## FIRST scores high for Muenster ISD

Nobody from the public attended the public hearing scheduled as required by the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). It was held on Wednesday, Dec. 9, prior to the regular monthly meeting of the MISD Board

Superintendent Steve Self explained, "It's very good news for the District. FIRST has a new format this year. They've had about 22 indicators in the past and they've lowered it to seven this year. This year, you either passed or you failed, basically. In the past, they've had four different levels and Muenster has usually received the superior achievement. This year they got a passed achievement which is good."

The seven performance indicators include: was the audit report submitted to TEA on time; was the audit report clean; was the District in compliance with all terms of all debt agreements; was the total unrestricted asset balance greater than zero; was the school district's administrative cost ratio equal to or less than the threshold ratio (MISD got a 10 which was the highest score possible); did the comparison of Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) data to like information in the school district's AFR result in a total variance of less than 3% of all expenditures by function (a 10 was awarded if the variance was less than 3% and MISD got a 10 by having a variance of 300th of a percent); and did the external independent auditor report that the AFR was free of any instance of material weakness in internal controls over financial reporting and compliance for local, state, or federal funds (MISD had a 10).

Self noted that the District's score was 30 which is the maximum possible. Scores of 16 and greater were rated as

They also were required to report on the year ended 2014 to list all reimbursements to the superintendent and School Board members at that time because that is the period the ratings are on. It was reported that Superintendent Richerson was reimbursed \$419 in travel expenses. There were no reimbursements to School Board members.

Business transactions between businesses and School Board members were to be reported. The only ones reflected have more opportunities to at that time were a total of \$4,412.12 between the School District and Flusche Enterprises. Board member Neal Flusche has some interest in Flusche Enterprise, noted Self.

#### SWCD Directors support development of brackish water supplies

Soil and water conservation district directors representing 216 Texas soil and water conservation districts (SWCDS) in attendance at the 75th Annual Meeting of SWCDs were in unified accord for the development of brackish water supplies to supplement dwindling fresh water supplies.

Brackish water does not have an exact definition, but is typically defined as distastefully salty but less saline than seawater. Brackish water contains between 1,000 to 10,000 parts per million (ppm) in total dissolved solids compared to highly saline water and ocean water which contains from 10 to 35,000 ppm in total dissolved

Billy Mann, Jr., chairman of the Matagorda County SWCD headquartered in Bay City that sponsored the resolution calling for greater efforts on the part of the state to develop and implement brackish water supplies said, "Unprecedented growth in Texas has overburdened conventional sources of water resulting in a drawdown of water tables in underground aquifers coupled with the dilemma that surface water resources have also been impacted with near record reductions in storage levels.

"Texas may have already reached at least a short term limit of water readily available to support continued growth without adversely affecting already designated supplies for human consumption, agriculture, and economic development. That's why Texas SWCDs support this effort," added Mann.

According to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), the population of Texas is expected to double within the next 50 years and water demand to increase al-

During that same time period, groundwater supplies, which is the volume of groundwater that can be produced with current permits and existing infrastructure, is expected to decrease about 32%.

The TWDB estimates that the state has more than 2.7 billion acre-feet of brackish groundwater resources. In the 2012 State Water Plan, five regional water planning groups recommended brackish groundwater desalination as a water management strategy to meet at least some projected water needs. In total, the regional water planning groups foresee that desalination of brackish groundwater would create about 184,704 acre-feet of new water supplies per year by 2060.

The TWDB recently held a public meeting in Austin to gain input to identify and designate local or regional brackish groundwater production zones in areas of the state with moderate to high availability and productivity of brackish groundwater that can be used to reduce the use of fresh groundwater.

Local SWCDs coordinate the implementation and deliverance of corresponding natural resource conservation programs to farmers and ranchers throughout the state. Additionally, SW-CDs participate in planning,

In other areas of responsibility, SWCDs participate in a state water supply enhancement program through the targeted control of waterdepleting brush. An added area of responsibility permits SWCDs to engage in work to ensure local flood control dams are protecting lives and property by providing operation, maintenance, and structural repairs.

If the bills are passed and part of the agreement House crop insurance is cut, farm-Ag Committee Chairman ers and families across the Mike Conaway announced at nation will suffer the consequences.

"The last farm bill was over a year ago. Agriculture took about \$23 billion in cuts. About the only thing we were going to be able to hold onto, they said, was crop insurance," TFB President Russell W. Boening said in an interview with the TFB Radio Network. "Now, they're coming back a year or so later and wanting to go into crop insurance—the one thing we had left, really. Congress cannot balance the federal budget on the back of the American farmer."

Without crop insurance in 2011 and 2012, many farmers would have suffered much bigger losses. Some would have been forced out of the business altogether without a safety net.

"A blow like that doesn't just hurt the farmer," Boening said. "It hurts rural businesses. It hurts industries that depend on agriculture."

Agriculture as a whole wouldn't collapse immediately without crop insurance. But it would become much

"Whenever you can't take out deep losses like when you have a drought, the volatility gets to be much more severe." Boening said. "You will lose operations. You will lose fam-

ily farms." Some experts say that farmers should pay for their crop insurance without gov-

ernment subsidies. Boening explains that would still create market volatility, which would eventually hurt the American economy.

"Farmers wouldn't be able to afford it," Boening said. 'There's no doubt about it. It's marginal in some areas and on some crops already. If you had to pay the entire premium, you'd go without it. If you went without it, if vou had a bad enough year, it would force you to close the doors. We would lose production that we desperately need to feed a hungry world."

Losing production in one part of the U.S. would affect American agriculture as a whole - especially in difficult crop years. For example, when the Corn Belt suffers from too much or too little rain, the corn growers in Texas and across the South are very important.

Agriculture programs, as a whole, don't take up much of the federal budget anymore. Proposed cuts to the programs that are left are just additional slashes to an already small piece of the pie.

"I try to explain to them what it costs them in tax money. You can get it down to the average taxpayer pays pennies a day for crop insurance," Boening said. "I think if the average consumer and taxpayer really studied it, at the end of the day, they would agree it's a good investment for them."

Agriculture groups continue to meet with legislators in Washington, D.C. about the proposed cuts.



#### U.S. feedlot cattle placements hit nearly 20-year low

The number of cattle placed into U.S. feedlots last month declined 4% from a year ago to their lowest level for October since the government began tabulating the data in 1996, a U.S. Department of Agriculture report showed. October's placement results nearly matched forecasts by analysts, who cited burdensome supplies of heavier animals that weighed on cattle prices and eroded profit for feedyards.

Abundant grazing pasture and affordable feed also allowed ranchers to grow cattle outside of feeding pens longer as leverage against lower prices for their animals.

USDA's data indicated the number of cattle placed on feed by weight class continued to decline year-over-year for all categories except that above 800 lbs.

#### Cake Batter Chocolate Chip Cookies

yield: 2 - 2.5 dozen cookies If you like chocolate chip cookies and you like cake batter, you will love these soft & chewy cookies! Ingredients:

1 and 1/4 cup all-purpose flour 1 and 1/4 cup yellow or vanilla boxed cake mix 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 3/4 cup unsalted butter, softened to room temperature 1/2 cup granulated sugar 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar

1 egg, at room temperature
1 and 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1 cup chocolate chips Directions:

In a large bowl, sift together flour, cake mix, and baking soda. Set aside.

Using a hand mixer or a stand mixer fitted with paddle attachment, cream the softened butter and both sugars to-

1 & 1/2 cups flaked coconut
DIRECTIONS:

Unwrap butter and place in 13" x 9" pan. Place pan, with butter, in the oven and turn the oven on to 350\*F. Butter can melt in pan while preheating. Keep an eye on it, checking every few minutes and pulling out of the oven when butter is melted. Please be careful while preparing recipe as pan will be very hot.

Crush graham crackers in a food processor to create graham cracker crumbs (or buy crumbs).

When butter is melted, remove pan from oven and carefully sprinkle the graham cracker crumbs over the melted butter. Press in lightly with fork or back of spoon. Pour sweetened condensed milk over the crumb layer. Sprinkle 1/2 of the chocolate chips, 1/2 of the M&M's & the nuts over the sweetened condensed milk layer. Sprinkle coconut on top, followed by remaining chocolate chips & M&M's.

Bake in oven for 25-30 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from oven. Allow bars to cool completely. Slice, give and enjoy!

gether on medium speed until smooth. Add the egg and mix on high until combined, about 1 minute. Scrape down the sides and bottom of the bowl as needed. Add the vanilla and beat on high until combined. Add the flour mixture to the wet ingredients and mix on low-medium speed until just combined. Add the chocolate chips and sprinkles. Mix on low until the add-ins are evenly disbursed.

Cover tightly with plastic wrap and refrigerate dough for at least 2 hours, or up to 3-4 days. This step is mandatory. The dough is fairly sticky, so chilling the dough is required in order to avoid the cookies from spreading too much. If you chill longer than 2 hours, make sure you roll the cookie dough into balls after the 2 hour mark. Place dough balls on a plate, cover tightly, and store in the refrigerator until ready to bake. You may also freeze the balls at this point for up to 3 months. (Then bake as directed adding 1 minute to the bake time without thaw-

Once dough has been chilled, preheat oven to 350°F. Line two large cookie sheets with parchment paper or silicone

baking mats.


Scoop rounded balls of the cold dough onto an ungreased baking sheet, use about 1.5 Tablespoons of cookie dough per cookie. Shape your cookie dough balls to be "taller" than they are wide, as pic-tured above. Press a few chocolate chips into the tops of the cookie dough balls, if desired. That makes a pretty cookie. Make sure to keep dough chilled when working in batches.

Bake the cookies for 10-12 minutes until edges are





slightly browned. Mine take 10 minutes exactly. The centers will still appear very soft, but the cookies will set as they cool. You can also press a few more chips into the tops of the cookies at this point (the chips will melt down and stick from the warm cookies).

Allow the cookies to cool on the baking sheet for 4 minutes and transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Make ahead tip: Cookies stay fresh covered at room temperature for up to 1 week. You can make the cookie dough and chill it in the refrigerator for up to 3-4 days. Allow to come

to room temperature and continue with step 4. Baked cookies freeze well - up to three months. Unbaked cookie dough balls freeze well - up to three months. Bake frozen cookie dough balls for an extra minute, no need to thaw.
