's dances, etc."

Viewing the tables decorated by various businesses and voting on them has been popular among banquet goers the last two years. Local businesses and organizations are again invited to decorate a table this year. There will be great prizes for the top three table selected by guests. Ballots will be presented as guests enter the event.

Jeannine Flusche, table decoration chairman, reports that there are 20 tables available to decorate and there are still a few in need of a business to decorate them. If interested, contact Jeannine at 736-5180. The Community Center will be open from 1-8 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 28 for those who are decorating tables.

Banquet tickets are \$20

each. Rohmer's Restaurant will cater the meal which consists of rib eye, cheesy potatoes, green beans, and German chocolate cake. Every ticket will be entered into a drawing. ## Road map hearing draws crowd

County citizens lined the wall and overflowed outside the Cooke County Commissioners meeting room Jan. 4 to protest a proposed County road map, and to hear what officials had to say about their land and the roads.

More than 60 attended the public hearing for Cooke County's proposed adoption of the road map, with some citizens telling commissioners and Cooke County Judge John Roane in the more than six-hour meeting that they were taking land "without just compensation," and call-

ing the map project a "con job."

As the meeting began, Roane told the crowd, "You have heard a lot of things about this road map program, how sinister it is, how different things are not in your best interest. I think we're going to answer all those questions today. If you will, as you realize that there is nothing to this program here, whether it's today or through time, I want you to make sure and recognize the people who told you otherwise. I want to make sure you let them know there

really wasn't anything to this program today because there will be things in the future they will disagree with also."

For more than two hours, attorney Bob Bass spoke and answered questions from the audience.

"In an ideal world, each county road would be taken over for maintenance in a formal process," Bass said, with roads coming into the system by citizen request, formal dedication, or through deeds, and the Commissioners Court tak-

Brent is married to Shauna and they have four children. They live in Nocona. They enjoy travel, outdoor sports, and anything with their children.

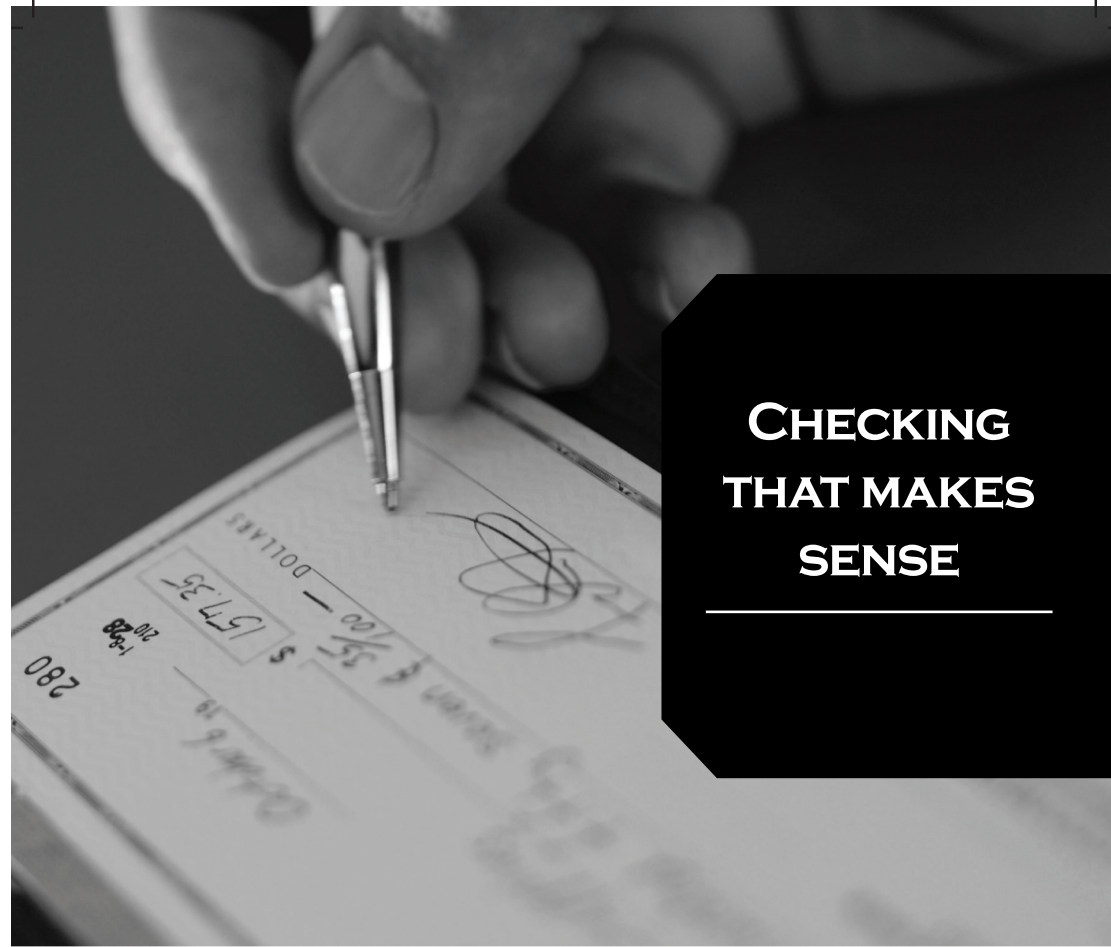

Motorists wanting to change directions from north to south will have to use the existing overpass near Star Street.

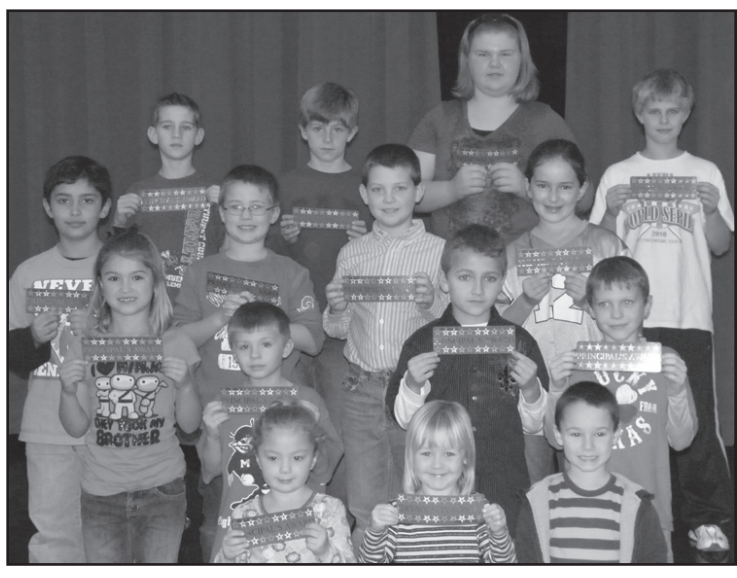

ing action on accepting the road for maintenance. "But in the real world we live in, over time, roads have come into the maintenance system in a haphazard manner. The bulk of our roads are not dedicated easement roads. They're not deeded roads. They're not the result of any particular judicial order... If there were, we probably would not be here today because there would be a dedicated easement for each of those roads and we would know exactly where the road was."

Bass said that the County's intent was to account for the roads that it maintains.

"What we're doing in this process is essentially asking the public to recognize what we have been doing on the ground for however long the road has been there," Bass said.

Before taking questions from the floor, Bass said, "Be careful what you ask for. There is value in having the County maintain roads." He told of a case where a resident protested the map, and was granted the road. When he asked for assistance in maintaining the road after a rain, he

was told the maintenance was his responsibility.

The judge's office received 61 protests. Each protestor's name was read aloud and if present, given the chance to speak. As each of the protests were read aloud, or the protestor spoke on his or her concerns, some spoke of the cost of moving a fence should roads be widened. Some did not want the County to "steal" land by widening roads and easements.

Out of the 61 protests, a possibility of 10 may go before a jury of view, an impartial panel who will decide whether the protestor's claim of a road not being under County jurisdiction was valid. Seven protests were withdrawn. All who filed a protest will receive further communication from Bass.

After more than six hours of discussion, County residents who stuck it out to the end got a chance to speak again, with at least one telling the Commissioners Court it had been a "privilege to do battle."

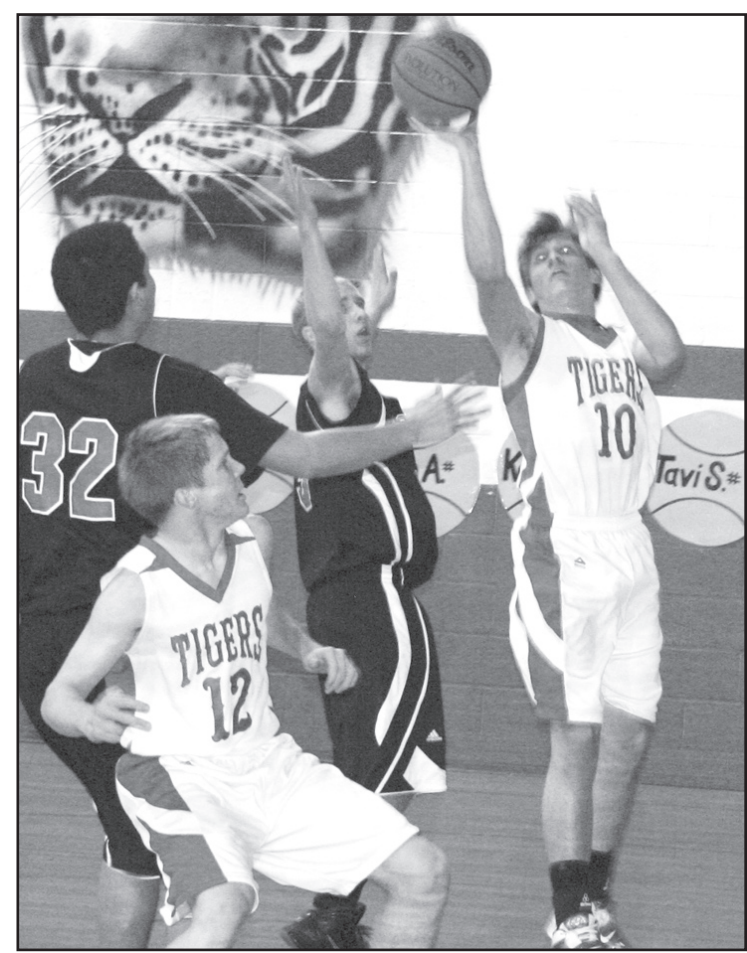

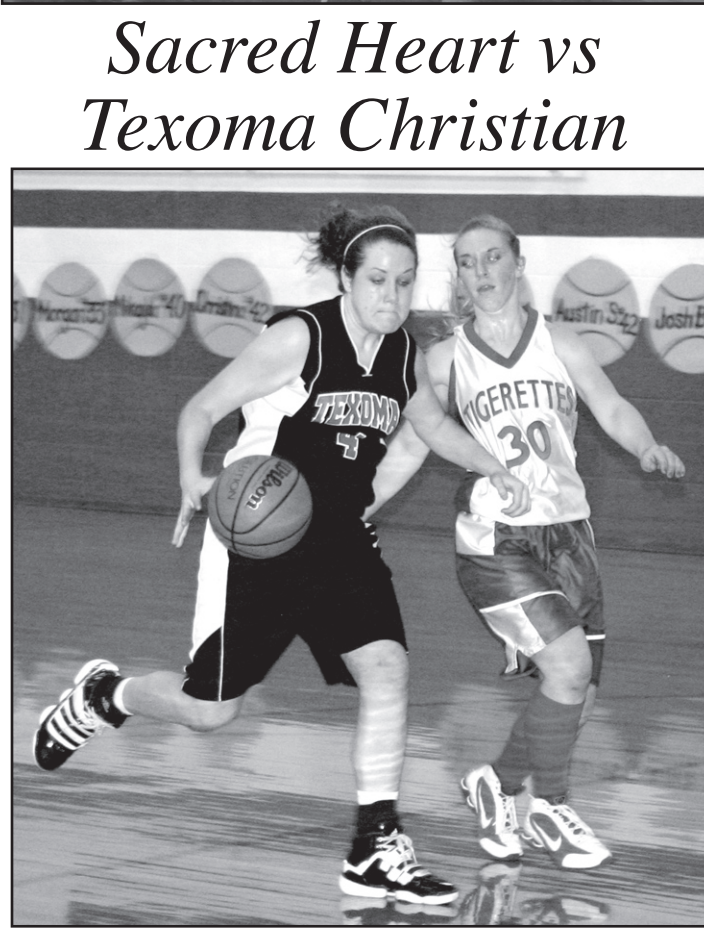
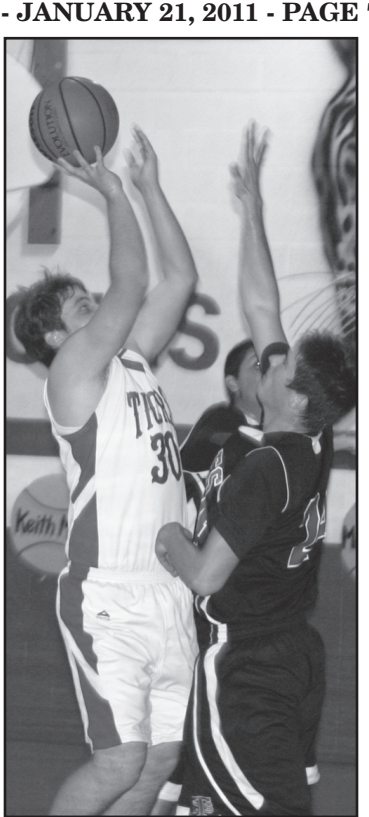
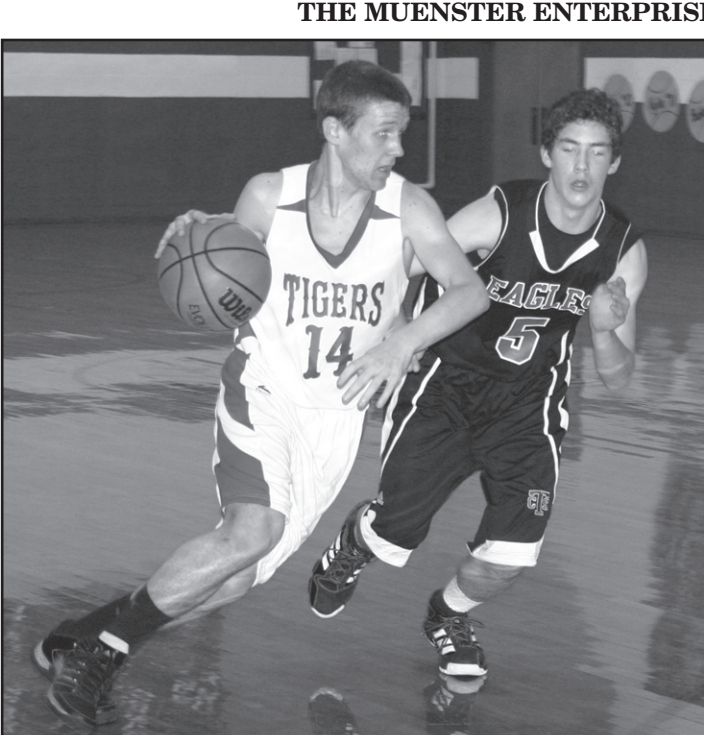
**Leigh Hale, Muenster ISD**
