


MUENSTER ENTERPRISE

Because of that a strong vote is expected in both of Muenster's boxes and in the county as a whole. That is, a good percentage of eligible votes. In total votes the record isn't likely to be good because of the sharp drop in poll tax receipts and exemptions.

Surprisingly the county in this election year has only two more recorded voters than it did last year. There are 7050 now, 7048 last year. For the general election year of 1960, however, it had 7999. For each year the number of elderly persons, who need no poll tax receipt, adds several hundred to the official list of voters. This year, according to county tax collector records, Muenster has 641 voters with poll tax receipts and exemptions. Counting elderly people the voting strength here is estimated at about 800.
