animal husbandry research men at Purdue University. Dr. W. M. Beson and Dr. T. W. Perry foul out the Dr. W. M. Beeson and Dr. T. W. Perry found out that
even a small strip of concrete alongside a feed bunk will more than pay for itself in increased beef gains. In a research tria (using two lots of 14 steers confined for 112 days) the average gain per steer in the lot with a 16 -ft. concrete strip on one side of the feed bunk was 95 pounds compared to only
62 pounds for each steer confined to the unpaved lot. Fach steer on concrete gained 33 additional pounds. The steers in the unpaved lot ate less total feed, but each steer required 35 pounds more feed to make a pound of gain
