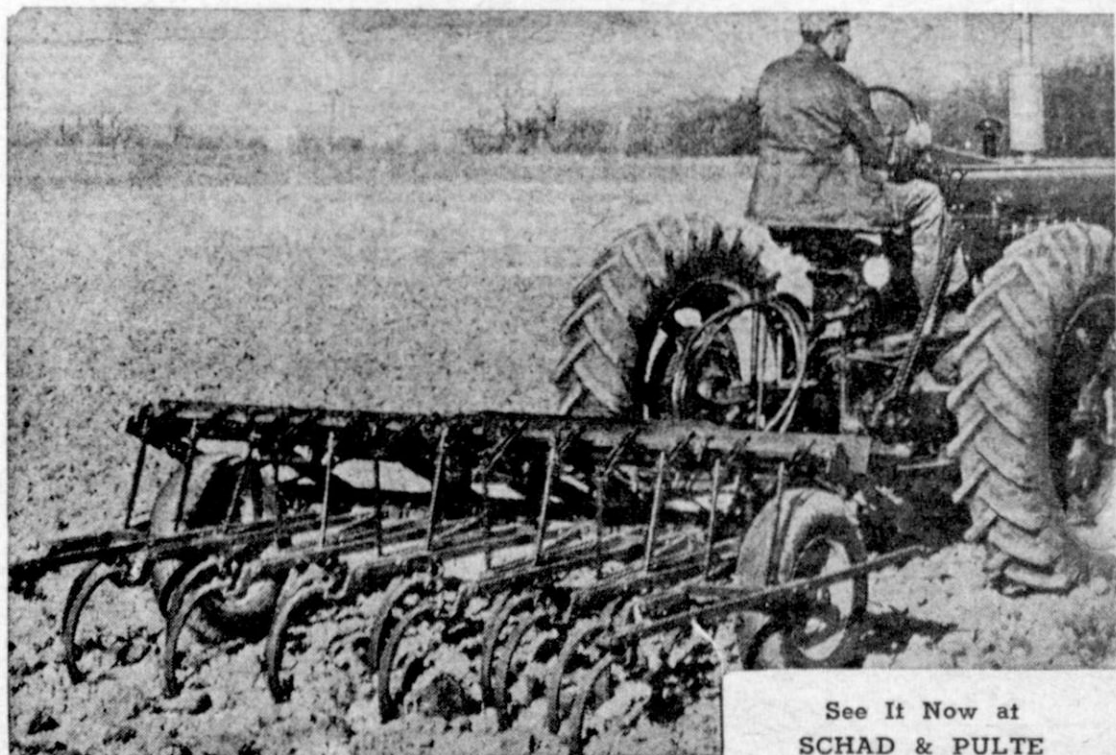

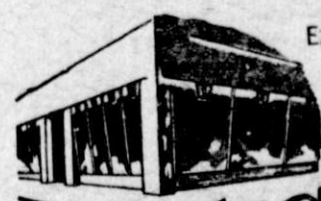

### SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT NEWS



Grass waterways are to a terrace system as a good solid foundation is to a house. Unless the foundation is strong and well planned all else is wasted.

A successful terrace system must have a safe grassed area on which to dump the excess run-off water of hard beating rains. Pastures often answer this need but many times the land lays in such a manner that field terraces will not outlet on to pasture lands. In such cases grass waterways or grass strips must be provided to handle the water without causing soil erosion.

When waterways must be planted they should be wide enough to spread the water that they must carry after a storm over a wide area. A thin layer of running water has less cutting power. The wider the grass strip, the better for maintenance jobs such as shaping and mowing. Also a wide strip pays off in grazing and as added pasture land. The grass waterway should follow natural drainage ways as much as possible.

Following a natural drain eliminates the need for shaping in many cases and also does away with water puddles that would be formed by terraces if they crossed the drain instead

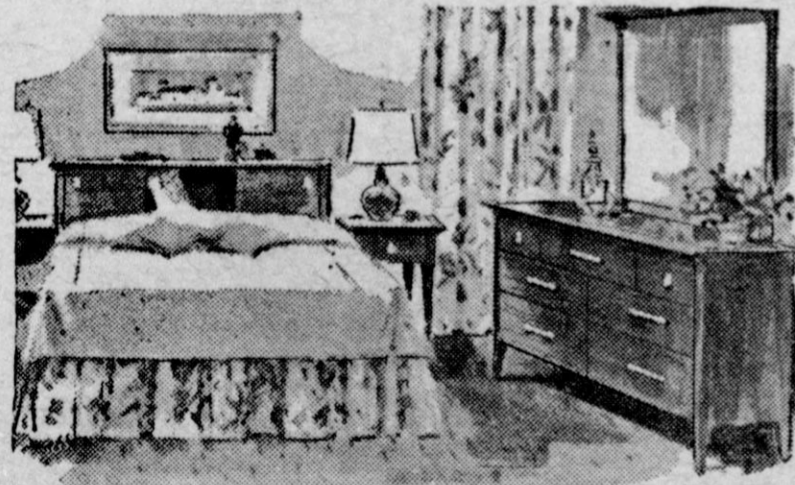
