## Stop Market Losses <br> From Cattle Grubs Co-Ral

## LIVESTOCK INSECTICIDE

$\stackrel{A}{\text { a }}$
Kills grubs inside the cattle before they can damage meat and hide or seriously retard the animal's development.

Cattle grubs develop from the eggs of heel flies laid on the hair of the lower legs of the animal.
Small larvae hatching from these eggs burrow through the skin and into the flesh of the animal, migrating through the tissue until they appear as lumps on the back. This stage is 6 to 7 months after eggs are laid. Eventually the grubs cut through the
hide, drop to the ground and develop into the heel fly, which lays more eggs, thus completing the cycle.

By Co-Ral grub control some of the chemical goes through the hide, killing grubs inside the ami-
mal. Dead grubs are broken down, absorbed and disappear without leaving any trace of injury.

The best time to spray is at termination of the heel fly season, just after grubs have started their slow migration to the back. That's NOW, in July
