

Interesting remarks pertaining to the repeal of poll tax were made a few weeks ago in an exchange of hot words between Governor Connally and Commissioner Albert Pena of Bexar County, state chairman of the Political Association of Spanish-Speaking Organizations (PASO).

Connally charged that "selfseeking politicians" are out to turn the poll tax repeal campaign into a "sideshow for their own purposes". Their aim, in the Governor's view is bloc voting.

Pena retorted that the Governor's charge is a "sadistic, under-the-table, oblique way of telling the people that he favors retaining the poll tax.'







The plain truth is that the federal government is not giving anybody anything. The United States Treasury does not contribute one nickel toward the nation's federalstate highway program. Every dollar placed in the Highway Trust Fund is collected through special taxes levied directly on highway users and not on anybody else — chiefly through the 4-cent federal tax on gasoline.

Pinning the truth a little closer to the mat, it should be added that not only are motor vehicle owners paying this bill — they are overpaying it by more than 50 percent. Of the approximately \$5 billion collected through federal highway user taxes each year, only \$3.3 billion go into the Highway Trust Fund. The remaining \$1.7 billion go into the Treasury Department's General Fund and are spent for a variety of projects having no connection with roads. So instead of signs that talk

about federal aid and the like, why not give the motorist the credit he deserves as the source of all that money,
