As this is being written the coal strike continues to rate as the country's most serious problem. We have the ridiculous predicament, inconceivable only a few year ago, of a nation-wide paralysis caused by the high handed
obstinacy of just one man.

John L. Lewis successfully defies the United States government. He deliberately imposes a hardship on the entire population, and the government so far has done nothing to remedy the situation. Legal skirmishes with Lewle the miners, His decision would be as effective from a ail cell as from his palatial suite. Union members hav more regard for his order than for public welfare.

In one way the coal strike gives us reason to be proud of our country. It shows the length to which our govern only trouble is that the reasoning is based on a false pre mise. What the miners claim as a right is not actually a right because it violates the common good. A worker's right to strike ends when he jeopardizes public health and welfare. That's the point we've come to. Everybody is suffering, not only the mine operators.

Our government can handle this problem - it could it will be courageous enough to follow a percedent set months ago by the governor of Virginia. When powe plant operators in his state threatened to strike the governor acted on the premise that public welfare came permit darkened homes, spoiled foods, paralyzed trans portation and other such dire problems, he told workers they must stay on the job.

To back up his order he sent a personal notice to every employe to the effect that his induction in the na-
tional guard became effective the moment the strike would be called, and his new duty would be to carry on his previous work. Refusal to comply would result in court martial. The strike was not called.

Our federal government has the power and the right to deal similarly with this case. It can and should see that settle their fuss. Obviously, however, the administration fails to see the distinction between personal rights and common good.

Dairy cows in most parts of the Dairy cows in most parts of the
country are kept in barns at this time of year, which means extra care in
handling milk, to make handling milk, to make sure it is held at high quality. Here at the bottom of the production curve, consumers need
every quart of milk that can be proevery quart of milk that can be pro-
duced. It would be a shame to have any milk lost because of lack of care. Whether your cows are in barns or not, they're apt to get dirty at this
season âd it's mighty important that season and it's mighty important that
the dirt be removed an hour or so before milking time.
As I've pointed out before, long
hairs make it easy for dirt to stick to hairs make it easy for dirt to stick to the cow's side. Give your cows a hair-
cut regularly and you'll stop trouble cut regularly and you'll stop trouble
before it starts. Clipping flanks and udders is an important step in your sanitation program.

clippers, your milk plant clippers, your mike plant will know the fieldman. He can tell you.
